## Credit Card Skimmers Caught

**Chino** – Two suspects were caught and arrested after putting a credit card skimmer device onto a Chase Bank ATM machine and leading a pursuit in Chino. Chino Police Officers arrested the suspects after they fled the alleged crime scene and caused a traffic collision, which injured two others.

Security officials at the Chase Bank located at 12193 Central

Ave. called Chino Police Officers to report a suspect that had placed a card skimming device, which is used to capture account and pin information, on an ATM machine located inside the branch.

Officers arrived at the Chase Bank and waited for the suspect to return

## Chino Pursuit Ends In One Death

**Chino** – On the early morning of Sat. Mar. 16, a 50-year-old man was killed by Police officials after a high-speed pursuit on multiple freeways.

Ontario resident Jeffrey Langenhorst ended the pursuit in

Eastvale, where he refused to step out of a tractor trailer when asked by San Bernardino County Sheriffs and Chino Police, which caused officers to open fire. Langenhorst was pronounced dead at the scene.

The incident started when Chino Police Officers spotted

an individual that matched the description of a wanted fugitive by investigators.

San Bernardino County Sheriff's spokesman Randy Naquin states that "after refusing to pull

# Infrastructure Improvements Continue In Los Serranos

CITY OF CHINO HILLS

**Chino Hills** - Infrastructure improvements in the Los Serranos area continue with a pavement rehabilitation project on Valle Vista Drive from Pipeline Ave. east to Los Serranos Blvd.

The project consists of removing the entire width of pavement and reconstructing the roadway. Motorists are advised to avoid Valle Vista Dr., which will be open only to residents during the project which is expected to be completed by the end of March. Signage is in place. The contractor will work with residents on Valle Vista Drive to ensure they have access in

and out of the neighborhood during the project. In recent months, sidewalks and streetlights were installed on the north side of Valle Vista Drive in the same area with funding provided by a Safe Routes to School grant.

Hardy and Harper, Inc. of Santa Ana was awarded the \$242,000 contract for the pavement project. The project is funded through Federal Community Development Block Grant funds (CDBG). The City Council has consistently worked to stockpile CDBG funds to provide infrastructure improvements in the Los Serranos area which was developed before the City's in-

corporation under different standards than are in place today.

A new process is being used for the first time on a road project in Chino Hills. Fulldepth reclamation consists of pulverizing the existing asphalt and subgrade material, mixing it with a cement

mix binder, rolling it in place, then applying the final cap of new asphalt. This process allows one continuous operation, cuts down on truck traffic for a reduced impact on air quality, and diverts materials from the landfill by recycling in place.

cited for driving without a license and no proof of insurance.

The California Highway Patrol does not suspect that Castaneda was driving under the influence. Castaneda was not injured, but Rios was taken to Irvine medical Center with significant injuries.

The second incident happened on Mar. 13 when a child was struck by a car near Evergreen Elementary. At approximately 8:14 a.m., the Police Officials responded to a call of a vehicle versus pedestrian accident in the 2500 block of Crooked Creek

Drive, according to local reports. The name of the child or age was not released. Paramedics treated the child, who did not suffer any life threatening injuries, at the scene. Information about the driver was not released as well.

The last incident occurred on Mar. 14 at approximately 11 a.m. when the Walnut-Diamond Bar Sheriff Department responded to a call of child injured at a residence located near Lorbeer Middle School in Diamond Bar.

The child was reported to be playing near a window, climbed on furniture, pushed the screen out and fell through the second story window. The child was airlifted to

a local hospital, and fortunately only suffered a broken leg.

"As far as we know, there was an irresponsible adult in the house. We don't know if it was a baby sitter or the parents," Sgt. Marc Saunders stated. No information was released about whether or not the parents of this child are being investigated.

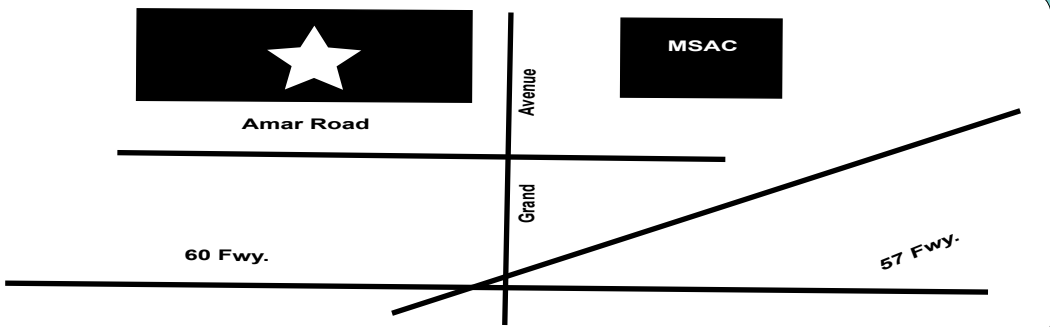

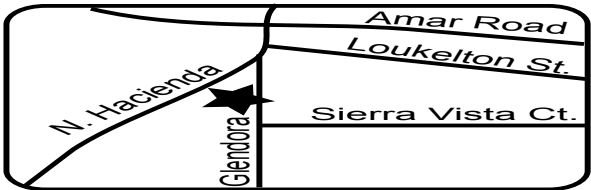

wait a month or so and tell your wife you are planning to take care of all your maintenance appointments soon. Tell her you are planning on making ap-



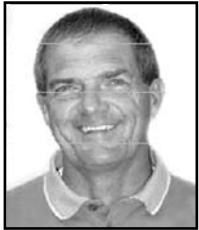

# Child molester sentenced

pers as a "ruthless predator," was sentenced by United States District Judge Virginia A. Phillips.  
In 2009 and 2010, Ruiz repeatedly molested a boy who lived in an apartment near where Ruiz resided with his family. Ruiz documented the abuse with photographs and videos, which he distributed to pedophiles, sometimes in exchange for money. When authorities searched

Ruiz's computer on Halloween in 2010, they discovered more than 6,000 images and over 600 videos of child pornography, which included images of Ruiz molesting the then-12-year-old victim.  
Ruiz pleaded guilty on October 23, 2012, to one count of production of child pornography.  
In addition to the molestation of his neighbor, Ruiz also sexually abused two other boys, who were 9 and 10 when they were attacked. Ruiz groomed all of his

victims with small gifts and access to video games, according to prosecutors.  
"Ruiz sexually abused at least three children, nearly destroying them and their families in the process," federal prosecutors wrote in a document filed in relation to today's sentencing hearing.  
Prosecutors wrote in their sentencing memo that Ruiz "appears to show no remorse for his crimes." Ruiz maintains a "brazen and nonchalant attitude

toward his abuse of children... bragg[ing] about these sexual exploits to a fellow inmate." Ruiz developed a pattern of "grooming his victim[s], professing his love for them, and eventually intimi-

dating them into keeping silent," prosecutors wrote.  
The case against Ruiz is the result of an investigation by the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

# Fullerton officer shot

each of attempted murder, shooting from a motor vehicle, assault with a semiautomatic firearm on a peace officer, possession of a firearm by a felon, and street terrorism, three felony counts of shooting at a residence, and sentencing enhancements and allegations for criminal street gang activity, the personal discharge of a firearm causing great bodily injury, the personal use of a firearm, causing great bodily injury, and a prior strike conviction for criminal threats from 2009. If convicted, he faces a minimum sentence of 60 years to life in state prison. Bush is being held on \$1 million bail and has a no-bail parole hold.

At the time of the crime, Bush is accused of being a documented member of an Anaheim criminal street gang and on parole for assault with a deadly weapon with force likely to cause great bodily injury, criminal threats, and domestic violence from 2009.

At approximately 12:15 a.m. on March 17, 2013, Bush is accused of driving in Fullerton with an unidentified passenger and was pulled over in a traffic stop by an FPD officer. The officer approached the driver's side

door and contacted Bush. As the windows of the vehicle had a dark tint, the officer could not see into the back seat area of the vehicle. As the officer stood close to the car to determine how many occupants were inside, Bush is accused of pulling out a firearm and shooting the officer at point-blank range in the chest. The officer was wearing a ballistic vest, which prevented the bullet from penetrating the body.

As the officer stepped back, Bush is accused of firing out the window at the officer several more times, hitting him twice in the arm and once in the leg. Bush is accused of firing several more times and hitting residences in the area. He is accused of then speeding away and fleeing the scene. The officer was able to fire two rounds at the suspect vehicle as it sped away. It is unknown if the officer struck the defendant's vehicle.

FPD began investigating this case and identified Bush as a suspect. On the afternoon of March 17, 2013, FPD located Bush at an apartment in Anaheim. With the assistance of the Anaheim Police Department, FPD attempted to arrest the defendant. Bush is accused of running from officers and discarding a firearm and bullets as he ran.

The defendant was caught and arrested. The firearm and bullets that were recovered will be tested for forensic evidence at the Orange County Crime Laboratory.

Approximately an hour after the shooting, the California Highway Patrol located the vehicle used in the shooting in Riverside County. Sjanee Duhart, 27, is accused of being the sole occupant of the vehicle at that time. She is accused of attempting to get rid of the vehicle to aid Bush with the intent that he avoid and escape from arrest, trial, conviction, and punishment. She was arrested at the scene. Duhart is charged with one felony count of accessory after the fact and a sentencing enhancement for criminal street gang activity. If convicted, she faces a maximum sentence of seven years in state prison.

The officer was transported to the hospital and is recovering from his injuries.

The investigation is ongoing. Anyone with additional information regarding the case or unidentified passenger is encouraged to contact Supervising District Attorney Investigator Naran Chantanasombute at (714) 347-8844 or FPD at (714) 738-6800.

Deputy District Attorney Gary Logalbo of the TARGET Unit is prosecuting this case.

to collect the device, according to a City of Chino news release.

At approximately 6:05 a.m., a suspect matching the description given by bank officials quickly entered and exited the bank. The suspect fled the scene in a maroon 2000 Lexus GS300 driven by a second suspect.

When Officers attempted to stop the Lexus, the driver sped up and fled westbound on Philadelphia Avenue. Near Yorba Ave., the driver of the Lexus crashed into the backside of a green 1999 Dodge Durango. Both occupants of the Durango, Jose Luis Victorio-Leal, 31 and Ericka Martinez Rocho, 30, both

from Chino, were both treated and released at the scene, according to the release.

After the collision, the suspects fled into a neighborhood south of Philadelphia Ave., where they were found hiding and taken into custody without incident. The suspects were identified as David Serrano, 27, of Long Beach and Ruben Aguilar, 32, of Victorville. Serrano was taken to a local hospital to be treated and Aguilar was treated at the scene. Both were then transported to West Valley Detention Center.

Reports state that officers found evidence of identity theft on the suspects and in the vehicle, as well as methamphetamine. Both suspects were booked for felony evading, burglary, possession of

a controlled substance, and related identity theft charges. Serrano was also booked on DUI charges and was already on parole for burglary. Aguilar had a prior arrest for identity theft and also had an outstanding warrant.

over for failure to yield, the officers began the pursuit." The pursuit lead officers through three freeways. The suspected fugitive also crashed into a patrol vehicle as well a civilian vehicle, and it was determined that he was driving in speeds up to 90 mph.

Langenhorst exited the I-15 freeway and lost control of his vehicle in Eastvale. Langenhorst fled on food and jumped into a tractor trailer, intending to harm police officers. Naquin said that Langenhorst was warned to step out of the tractor and surrender peacefully; however, Langenhorst did not. When Langenhorst refused the officers

request, the officers opened fired.

Langenhorst was pronounced dead on the 4200 block of Hamner Avenue in Eastvale. According to Naquin, whether or not Langenhorst died instantly or not is still under investigation. On Mar. 17,

it was released that Langenhorst was wanted on a federal arrest warrant.

No further information has been released.
