DUI/ Driver's License Checkpoint Results

Eastvale – Deputies and Citizens on Patrol personnel from the Eastvale Police Department conducted a DUI/Driver's License Checkpoint on December 29, 2012. The checkpoint began at 8 p.m. and ended on December 30, 2012, at 3 a.m. The checkpoint was located on Hamner Ave., south of Schleisman Rd., in the City of Eastvale.

Avoid the 30 has provided grant funding for sobriety checkpoints to be conducted by local law enforcement agencies throughout the state to combat the increase in collisions involving impaired drivers.

- 383 drivers who entered the checkpoint were screened.
- 16 drivers were given Field Sobriety Tests, which resulted in five drivers being arrested for driving under the influence of an alcoholic beverage and/or

drugs.

- 15 drivers were issued citations.
- Three vehicles were towed/stored during the operation.

Checkpoints are placed in locations that have the greatest opportunity for achieving drunk and drugged driving deterrence and provide the great-

City Of Eastvale Considered Very Unique

Eastvale also has a higher percentage of high-earning Latinos and African-Americans.

For years, the Inland region has attracted middle-class Latinos and African-Americans from Los Angeles and Orange counties, who are seeking larger homes than they could afford closer to the coast.

Experts have said that Latinos and blacks tend to move to well-off Inland suburbs, such as East-

vale, because the houses are a better value than in coastal areas, schools are typically better, and crime is lower.

Of all the high-earning places in California, Eastvale is reported to be the most diverse. Eastvale is reportedly made up of 40 percent Latino, 24 percent Asian, 24 percent white,

Day To Day Operations At City Hall

If you have ever been to City Hall, you will see that it is bustling with activity and there is a lot of staff to assist you. It is my goal to provide everyone who comes in contact with City Hall the best possible customer service. One of the many reasons, Eastvale became a City was to provide better, more efficient services to the community.

Over the next several months, I would like to introduce you to each department in the City and describe their key roles and responsibilities. The City's organizational structure includes:

Carol Jacobs: City Manager of Eastvale.

- City Council elected by the residents to set policy for the City.
- City Attorney, appointed by the City Council, provides legal counsel.
- City Manager, appointed by the City Council is responsible for implementing the policy of the City Council and running the day to day operations of the City.
- City Clerk who provides support to City Council and staff is responsible for agendas, minutes, public records requests and records management.
- Code Enforcement enforces all private property maintenance issues to ensure that the City is well maintained.
- Community Development is responsible for implementation of the General Plan, processing of land use applications and ensuring development is compatible and appropriate for its location.
- Finance Department is responsible for managing and

reporting all financial transactions of the City.

- Public Works is responsible for maintenance of all infrastructure in the public right of way, the City's capital improvement program and building and safety.
- Eastvale Police Department is responsible for public safety.
- Fire Department is responsible for fire suppression, emergency medical response and fire protection.

Many residents have questioned why the City has hired so many employees over the last two years. As you can see from the list above, it is City staff that provides these services and they are critical to the success of the organization. However, the City has been extremely prudent and conservative in how it provides the services listed above. The City currently has 4 full-time employees, 3 part-time employees and 2 full-time vacancies. The rest of the staffing

needs are fulfilled by contract employees through private consulting firms. Hiring these consulting firms during this time in the City's history allows us the flexibility to staff the peaks and the valleys according to the workload at City Hall.

There is no staff member within this organization who does not wear many hats. When the staff is small, each employee must perform multiple duties in order to get the job done. I am extremely proud of the staff that the City has assembled to serve this community, and I am confident that they will continue to provide a high level of service in 2013.

Cell Tower Update

Eastvale - City Hall has recently received several requests for a status update regarding the cell tower on Schleisman Avenue, as well as other future cell towers that are planned.

The water tower design inspired cell tower has been completed and received final building approval just recently. This project included not just the tower, but the building underneath the tower that will house all the equipment from the various service providers that are/will be leasing space on the tower.

Each tenant that is leasing space is now in the process of moving their equipment over to the new tower and testing the equipment. For proprietary and testing efficiency reasons,

the service providers must complete this process one at a time. Once they are confident that their equipment is working correctly, they will power down their equipment on the old tower and power up the equipment on the new cell tower. The service providers estimate that this migration process will take them one week each to complete. Several service providers will be utilizing this tower to provide service to the immediate area. The list of providers includes: Nextel, T-Mobile, Sprint PCS, Verizon, and AT&T.

Assuming no additional delays for weather, the new cell tower should be up and running in January. Again, weather can cause delays in this process. Once the old tower is decommissioned, it can be taken down and the street improvements can be completed. The

infrastructure improvement portion of the project is estimated to begin in the later part of the first quarter of 2013.

Two addition cell towers for Verizon were approved by the Eastvale Planning Commission on July 18, 2012. These towers are to be located at McCune Park and Harada Heritage Park. The City issued building permits for the cell tower project at McCune Park on November 5, 2012, but the construction has not yet begun. The cell tower project at

Harada Park is permit ready, but the corporation has not pulled the permits and therefore no construction can begin. In this situation, the construction process is up to the applicant (Verizon) and they contact the City for inspections at different stages of their construction process.

Please keep in mind that any number of things may delay the construction timetable and weather is the most probable construction delay at this time of the year.

and 9 percent black,

Experts say that fast-growing areas are more likely to be racially diverse than older cities that have the legacy of housing discrimination. These fast-growing areas are usually areas that built houses in the past decade on land where there were first dairy farms, such as Eastvale.

Of the 344 communities in California with 20,000 people or more, Eastvale has the 17th highest median household income, according to U.S. Census Bureau. These statistics are estimates from 2009-2011 and exclude less-populous cities because data from smaller places is less reliable.

Eastvale even has a higher median income than places that are nationally associated with what is classified as a rich community, such as Beverly

Hills and Newport Beach.

However, there are few truly wealthy people in Eastvale. Eastvale doesn't have many mansions and it doesn't have fancy apartment buildings, let alone any apartment buildings. There are some mobile homes, but its streets are lined mostly with large, recently built houses and upscale townhouses. There aren't a collection of fancy boutiques selling expensive clothes



Riverside County - A telephone alerting system for Riverside County. The Early Warning Notification System (EWNS) allows public safety first responders to rapidly alert and warn the public in the event of emergencies.

To register for the EWNS, please visit the Riverside County Fire Department website at: www.rvcfire.org/opencms/functions/oes/

Early Warning Notification System (EWNS) Frequently Asked Questions(FAQ's):

Q: What phone numbers are part of the EWNS?

A: The primary phone number of every business and residence in Riverside County who has traditional phone service, whether it is a listed or unlisted phone number.

Q: Are cell phone numbers or Voice Over IP (VoIP) part of the system?

A: You may add your cell phone and VoIP numbers via a secure website. To register your cell phone or VoIP for the EWNS, please visit the Riverside County Fire Department website at: www.rvcfire.org/opencms/functions/oes/.

We were unable to include cell phones and VoIP because those providers are not mandated to release their records to public safety agencies.

Q: What will the EWNS be used for?

A: The EWNS will be used to alert and warn the residents of Riverside County in the event of a small to medium sized emergency. These may include wildfires, floods, hazardous materials, severe weather, and law enforcement incidents.


Q: How many calls can the EWNS make?

A: The EWNS can make up

to 250,000 calls per hour.

* Funding: The Riverside County EWNS was initially funded by a Federal Grant

(DR-1498). Ongoing cost and maintenance for the system is provided by the County of Riverside.

Norco Navy Base Requests Proposals For Food Service Concession

Norco – The Navy is requesting proposals to establish and operate a food service concession to serve some 1,400 sailors, Navy civilians and support contractors working at Naval Weapons Station Seal Beach Detachment Norco, home of the Naval Surface Warfare Center, Corona Division. The Naval Exchange Service Command, administering the proposal, says the

on-base concession has the potential for up to \$300,000 in annual sales.

Naval installation director Anthony Winicki said the request for proposals is in response to employee surveys asking for more variety than what is now being offered in vending machines at the base canteen, adding that it will complement local restaurants in the community where employees frequently visit.

NSWC Corona Command-

ing Officer Capt. Eric Ver Hage said he welcomes having an onsite food provider available to his 1,400 personnel.

"Having a food concession onsite allows my employees more options and greater convenience when they're not able to leave the base," Ver Hage said. "Most go to their favorite restaurants in the local community and will continue to do so. But we're hoping this will bring a popular local vendor to them here, so when they're sched-

uled are tighter, or when they didn't have a chance to bring something from home, they'll be able to get something really good right here on base."

The base has two possible sites at the former 1930s luxury resort and World War II Naval hospital that can be renovated for the food facility. The smallest is the existing canteen, a 475-square-foot area, and the other is 1,200 square foot area inside the larger auditorium building, where legendary USO entertain-

er Bob Hope frequently visited to support patients recovering at the hospital. The contractor is responsible for any renovation costs and furnishings.



est safety for officers and the public.

Officers observed drivers passing through the checkpoint looking for signs of alcohol and/or drug impairment. Drivers caught driving impaired can expect jail, license suspension, and insurance increases, as well as fines, fees, DUI classes, court probation and other expenses that can exceed \$10,000.

This DUI/Driver's License checkpoint was an effort to reduce the number of community members injured or killed on local roadways by impaired drivers,

as well as ensuring drivers have a valid driver's license. A major component of these checkpoints is to increase awareness of the dangers of impaired driving and to encourage sober designated drivers.

According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), checkpoints have provided the most effective documented results of any of the DUI enforcement strategies, while also yielding considerable cost savings of \$6 for every \$1 spent.

Funding for Avoid the 30 operations is provided by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety, through the National Highway Traffic Safety

Administration.

Target located in the Eastvale Gateway Shopping Center at 12471 Limonite Avenue. Thomas Robert Johnston, 50, of Indio was arrested around 11:30 a.m. Saturday after deputies say they spotted him behaving suspiciously near the outlet.

When deputies questioned him and learned he was on probation, the suspect was searched. Deputies found several stolen items from the store in his clothing and a machete tucked down his pants. The items were returned and Johnston was taken to the Robert Presley Jail in Riverside. He faces burglary, possession of stolen property, possession of a weapon, and probation violation charges.

On December 14, we posted an ABC7 report about the shooting in Newtown, Connecticut.

On December 17, we posted about an Eastvale homeowner who chased down an attempted burglar. This post received 111 Likes and 16 comments. We also provided the community with a picture of the attempted burglar. Read this full story above.

Jerry Case commented on this post stating that during his fifth year of living in Eastvale, his home was burglarized between 1:45 p.m. and 2 p.m. He let the community know that this burglary happened off Linnea St. and Summer and that he has the burglary on surveillance video from the neighbor. John Briones also commented on this post stating that his home was broken into and valuables were taken a couple of weeks prior. He wondered if the suspect caught was the same burglar that broke into his home. He stated that there was more than one person who burglarized his home, but he was hoping the other burglars would be scared off when they saw that one

was caught.

On Dec. 22, we decided to post recent crimes that happened in Chino Hills to help inform Eastvale residents that crime is happening everywhere. During the past month, the Chino Hills Police Department has identified an increase in residential burglaries in the south end of the City of Chino Hills. The area near Soquel Canyon Road and Butterfield Ranch Road, south to Highway 71 has suffered the highest increase. There have not been any reports of suspicious subjects near the locations where the burglaries have occurred, and

it is possible the suspect(s) "fit in" the neighborhood.

On Dec. 27, we posted that Eastvale Police Department would be conducting a DUI/Driver's License Checkpoint on December 29, 2012, from 8 p.m. until 3 a.m. within the City of Eastvale. You can read the results of the DUI Checkpoint on page 1.

On Dec. 29, we posted about an Eastvale Public Safety Announcement that reminds the community not to fire guns into the air on New Year's Eve. The Riverside County Sheriff's Depart-

ment wanted to make sure the public remembered that stray bullets have been known to penetrate walls, roofs, and cars, injuring and killing innocent people. Sheriff's enforced a Zero-Tolerance Policy regarding the negligent discharge of a firearm on New Year's Eve. Individuals found discharging firearms would be arrested and could face felony charges, punishable by incarceration in the state prison.

On Dec. 31, we posted a video about drunk driving to remind residents not to drink and drive on New Year's Eve.
