served to, consumed by or in the possession of underage persons. In this chapter, a minor or underage person means any person less than

The Planning Commission is a five-member commission composed of residents appointed by the City Council. The commission advises the City Council on land use and development issues, taking input and making recommendations on the General Plan, Zoning Ordinance, Design Standards and related matters. As you see new construction around town, rest assured that the Planning Commission has reviewed the plans submitted after October 1, 2010 to ensure that the proposed projects are in the best interest of the City.

The City of Eastvale has a substantial group of public safety professionals living in

the City. The Public Safety Commission was created to utilize the rich talent pool of experienced citizens to provide recommendations on Public Safety issues such as:


- Traffic issues

These issues affect the quality of life in Eastvale. Having a group of professionals assist the City Council and staff in providing recommendations for improvements in public safety benefits everyone.

Did YOU Know?

CITY OF EASTVALE

According to Municipal Code Section 6.28.060, Garage Sale Signs, states the following: (a) No sign advertising a garage sale shall be posted, erected or maintained except on the premises where such sale is to be held. No more than one unlighted sign advertising a garage sale may be posted, erected or maintained on the premises where such sale is to be held; provided, however, that no such sign may be posted, erected or maintained on the public right-of-way. Any



such sign posted, erected or maintained on the public right-of-way may be immediately and without notice removed by the city or designee. The city or designee may thereafter bill the responsible party for the reasonable costs of such removal.

In addition, Section 6.28.060. (b) states that each such sign shall be removed at or before the close

of the last day on which the garage sale may be lawfully conducted.

Municipal Code Section 6.28.040 which governs the frequency and time of garage/yard sales states that no person, firm, association or corporation shall conduct more than three garage sales during any period of 12 consecutive months, nor shall more than three garage sales be conducted upon any lot or parcel of land during any period of 12 consecutive months. No garage sale shall be conducted between the hours of 8:00 p.m. to 8:00 a.m. or be conducted for longer than three consecutive days.

Hathaway-Sycamores: A Forever Family

For 17 years, Miguel and Macrina Gutierrez's Whittier, Calif., home was occupied by only themselves and two cats. On July 30 of last year, that occupancy status increased, dramatically! As Miguel recalls, on that fateful Monday, "We became a family."

While the Gutierrez's became a foster/adoptive family of five, literally overnight, their path toward parenthood actually spanned several years. Wed in 1995, the couple set their sights from the start on having children. It was soon discovered, however, that Macrina – who works at a Montebello elementary school as an early intervention specialist – had a medical problem that would make conceiving naturally difficult. Several years were then spent pursuing infertility avenues, including in vitro fertilization, with no success.

Then, a chance conversation pointed to another avenue. Miguel, who works at UPS, was talking with a coworker about his and Macrina's struggle to start a family. The coworker told Miguel that his wife works at a local agency, Hathaway-Sycamores Child and Family Services, and that they have adoption and foster-family pro-

grams.

Miguel, who is now 44, was extremely excited and thought to himself: "Now is the time. If we're going to do something, we need to get moving." Although she didn't share Miguel's immediate enthusiasm, Macrina, 46, agreed to attend a Hathaway-Sycamores Foster Parent Orientation.

Because the Gutierrez's overall goal was to have a permanent family, their first question was: Can fostering a child lead to adoption?

The answer was a resounding "yes." In fact, the Gutierrez's learned that there are currently more than 56,000 children in California's foster care system, with over 13,000 needing an adoptive home. Nationally, there are some 382,000 youngsters in foster care, with about 104,000 available for adoption.

Sensing that foster/adoption was the right path to pursue, Miguel and Macrina began the process to become certified foster parents.

From the first class on, Miguel was impressed with Hathaway-Sycamores' program. "They are so thorough, helpful, open, and honest. They answer all of your questions, and are with you every step of the way." Those steps included training, a home inspection and a home study,

which is an in-depth interview of each applicant's motivation to become a foster/adoptive parent and their history. Commenting on Hathaway-Sycamores' program, Macrina says, "They really prepare you well for being a foster parent. They had guest speakers, educational movies, and you had the chance to talk with actual foster parents."

With Hathaway-Sycamores' guidance, Miguel and Macrina received their foster and adoptive parent certification on July 9, 2012. Just 21 days later, on July 30, 2012, Miguel and Macrina became foster "Mom and Dad".

The couple hadn't planned on becoming a family of five, but when they learned the siblings' story, they instantly became committed to keeping the trio together because their young lives already had been so difficult. The oldest girl, now 6, and her brother, who is almost 4, had been in four foster placements over the last three years. The youngest, a 2-year old toddler girl, had been in foster care since she was four-months old. All had been removed as a result of parental substance abuse and domestic violence.

While Miguel admits that overnight parenthood was "a big shock and a big change," he adds, "Hathaway-Sycamores'

support made the transition very smooth. You can literally call them for help any time of the day or night". And that support doesn't end when the children walk through your door. While all three youngsters are truly thriving, the oldest is struggling with memories of early childhood trauma. To help her navigate these painful recollections, Hathaway-Sycamores home-based services provides weekly in-home therapy to the little girl.

While the Gutierrez's have only been a family of five for just short of one year, Macrina observes, "Now, we couldn't imagine life without them." She has also learned, "Being a parent isn't just about giving birth. It's about taking care of the children and showing them that they're loved."

Miguel shares similar sentiments. "I can't imagine our lives any other way," he says. "They've made such a difference in our lives, and we've made a difference in their lives. They tell us they love us and want to be with us forever." Miguel and Macrina also want the sibling trio to be with them forever, and have been identified by the court as the prospective adoptive home for the children.

There is a pressing need for foster families who are willing to care for a child temporarily, and

for foster/adoption families who want to provide a forever home for a child. Foster families come in many forms of race, lifestyle, income and education levels; full-time employees or retirees; home-owners or renters. The crucial requirement is that you're dedicated to helping a child in need. It's also important to know that Hathaway-Sycamores trains, certifies, supervises, and supports its foster families, including weekly social worker visits, along with virtually any home-based services that are needed.

Great Financial News for the City of Eastvale

Eastvale - With house prices rising and Eastvale schools achieving higher and higher scores, the City of Eastvale is doing very well. The Riverside County Board of Supervisors approved an amended revenue

neutrality agreement, which will allow the City of Eastvale to pay less in revenue than what was originally calculated.

The recalculated agreement shows that Eastvale owes Riverside County only \$384,351 per year, which is around \$500,000 less than what was

originally computed. With this news, many are hopeful that a second fire station on the west side of the city near Archibald and Chandler, can be constructed.

Eastvale's 2013-2014 budget also calls for increased police patrol time and a para-

medic unit, but City Manager Carol Jacobs had cautioned that these were all contingent on the city successfully negotiating an amended neutrality agreement. Since this amendment passed, the Riverside County Board of Supervisors are set to vote on the resolu-

tion that will see that Eastvale actually receives this revenue. The Board of Supervisors is set to vote on the resolution on June 4 and depending on the results, the City of Eastvale could be set to get a financial boost, making Eastvale an even more desirable place to call home.

warrant was served by officers of Eastvale's Special Enforcement Team as part of an ongoing investigation related to illegal residential marijuana growing operations. Two subjects, identified as Bad Quoc Tran, 32, and Dung Tri Nguyen, 31, were detained attempting to flee the scene. Both men were arrested and booked into the Robert Presley Detention Center. The officers also seized over 500 marijuana plants, two ounces of processed marijuana and packaging materials. The operation was also bypassing the electrical meter, causing a fire hazard and utilizing approximately \$5,300 of stolen electricity each month.

May 30, 2013 – Eastvale's Special Enforcement Team officers detained two adult males during a vehicle stop in the area of Archibald and 65th Street. The men were identified as 50-year old Zi Ling Tan, and 54-year old Weitang Zhao, both residents of San Francisco. During the investigation, Tan and Zhao led officers back to a residence in the 13800 block of Ellis Park Trail. An illegal marijuana growing operation was discovered in the beginning stages, along with rerouted electricity, causing a serious fire hazard and approximately \$4,000 per month in stolen electricity. The interior modifications to the recently rented home caused an estimated damage of \$15,000, without the owner's knowledge. Both subjected were arrested and jailed on felony vandalism at the Robert Presley Detention Center.

May 29, 2013 – Eastvale's Special Enforcement Team officers contacted two adult males at a residence in the 5700 block

of Cairo Court and found an illegal marijuana growing operation inside. Over 400 plants and a half pound of processed marijuana were seized. Electricity was also bypassing the meter, causing a serious fire hazard and \$2,500 per month in stolen utilities. Michael Binh Ta, 21, and Tony On, 20, were arrested and jailed at the Robert Presley Detention Center for conspiracy, cultivation of marijuana and grant theft of utilities.

May 27, 2013 – A Norco Police Department deputy investigating a stolen vehicle conducted an enforcement stop relating to the incident. The vehicle fled the scene as the deputy approached resulting in a collision at the intersection of 6th Street and Pedley Avenue. The officer was not in pursuit at the time, and the California Highway Patrol's Multidisciplinary Accident Investigation Team is investigating the collision.

May 24, 2013 – A search warrant was served as follow up to an investigation of three adults and a 3-year old juvenile at a residence in the 7400 block of Coco Court in Eastvale. Officers found an illegal marijuana growing operation of over 800 plants, interior modifications, electrical fire hazards of rerouted and stolen electricity approximating \$4,400 per month, removal of fire alarms, and open containers of fertilizers and pesticides. Officers determined that the juvenile's health and safety were severely compromised due to the living conditions. The three adults, identified as Kam Yuk Lam, 44, Francisco Rodriguez Jimenez, 49, and Gaudalupe Martinez Anaya, 45, were booked into jail at the Robert Presley Detention Center on conspiracy, cultivation of marijuana, grand theft

of utilities, and child endangerment. The juvenile was taken into protective custody by Child Protective Services.

May 23, 2013 – Officers of Eastvale's Special Enforcement Team served a warrant at a residence in the 13000 block of Ellis Park Trail. The home was discovered unoccupied and modified for the purpose of cultivating, processing and packaging marijuana. Over 900 plants, a pound of processed marijuana, digital scales and processing materials were seized. The electricity was also bypassed around the meter, resulting in approximately \$6,000 per month in stolen utilities.

May 23, 2013 – Deputies of the Norco Community Orientated Policing and Problem Solving team, the Norco Station, and the Jurupa Valley Detective Bureau served a warrant to a residence in the 500 block of Carson City Way in Norco. The home was discovered unoccupied and modified for an illegal marijuana growing operation. Deputies seized nearly 800 plants and over ¼ pound of processed marijuana. Electricity was also bypassing the meter causing a serious fire hazard resulting in a total loss of over \$70,000.

May 20, 2013 – Eastvale Police responded to a purse theft at Harada Heritage Park. The victim placed her purse on a bench, and a male juvenile stole the purse and fled on foot. Witnesses saw the juvenile cross the street and enter a burgundy 4-door vehicle, which drove away toward Limonite Avenue. The suspects were reported and the streets were immediately searched. A Norco Police Department sergeant spotted the suspects at the Mobile Gas Station on Hamner Avenue and they were detained and positively identified. Jona-

than Badley, 19, of Corona, and a male juvenile, 17, of Moreno Valley, were arrested

and charged with conspiring to steal a purse and possession of stolen property.



restaurants. The Medical Plaza, which would occupy the lot in front of the recently completed 24-Hour Fitness Center, is proposing a modification that would replace some of the restaurants. Other businesses currently at the retail center include Corky's Kitchen and Bakery, McDonald's, Taco Bell, Wing-Stop, Game-Stop, and Walgreen's.

The Medical Plaza Project is proposing a major review for the development of two two-story buildings, totaling over 69,000 square feet, and 327 parking

spaces. The development would be built in two phases, with the first building, 213 of the parking spaces, perimeter landscaping and walkways to be completed initially. The next phase would develop the second building, the remaining 114 parking spaces and the balance of the landscaping. Phase II would begin one to two years after Phase I has been completed, depending on its success.

Since the property is already subdivided into three lots for the originally approved restaurants, the Medical Plaza Project does not configure to the site. They would require approval of a lot line adjustment to the existing parcels.

The proposed Eastvale San Antonio Community Medical Plaza would include a combination of physician offices and outpatient services such as surgery, imaging, labs, physical therapies, cardiac rehabilitation, dialysis, oncology, urgent care, and other health-related options. No emergency rooms or ambulance services would be provided at

the site.

Once approved by the Planning Commission, there is a ten day window to appeal (the project will not go to the City Council for approval). There is also a 30-day window to contest the CEQA (California Environmental Quality Act) document, commencing on the date the document is filed with the Riverside County Clerk's Office.



portable classrooms are being built to accommodate the 2013-14 school year, beginning later this summer. Four are located at Harada Elementary, and four are at VanderMolen Elementary, also helping to provide some relief to Rosa Parks and Clara Barton Elementary

schools. A temporary, albeit necessary, fix to be sure; but the long term solution of additional schools to meet the needs of the growing community of Eastvale still needs to be addressed.

Corona Norco Unified School District (CNUSD) owns the property adjacent to Half Moon Park (south of Chandler and west of Archibald) dedicated for construc-

tion of the new Yorba Elementary School. According to Ted Rozzi, Assistant Supervisor of Facilities for CNUSD, additional state and local funding is needed for the \$25 million project to complete construction and fund the new technology that is needed district-wide. He said there are some state approvals that will expire soon. A portion of the work will need to be completed this year, with grading to begin in the fall.

Rozzi added, "We are in line for state funding next year, and local funding will

help. If there is enough support for the schools and it all works right, the district will pass the local bond in 2014, and the school will open in July of 2015."

Local reports also stated that an additional unnamed school is being evaluated for the North West portion of Eastvale, which still has homes under construction. CNUSD is looking to implement another school bond to complete this school.

21 years of age.

According to the ordinance, Sec. 8.06.020, "No person responsible for an event shall allow, arrange, assist, permit or host a party, gathering or event where alcoholic beverages are in the possession of/or being consumed by, or served

to any underage person."

Eastvale Police Officers will be paying extra attention this graduation and summer season to enforce of the Social Host Ordinance, and the consequences are severe. Under Sec. 8.06.030 (a), Any person violating Section 8.06.020 is guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction shall be punishable by a fine of not more than \$1,000.00 and/or im-

prisonment of not more than six months, except as noted in subsection (b) of this section. Subsection (b) states: The procedures provided for in this section are in addition to any other statute, ordinance or laws, civil or criminal. This section in no way limits the authority of law enforcement officers to make arrests for any criminal offense arising out of conduct regulated by this chapter.

We encourage Eastvale residents to have a safe and festive summer. Don't drink and drive and never provide, serve or allow the consumption of alcohol by a minor or underage person.

Frequently Asked Car Questions

STAFF REPORTS

Eastvale – As we will be spending these next couple of months traveling to the beach, the river, or on a road trip for the summer, we have to make sure our cars are in the best shape. Here are a few frequently asked vehicle questions answered by Chris Mitsos, President of Mountain View Tires, located at 6080 Hamner Avenue in Eastvale.

How often should I have the oil in my vehicle changed?

Oil change frequency depends on a few factors:

- 1) Your vehicle manufacturer's recommendation. Check your owner's manual to see what's right for your make and model.
- 2) Which type of oil you use. Conventional motor oils may last 3,000 to 5,000 miles, while synthetic oils can keep working up to 15,000 miles.
- 3) How you drive. If you're consistently tough on your vehicle or you drive in dirty conditions, consider having

your oil changed more frequently than recommended.

What is the difference between conventional oil and synthetic oil?

The basic difference is that conventional oil is made from petroleum, while synthetic oils are formulated from man-made chemicals. Synthetic oil does cost more, but it can last three times longer than conventional oil. It also may reduce engine sludge and produce other benefits.

What should I do if I notice a vibration?

A vibration is an indication that something needs attention. If addressed promptly, a minor adjustment may correct the vibration. If neglected, the vibration could cause accelerated wear or damage to tires and steering and suspension components. Whenever a vibration is present, the tires should be checked for irregular wear. The type of wear can determine the cause and probable correction of the vibration.

Can my driving habits affect the



service life of my tires?

Absolutely! To increase the life of your tires, avoid the following:

- 1) Fast starts and panic stops
- 2) Driving too fast on curves and around corners
- 3) Riding on the edge of the pavement, and driving over curbs, chuckholes, or other obstructions

All these actions generate additional stress on your tires' sidewalls and shoulders and can lead to premature wear or even tire failure. Road hazards are also a leading cause of shortened tire

life. Hitting road debris or obstacles and driving over curbs can cause tire damage, including visible cuts in the tread and sidewall, as well as hidden internal damage that can lead to greater problems later. Hitting road hazards also can jar suspension and steering components out of alignment, which leads to tire wear.

Eastvale City council recap

City's Economic Development.

The meeting began with the old business items from the past Council meeting. The Council moved to pass the Eastvale Community Foundation CDBG grant process by a 5-0 vote. The next item called to attention was the administrative policy regarding the use of City vehicles, which was also passed with a 5-0 vote. The biggest of the old business items was the Eastvale City's Strategic Plan, which was passed 5-0.

The final old business item was the Economic Development Plan. Adam Rush proposed to explore the cost of the plan as a direction to send the plan in, all members agreed with a 5-0 vote.

Next on the agenda was to visit the new business items. The first was the proposed revision to personnel policies and procedures. These changes included things such as how much vacation and sick time administrators were allowed, to adding language to clearly determine the change between a promotion and a reclassification. The motion to create a revised draft for the next meeting was passed by a 5-0 vote. The next item was the proposed revised salary and benefit schedule. The schedule was passed by a 4-1 vote, with Welch casting the dissenting vote.

The final items that were brought fourth were the alternate tax appointment which passed with a 5-0 vote and can un-marked item on the agenda that was put in last minute by Mayor Ike Bootsma. The vote was to relieve Jeff DeGrandpre of his positions on two commission boards.

Finally, the meeting moved onto public hearings, which included four dif-

ferent items that the public was allowed to speak on. The first was the public hearing of the Annual Operations and Capital Improvement Budget Fiscal Year 2013-2014. Here, it was explained how the fiscal year budget would be spent and also proposed a continuation public hearing and adoption on June 12, 2013. This motion was passed 5-0.

Next was the public hearing on the amendment to the Eastvale Specific Plan 300 to allow Home Occupations subject to the regulations of the East-

vale Zoning code. Welch and Rush both stepped out for this motion due to them living in that code enforcement zone. The motion was made to pass by 3-0 vote.

The third item was the proposed updates to the Eastvale Zoning Code. This update would allow houses with

less than three feet of space available to build a patio cover; and would also allow citizens to put a permanent basketball court feature onto their property so long as it is a certain footage away from the street and is kept well maintained.

The council then closed it's session.

During his birth, Rick was strangled by the umbilical cord, leaving him severely brain damaged. Eventually, however—through modern science and his parents' love—he was fitted as a young teenager with a device that allowed him to communicate by controlling a computer cursor with the side of his head. One of the first things he typed was a request to do a five-mile charity run with his dad.

At the time, Dick had never run more than a mile at any one time. He was in his 30s and way out of shape. But he did it anyway, pushing Rick's buggy in front of him as he ran the race. When they got home that night, Rick typed on his computer, "Dad, when we were running, it felt like I wasn't disabled anymore."

That did it for Dick. He started training for marathons— with a passion. Many have asked Dick why he doesn't try doing one of these on his own, see what he could do. "No way," he says. "I do it simply for the look on Rick's face."

Recently, Dick suffered a mild heart attack during a race. The doctor said, "If you hadn't been in such great shape, you probably would have died fifteen years ago."

Being a real dad is redemptive. It has a way of saving two lives at the same time.


