Quiet Zone Established In City Of Walnut

Walnut - On April 22 at 10:30 a.m., the Walnut City Council, city staff, dignitaries and members of the community celebrated the "Establishment of the Quiet Zone" for railroad crossings.

For a long time, the City of Walnut has had to endure blaring train horns going through their city. However, as of April 22, the blaring horns that have haunted

the city day and night are no more with the establishment of the new Railroad Quiet Zone that extends along the railroad tracks along Valley Boulevard bordering Walnut.

On June 24, 2005, the Federal Railroad Administration (FRA) rule on the use of locomotive horns at public grade crossings went into effect, which gave cities locally and regionally great relief on their struggle and pursuit for

Quiet Zone, due to safety and liability concerns.

During the celebration, Councilman and three time Mayor, Antonio "Tony" Cartagena, said to the community members that since 2005 and earlier, he worked on gathering information relative to the Quiet Zone initiative. Cartagena said he spear-







a child with the intent to commit oral copulation, one felony count of possession and control of child pornography with prior convictions for possession of child pornography and using a minor to create pornography, one

felony count of using a minor for distribution of obscene matter with prior convictions for possession of child pornography and using a minor to create pornography, one felony count of using a minor for commercial sex acts, and one misdemeanor count of oral copulation of a minor.

Phernambucq has prison prior

convictions for using a minor to create pornography in 2006 and unlawful sexual intercourse with a minor three years younger than the defendant in 2003 and became a lifetime registered sex offender based on those prior convictions.

In December 2012, Phernambucq met 17-year-old John Doe on Facebook.

Prior to the sexual assault, Phernambucq told the victim he was a pornography director and wanted to hire him to be in his pornographic film.

On or about Jan. 23, 2013, Phernambucq met John Doe at an abandoned house in Anaheim. Phernambucq ordered the victim to undress and created

child pornography by videotaping sexual acts and orally copulating John Doe. The victim became uncomfortable and left.

Upon learning that Phernambucq is a registered sex offender, John Doe told his family about the sexual assault, who then contacted the Anaheim Police Department to report the crime.



headed and advocated the then Assistant Manager Tony Ramos, City Manager Jeff Parker, colleagues in the City Council, and others connected with the City of Industry to lobby with then former Mayor Dave Perez and members of their council.

In the same year of 2005, with the assistance of Union Pacific Railroad, California Public Utilities Commission, the City of Industry, the City of Walnut and County of Los Angeles began to

develop a program of improvements at each of the crossings. The City of Industry pledged to fund, build and complete the project to enhance Walnut's quality of life. Cartagena said that the City of Walnut enjoyed the relationships and was pleased and truly grateful for the neighboring city's efforts.

When Cartagena assumed his role as mayor in 2006, he said Quiet Zone was one of his top mayoral goal priorities. Newly appointed City Manager Rob Wishner and Senior Management Analyst Chuck Robinson,

as well as the rest of the council including Mary Su, continued to lobby with City of Industry and other agencies connected with the Quiet Zone project.

During the last two years, Rob Wishner, Mayor Mary Su and Cartagena had met with members of Industry's City Council to lobby heavily on the completion of the project and provide any assistance including getting some assistance from state legislators, the County of Los Angeles, and U.S. Representatives. The great news finally came about the Notice of Establishment of

Recap Of Local Crime Last Week

STAFF REPORTS

Southern California - There has been a lot of crime happening in the surrounding area this past week. Here is a recap of all the crime that went on.

On April 18, Police and bomb squad members were called to a Pomona courthouse when a bomb threat was called in. Officials had set up a perimeter around the courthouse and called in bomb squad technicians to send in a remote control robot to detonate a device on the scene. When the device was detonated, it was examined and identified as a hoax device at which point the evacuation of the courthouse was suspended.

On April 19, San Bernardino County Sheriff's arrested a man they suspect broke into a Chino Hills home that day. Juan Pablo Gonzalez, 25 of Los Angeles, is a suspect of a number of burglaries in Chino Hills and in the surrounding area.

When officers responded to a burglary in progress in the 2200 block of Scenic Ridge Drive in Chino Hills, they determined that Gonzalez had fled out the back of the house leaving behind a trail of stolen property. Deputies used the Sheriff's helicopter and a Pomona Police Department K-9 unit to search the area, according to official reports. Gonzalez was spotted walking along a street behind the home that had been broken into and was stopped and questioned. Deputies said he had burglary tools and stolen property on him. Officers also found a car used by Gonzalez containing thousands of dollars worth of stolen property. The arrest is one of several made recently after a string of burglaries have struck Chino Hills, Diamond Bar, Claremont, and La Verne over the past few months.

On April 19, a man accused of setting fire to the St. Vinny church causing 6.2 million dollars in property damage, is set to stand trial on May 2. Gregory Yusuke Shiga, 35, was arrested in May of 2012 and was charged with the arson committed on April 16 2011 of the church on Turnbull Canyon Road. Shiga is also being charged with special allegations stating that he caused multiple other structures to burn and that the fire was caused by a special device made to accelerate the fire or delay ignition, according to the District Attorney's

office.

On April 20, Police were investigating the theft of security cameras in a trailer park in Pomona when they encountered three male teens in the back of the park.

Officers approached the three teens who appeared to be involved in some drug activity. When Police searched the boys, they found that one was in possession of methamphetamine and cocaine packaged in small bags for sale, according to police reports. The street value of the drugs was about \$2,800. In addition to the drugs, the teen was carrying drug paraphernalia and a large sum of money.

Officers also found a no-bail arrest warrant had been issued for the teen related to a robbery case, the report said. One of the teens, a 17 year-old Pomona boy and accused gang member, was arrested at 10:35 a.m. Friday off the 1050 block of E. Mission Blvd, according to Pomona police.

On April 21, a woman and her dog were fatally killed in a car crash near Pathfinder Rd. in Diamond Bar. The crash happened about 9 p.m. Sunday when a full-sized Cadillac Escalade SUV struck a Toyota Prius stalled in the Number 3 lane on the southbound 57, killing the woman and one of the two dogs in the car. The woman was later identified as Shardaben Patel, 67, of Anaheim.

On April 23, a 55 year-old man was found in the 500 block of North Currier Street around 8:30 p.m., when officers responded to a call of a victim down. When officers arrived on scene, they found Conrad Jimenez, Pomona, in the street suffering from several gunshot wounds to his lower extremities, according to a police report. Further investigation is still taking place.
