Walmart Still Planning Eastvale Store

Eastvale- Walmart is still scheduled to come to Eastvale, but plans are still in the preliminary planning phase. If approved, it will be built in the South East corner of Archibald and Limonite, according to city officials.

"Walmart has submitted a preliminary application to the planning dept. for a site," said City Officials. "This is in the very preliminary planning phases and

will still need to go through the Planning Commission and City Council."

According to Mayor Ike Bootsma, environmental impact reports (EIR) still need to be completed, and the planning commission needs to review and approve.

"This could bring over \$1 million in sales tax revenue to the

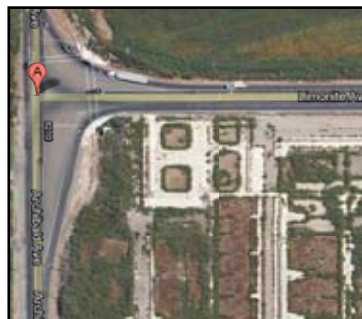

On January 9, 2013, the City Council awarded a contract to Applied Development Economics (www.adecusa.com) to draft a Strategic Plan for the City of Eastvale.

The purpose of the Strategic Plan is to provide the City with a guiding document setting priorities for the next five years. But what exactly is a Strategic Plan you ask? The International Economic Development Council (IEDC) defines Strategic Planning as: "a process in which a community or organization can look at its current situation and compare that situation to where it would like to be within a certain period of time. Communities can use strategic planning to envision their future and take the appropriate steps to achieve that future."

Strategic Planning involves several components such as: a realistic assessment of available resources, constraints and opportunities; the formation of a clear mission and a shared vision; the development of realistic and achievable goals; the development of project action

plans to reach these goals; and clearly established indicators or metrics to measure the success and outcome.

Hamner Avenue Construction Update

Eastvale - The City of Eastvale has been provided the following Hamner Avenue widening project update by the lead agency, the City of Norco:

The Hamner Avenue widening project has been delayed by saturated soil due to the ground water. This situation required over excavation to construct the roadway and the tunnel beneath Hamner Avenue.

In addition, Southern California Edison (SCE) will need to raise the utility lines, which has created additional delays. As it stands, the Hamner Avenue

widening project is scheduled for completion in May 2013 instead of April as estimated.

Walking For Those Who Can't

Chino Hills - In a few months most people will be celebrating Mother's Day with their moms, but not Kristen King. Her mother passed away five years ago from breast cancer. But you won't find Kristen feeling sad, she's doing something about what happened to her mom. She's an active member of the Annual Avon Walk for Breast Cancer, and she's doing it all year round.

"I saw cancer suck the life out of my mom," said Kristen. "I witnessed her go through ten years of treatment, doctor appointments, pills, and many procedures. I choose to do something for all that pain, to try to turn it into positive action."

The Avon Walk for Breast Cancer is an annual event held in 9 cities. This year will mark the 11th year the event will be held. Last year the total raised was over \$700 million for Breast Cancer Research. The event, held in Santa Barbara September 7-8, 2013, is easy to register for, just sign onto www.avonwalk.org.

"My mom didn't smoke, didn't

drink, had no history of cancer, and she was diagnosed in 1998," said Kristen. "She was literally robbed out of her life, WE were also cheated out of so many years she should've had. she spent 10 years battling this horrible disease, never in remission, always fighting. She lost her battle in 2008."

According to the Center for Disease Control (CDC), aside from non-melanoma skin cancer, breast cancer is the most common cancer among women in the United States. It is also one of the leading causes of cancer death among women of all races and Hispanic origin populations. For more information, visit Cancer Among Women.

In 2009 (the most recent year numbers are available) 211,731 women in the United States were diagnosed with breast cancer. 40,676 women in the United States died from breast cancer.

"My mom passed away when she was only 58 years old, she would've been married 40 years," said Kristen. "Walking for Breast Cancer has given me the opportunity to give others

hope for a cure so they won't ever have to experience what our family has gone through."

Kristen not only walks each year in Santa Barbara, she continues to fundraise all year long. She holds fundraisers at her work at Wood Ranch in Chino Hills, has donated her hair, periodically holds yard sales, bake sales, rummage sales, massage days, and themed parties.

"Any amount will help, even \$5, \$10, if everyone chips in, we can beat this disease," she said.

"I meet a lot of people at the cancer walk, it feels good to reach out to others who share my pain," added Kristen. New Family Traditions:

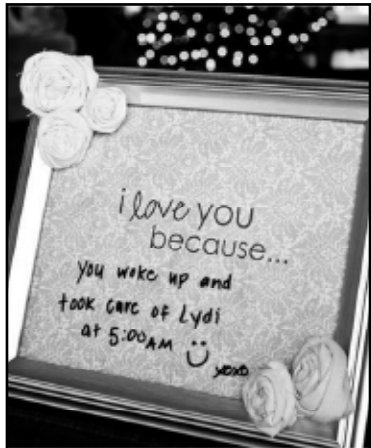

For your Relationship:

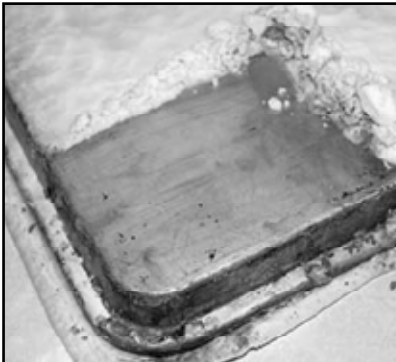

For Your Closet:

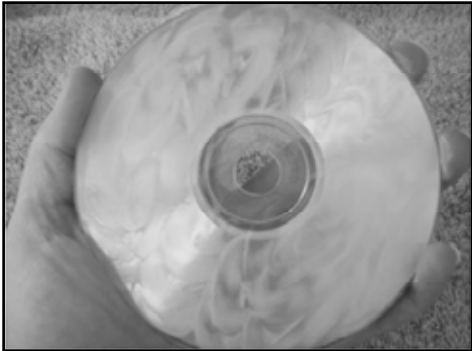

Furry Friends Need Fun, Too:

How to Keep Your Pet Happy and Active Furry Friends and Active.

It seems like the most natural thing in the world—our pets need food, water, medical care and lots of love. But dogs and cats have other needs, too. Our furry friends need ample physical exercise and mental stimulation to lead truly full and happy lives.

“They need jobs,” says Kristen Collins, CPDT, ASPCA Animal Trainer. Dogs and cats need to stay busy and engaged, but unfortunately most pets are unemployed—daily they sit at home, chronically bored and waiting for their humans to return from work. And as we all know, an idle pet can quickly turn into a naughty pet when restlessness becomes overwhelming.

“With nothing to do, dogs and cats are forced to find ways to entertain themselves,” explains Kristen. “Their activities of choice often include behaviors we find problematic, like excessive barking or meowing, gnawing on shoes, raiding the garbage, eating houseplants and scratching furniture.”

To prevent behavior and health problems, Kristen recommends the following physical and mental workouts—both when you’re there to join the fun and when your pet is home alone.

- Move it! Healthy adult dogs need at least 30 minutes of aerobic exercise twice a day. Jogging, swimming and playing at the dog park are all great ways to burn excess energy.
- Engage in structured games, like fetch and tug-of-war—they’re not only great exercise but also teach your pet impulse control and strengthen the bond between you.
- Keep your dog occupied when he’s home alone by giving him a food-stuffed puzzle toy, like the Kong, or some tasty chew toys.
- Like their canine counterparts, cats also need plenty of aerobic exercise. Get kitty fit with rousing play sessions, such as chase and fetch with furry toys, small balls or toy mice.
- Encourage your cat’s favorite home alone activities, including bird watching, exploring paper bags or boxes, watching cat videos or spending time in secure outdoor enclosures.
- Teach your cat new tricks! Felines are quick studies and can learn practical skills like coming when called, sitting up, rolling over and even using the toilet!

Kristen adds: “The bottom line is that you’re responsible for enriching your pet’s life. Providing opportunities to exercise your cat or dog’s mind and body will keep her healthy and happy—and enhance your relationship, too.”



Walmart still planning Eastvale store

city,” said Mayor Bootsma. “Residents will have an opportunity to review plans and offer opinions at City Council meetings before the project breaks ground.”

According to local reports, this Walmart will be a 24-hour Super Walmart around 177k

square feet, improvements will be made to area roads for accessibility, other tenants will occupy the location with Walmart being the only large anchor store, the building will be a “Green Store,” a part of their environmental plan to boost energy efficiency, cut down on waste and reduce greenhouse gases tied to global warming,

which will be considered a nationwide “pilot store.”

“Walmart purchased the property and they came to the City of Eastvale and asked for an application to build,” said Eastvale’s City Manager Carol Jacobs. “So this was all initiated by Walmart.”

Some cities make it an effort to try to draw Walmart to them,

then they usually ask the city for money to help build the store, with the promise of sales tax revenue in return. According to city officials, Walmart has not asked for anything and the city has not offered anything.

“They are going to need to do some environmental work, a general plan and zoning amendments,” says City man-

ager Carol Jacobs.”

Though Walmart and Sam’s Club regularly build in close proximity of each other, Jacobs says this location will be strictly a Walmart.

This process will take about 10 months, and then it will be presented to the City Council. If approved by all necessary agents, Walmart believes it will open in 2014, according to Jacobs.

been announced yet.

In the Eastvale Gateway South center, a 24 Hour Fitness Super Sport will open in mid-May 2013. This 24 Hour Fitness is already under construction off of Limonite Ave., near the I-15 Freeway. Pre-Sale membership will begin about 60-90 days prior to opening day. Keep an eye out for updates

On the north side of Limonite, two tenants will be joining the Eastvale Gateway North Center. The Joint Chiropractic will be opening near Chipotle, but an opening date has not been announced. Ulta Beauty will also be coming to this shopping center, taking up half of the former Borders location. Ulta Beauty will open in the Summer of 2013, according to the City of East-

vale Facebook page. Eastvales Facebook page also says that the Ulta Beauty superstore will feature over 20,000 beauty products across the categories of cosmetics, fragrance, haircare, skincare, bath and body products and salon styling tools. The store will also include a full-service salon.

The Cloverdale Marketplace will be expecting three tenants and all are already under construction right now. In the Ralphs Shopping Center at Hamner Ave. and Limonite Ave., The Riverside Medical Clinic will be opening in Eastvale in May or June 2013. The Learning Experience, which is a early learning daycare center, is under construction and will open in May or June 2013. Waba Grill Teriyaki House will also open in the Cloverdale Marketplace in May or June 2013.

Shakey's Pizza is no longer a future tenant of the Cloverdale Marketplace. According to the City of Eastvale Facebook page,

Shakey's Pizza has pulled out of this location due to family medical issues, not due to a lack of desire to be in Eastvale.

Another restaurant that will no longer be a future tenant of Eastvale is Smash Burgers. The information about Smash Burgers coming to Eastvale was released prematurely, before the deal was finalized. In the end, the Smash Burgers lease did not go through.

Another change in Eastvale is that the Hamner Ave. widening project is experiencing delays and is now expected to be completed in May 2013, instead of April. Read the full story from the City of Eastvale on page 2.

There has also been word about the new elementary school that is planning to be built next to Half Moon Park. As of January 31, 2013, The City of Eastvale's Facebook page said in a comment that the Corona-Norco Unified School

District is ready to build the new school, but the State of California has not released their portion of the funding for the project. They said they are waiting on the State before they begin construction.

Lastly, construction on the

Eastvale Community Park is expected to start soon. Phase 1 of this project is expected to be completed in 6 - 7 months, which will allow approximately 45 acres to be completed. The goal is to complete the park in time for winter sports.

the residence through the second floor window to check on the residence when they discovered a large scale marijuana grow operation. Deputies assigned to the Eastvale Special Enforcement Team assumed the investigation and obtained a search warrant for the residence. At 8:30 p.m. the search warrant was served and deputies discovered that the entire residence had been transformed into a large scale

marijuana grow. Personnel from Southern California Edison arrived at the residence and found that the electricity was being diverted from the meter causing a serious fire hazard. Edison estimated that the theft of utilities was over \$3,100.00 per month. Deputies removed approximately 826 mature marijuana plants, 170 immature marijuana plants, and 40 pounds of processed marijuana. The estimated street value of the marijuana was over \$900,000.00.

How Does the Gospel Drive our Life?

The Gospel is the good news that though we are sinners, worthy of judgment, God in love has given Jesus Christ to die in our place for sin. We are accepted through trusting Christ's work alone, not empty performance or religion. Perhaps you have trusted in the Gospel's message, and become a Christian.

Yet, sometimes life leads us to lose our Gospel awe. The Gospel may have changed our eternal destination, but it's failed to drive our lives now. Trouble makes us lose our traction, skid into despair, and kills our joy.

Two thousand years ago, the church at Philippi – the first

church ever started in Europe – was financially struggling. They had false teachers pulling people away from the church. Two of their top leaders were engaged in bitter feud. This was threatening to kill their joy.

But Paul reminds them that Gospel is not just the key that sparks the ignition of your Christian life – it is the fuel that keeps it running. He writes, "And I am sure of this, that God who began a good work in you will bring it to completion at the day of Jesus Christ." (Philippians 1:6) The "began a good work in you" is the Gospel. It released you from the penalty of sin and conquered your addiction to self. But not only that, the Gospel is still working to change your life to be more like Christ. This is called sanctification, and



you'll spend your entire life driving toward that goal. But this lifetime process is also a lifetime promise- God will bring His work in you to completion!

That's the power of the Gospel. Let it drive your life.

Thomas Epting's young body began showing its first signs of leukemia when he was only two years old. By age four, there was no doubt. After the disease had ebbed and resurfaced once again at age seven, his family understood that Thomas's childhood was not going to be normal...at least not in the way our world defines "normal."

They were right, but not just because of the complications and chemo treatments.

How normal is it for a young boy to never complain about shot needles and hospital stays--not even once? How normal is it to hear a child say, after being told of his need for yet another procedure, "I just want God to be glorified in this, and I don't want to embarrass Him"?

Thomas was a remarkable boy, indeed.

There was a period of years when Thomas's physical suffering was graciously relieved by the hand of God. His leukemia was gone. Undetectable. He used that time to read every book written by A. W. Tozer. He wrote profound Christian poetry. He took the SAT at 13 and outscored his parents' high-school marks.

But at 15, he received bad news. Not one, but five ma-



lignant, inoperable brain tumors had been seen on an X-ray. The setback sent his mom and dad into a parent's tailspin.

But his mom, Amy, remembers a day, barely a month before his death, when she was talking with Thomas about how she should pray for him. He flashed those twinkling eyes at her and said, "Mom, you think too much! God sent His Son to die for me! If He never did anything else for me, sending Jesus is enough for me to praise Him as long as I live. Just focus on that, Mom, and quit worrying about the tumors!"

Give me Thomas Epting's brand of normal. I could use some of it today. Couldn't you?

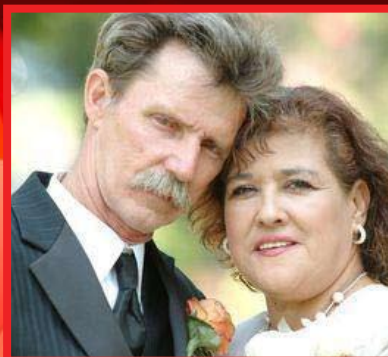
