Eastvale Goes Virtual At City Hall

Eastvale - Your next planning question in the City of Eastvale might be answered by a Planning expert who is miles from the City's planning counter. Through the use of existing technology, residents of Eastvale can speak to and see a planner immediately from Eastvale City Hall via a live video link. The new system in-

creases coverage at the planning counter from a day or two a week to full time, without increasing costs to the City.

"In order to provide Eastvale residents with a friendly face at City Hall at all times, the City has instituted a Virtual Planner option," said Carol Jacobs City Manager. "If a customer comes

Corona Votes To Annex Temescal Valley

Corona - The Corona City Council voted to move forward on a decision to annex unincorporated Temescal Valley, according to the city website.

On Wed. Feb. 6, Corona City Council members met with residents of Temescal Valley to discuss its Annexation. A decision was ultimately passed to move forward with

the annexation by submitting an application to the Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCO) for Riverside County.

Close to 300 citizens showed up at the council chambers on the Feb. 6 meeting, most of whom opposed the annexation of Temescal Valley. The concerns were focused on having adequate police and fire safety from Corona, no raised taxes, no decrease in services, fear of losing control

over local development, and losing their rural lifestyle.

The vote to annex Temescal Valley was almost unanimous with a 4-1 vote. The only member dissenting was Councilman Stan Skipworth, who said at the council meeting, "I have to respect what the prevailing feeling is." He added, "When 30 out

Code Enforcement Department Determined to Improve the Quality of Life in Eastvale

Code Enforcement is a critical and valuable service offered by the City of Eastvale. The City recognizes the vital importance of preserving a high quality of life throughout the community and has adopted local codes and ordinances that govern the proper use and maintenance of private properties.

The Code Enforcement Department is responsible for performing field inspections of properties to ensure compliance with applicable zoning, safety, fire and nuisance codes, ordinances and abatement regulations. Code Enforcement also serves as a resource to other departments, divisions,

and agencies and resolves complaints while providing public education.

The Eastvale Code Enforcement team consists of two seasoned, full-time Code Enforcement Officers and three Code Enforcement Volunteers. This small, yet highly effective team engages in an average of 683 code actions per month ranging from administrative citations, inspections, illegal signs, discarded shopping carts, park-

ing citations, to scavenging enforcement and more.

The top five complaints that the Eastvale Code Enforcement Department responds to are (in order of call frequency):

1. Trash Bins in public view
2. Property Maintenance - dead grass or over grown grass
3. Boat and R.V. parking
4. Basketball Hoops in the

Business Registration – Renewal Time is Here!

CITY OF EASTVALE

Eastvale – Many Eastvale business owners and operators will likely receive a notice from City Hall in the next few days reminding them to renew their Business Registration with the City.

The City launched its Business Registration program on March 20, 2012 and has received tremendous response to the program with over 900 businesses registering. This program will compile a comprehensive inventory of businesses in the City of Eastvale, enhance public safety and help achieve compliance with federal, state and local water quality regulations.

All businesses operating within the boundaries of the City of Eastvale will be required to register with the

City, using the registration application. The Business Registration Brochure and Application are available on the Business Registration page of the website: www.EastvaleCA.gov.

The initial registration fee is \$46 annually and for those businesses that are renewing, the renewal fee is \$31 annually. Please be advised that any fees associated with inspections for compliance with federal, state and local water quality regulations will not be waived for any businesses as those regulations are independent from the City's Business Registration Program.

The City has worked with the Eastvale Chamber of Commerce and the Riverside County Recorder's office to identify and notify Eastvale business owners however, anyone operating a business within

the City's boundaries is encouraged to register.

Business Registration counter hours at City Hall are Monday – Thursday 7:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m.

5. Abandoned Vehicles

As a proactive approach to potential code violations, we recommend familiarizing yourself with the Eastvale Neighbor Preservation Overlay (ENPO) which may be found on the City's website www.Eastvale-CA.gov under the City Hall tab and select Code Enforcement. The provisions of the ENPO zone apply to all currently approved and future residential developments. The Neighborhood Preservation Standards are meant to maintain a safe, orderly, sanitary and aesthetically pleasing environment on public and private properties. The overlay covers topics such as landscaping, trash receptacles, parking, yard maintenance, façade treatment, outdoor lighting and temporary exterior holiday displays to name a few.

Here are a few simple suggestions to help homeowners be consistent with the overlay

and avoid code enforcement violations, ask yourself: Does my lawn look like the rest of the neighborhood? Are my Holiday lights still up in March? Are my trash bins BEHIND the gate?

One of the goals of Code Enforcement is to promote a positive image of the department and the services we provide to our community by promoting a culture that is helpful, customer service oriented, approachable, knowledgeable and of the highest integrity. We are dedicated to preserving and improving the high quality of life and standards here in Eastvale!

of 32 people tell me they don't want to be a part of a municipal-

ity, that tells me something."

The area that would be annexed is about 15.5 square miles and stretches from Weirick Road and extends east and west along

Interstate 15 to just south of the Sycamore Creek Shopping Center, according to a document released by Corona. The document also states that a

new police zone named Zone 5 will be created to solely cover the Temescal Valley area. Also, the document states that a new fire station would be required to maintain adequate fire pro-

tection. However, Corona fire officials have approached the Riverside County Fire Department to try and create an alternative cooperative aid program for Temescal Valley, as well.

Eastvale police found, and took pictures of, numerous vehicles that were parked that had either left their doors un-

locked, windows rolled down, or valuables left in plain sight.

The question they asked was: "does your car attract or tempt a crime? If so, you may be a victim of a very preventable vehicle burglary.

On our Facebook page, (www.facebook.com/Eastvale-CommunityNews), many people have commented on how they "ran in for a minute," or "it was parked right in my driveway." We reported once before that a

helicopter had been circling the area and looking for a suspect that had been seen walking down a street while checking every car door that was parked in a residential area, to see if any doors were open.

City Construction Update

CITY OF EASTVALE

Eastvale – City Hall has received numerous requests about what is being built where and what new tenants may be coming to town. Here is brief update:

- Marketplace at the Enclave (Archibald and Schleisman) will include a Starbucks (drive through location, opening 2014), AutoZone (opening 2014) and Jack in the Box (opening in April 2013). There are also several pads for other future tenants who are not yet determined.
- Eastvale Gateway South (south side of Limonite): 24 Hour Fitness Super Sport – Grand Opening May 18th, pre-sale will begin about 60-90 days prior.
- Eastvale Gateway (north side of Limonite): The Joint Chiropractic (opening April 2013, near Chipotle), C2 Education (opening April 2013, next to Vons), Ulta (opening Summer 2013, taking ½ of the former Borders location). The other ½ of the former Borders location does not yet have a tenant secured.
- Cloverdale Marketplace (Ralphs shopping center at Hamner and Limonite): Riverside Medical Clinic (under construction, opening in May/June 2013), The Learning Experience (under construction, opening in May/June 2013), Waba Grill (under construction, opening in May/June 2013). Please note: The Shakey's Pizza franchisee has pulled out of this location.

Department is building the Eastvale Community Park. The Eastvale Community Park will be located at the corner of Citrus and Hamner and will be constructed in 2 phases. Phase 1 will be approximately 45 acres when completed. This portion of the park will consist of the following amenities:

- Concession Building
- Picnic Area
- Restroom Facilities
- Lighted Sports Fields
- Parking

Additionally, the Eastvale Community Park will extend the Eastvale Trail which will be constructed on the outskirts of the south end of the park and will connect to the Santa Ana

River Trail project, which is designed to extend from the Pacific Ocean to the crest of the San Bernardino Mountains and, at build out, will total over 110 miles in length. <http://www.parks.jcsd.us/>

The Palms by Lennar Homes: This housing project is located on Citrus Avenue between Sumner Avenue and Scholar Way, directly across the street from ERHS.

The housing project consists of 197 detached single family homes on a 53.2 acre site. Lennar will reserve an additional 39 acres of open space to the south of the project which will include future trails connecting to existing trails to the west and a pond which currently exists

on the site close to the river (not visible from Citrus Avenue).

The Palms Planned Residential Development draws inspiration from the historic Spanish-Ranch home of the famous actor Desi Arnaz built in 1960. Exquisite detailing of the home,

including hand-forged ironworks, historic iron lighting fixtures, tiled mosaics and a barrel-tiled roof all reinforce an architectural style classic to Southern California. This project is going back to the Planning Commission on March 20th for minor revisions.

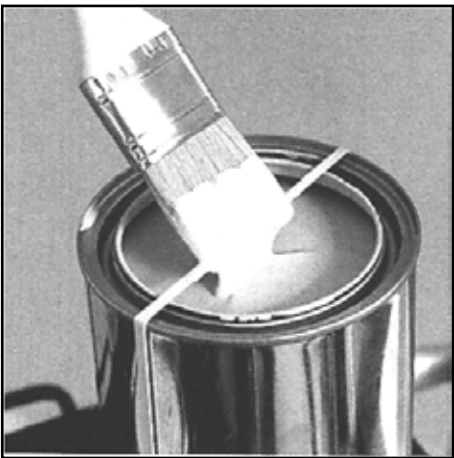
For Your Closet:



Car Theft Suspect Killed By Police

Riverside- On the night of Tues. Feb. 26, Riverside police shot and killed a man suspected in an auto theft, after he rammed into a patrol car.

At around 8:50 p.m. on Tuesday, officers were called to the Peppertree

Place Apartments parking lot with reports of a car theft in progress. Witnesses state they saw a man get out of a previously stolen car and tried breaking into another, Sgt. David Amador Wrote in a statement Tuesday.

The suspect drove off when officers

tried to stop him, then exited through the West gate and collided with another vehicle. The suspect then rammed the driver side of a patrol car causing the two officers inside to open fire.

At around 9:38 p.m., the suspect died at Riverside Community Hospital less

than an hour after he was shot at the apartment complex on Arlington and Van Buren Blvd. The suspect's name has not yet been released.

No officers had been injured in the shooting, and police have not identified the officers who fired the shots.

The investigation into the shooting is still pending through the Riverside police robbery/homicide division.

electrical box had exploded and smoke could be seen inside the residence. Occupants of the residence, Hui Ming, 60, and Hu Su, 48, were inside and initially refused the deputies to enter. However, the deputies entered the home to assure no one was injured. While inspecting the home, they discovered nearly 200 plants of various stages of marijuana grow from 6" to 2". After declaring the house safe, the California Department of Forestry (CDF) responded to ensure there were no more threats of fire. Edison also responded by shutting down the power leading to the residence. A deputy remained at the residence awaiting Special Investigations Bureaus response. Also, Lt. Yate, Sgt. Rico and Sgt. Stolte were notified to follow proper procedures. Investigator Josh Parker of Investigations Bureau and his team carried on with the investigation thereafter. One person was arrested, according to Deputy Jeff Cryder. According to code 11358 of the Department of Health and Safety (www.ca.gov/health-safety), anyone who cultivates any amount of marijuana is committing a felony. If found guilty, suspects can face jail time that varies between 0-36 months.

Suspects are also usually charged for grand theft for stealing of power, in addition to cultivating marijuana. In many cases, suspects plead out for probation or serve a small time, according to Deputy and Neighborhood Watch Coordinator Jeff Cryder. One way of preventing this type of crime is to be involved in a neighborhood watch and to be informed. Deputy Cryders says "It is common for people not to know their neighbors and it causes this type of issues." Pastors' Corners

Four Places at Once

There's a proper time and way for people to do everything.

Ecclesiastes 8:6

If you were to point your car southwest of Cortez, Colorado, drive exactly 38 miles along Highway 160 and then hang a right on Four Corners Monument Road, in about a half mile you'd run into the only spot in America where you can be in four states at the same time: the intersection of Arizona, Colorado, New Mexico and Utah. It's out in the middle of an empty desert, surrounded by dust, rocks and boulders.

But that doesn't stop upwards of 2,000 people a day from visiting Four Corners and waiting in line just for the thrill of having their picture taken standing in four states at once. Truly the American way, huh: trying to be four places at one time!

Truth be told, it's a picture of the way many of us elect to live our lives. We are constantly pulled in several different direc-

tions. Our pressure-filled, rush-rush, hurried lifestyle has a way of leaving us winded, dazed and addicted to the next item on our activity list.

I urge you to stop and check the speed limit on this road you're on. Imagine a life that allows for real living ... the kind you'll never find at Four Corners.

your lives dramatically more manageable three to six months from now? Start by finding one thing you'll say no to.
