Translators Not Required At Council Meetings

Walnut - The Walnut City Council has decided not to pursue the policy requiring citizens to bring interpreters to city council meetings for non-English speakers.

In mid-July, the council decided to table the proposal until

the city attorney and the Department of Justice had a chance to look it over.

The proposed policy would require the city to hold all meetings in English, requiring those who do not speak the language to provide a translator to pass on the information to the full council and the public.

"At this point, the council is determined that they no longer want to pursue the policy," says Deputy City Manager Chuck Robinson. "It was just misinterpreted."

After the motion was tabled,

\$10,000 Missing From Walnut Elementary School's Community Club Funds

Walnut - Superintendent Dean Conklin of the Walnut Valley Unified School District confirmed that a minimum of \$10,000 is missing from the account of Walnut Elementary School's Community Club.

The funds were discovered missing towards the end of the

2011-2012 school year when members of the club noticed their finances were significantly less than expected.

"[The district] then called in our auditors [and] asked them to review the books of the Community Club to report any irregularities," says Conklin. "They reported back to us that they had a concern and there was in fact money

missing and the Community Club was the victim of a crime."

Though the funds were discovered months ago, the auditors have spent this time working on a very thorough investigation and creating an extensive draft report, says Conklin. This report

Study Analyzes Congestion On Fullerton Rd.

Industry - The City of Industry and the County of Los Angeles recently released the results of a \$150,000 study commissioned to find ways to improve traffic along the often congested Fullerton Road Corridor.

According to the study, in order

to improve traffic operations along Fullerton Road and to increase operational safety of the area, a grade separation of the Los Angeles Subdivision has been proposed by the Alameda Corridor East Construction Authority. The grade separation

the city council expected a return of the proposal within two weeks. During this evaluation period, the proposal was poorly represented by certain media outlets, according to Robinson.

"If [residents] wanted to address the council and English wasn't their first language, they would have to provide their own interpreter so that their remarks could be entered into the official records," says Robinson. "The

media portrayed it as 'you have to speak English to address the council,' which is patently false," says Robinson.

Mayor Pro Tem Tom King says the proposal wasn't for English-only city council meetings.

"The discussion was to advise people whether or not to have a translator," says King.

King had proposed that the city put together a list of volunteers who would assist residents in their language of choice. If a resident needed to address the council in a language other than

English, the council would review the list of volunteers for someone who could translate for that resident.

"Walnut welcomes anyone from the public to address the council on any topic that they desire," says Robinson. "We do not want to detract anyone from doing so."

was completed within the last week and reviewed by Conklin.

The district met with the Walnut/Diamond Bar Sheriff's Station to present to them the draft report and request they take over the matter. The final draft of the report was recently submitted and is now in the hands of the sheriff's department, who will continue the investigation.

It appears to the district that

this crime was committed by only one person and is not the result of a collaborative effort.

"[This] person at Walnut Elementary is a volunteer, not a district employee," says Conklin. "We do have a lead and we have turned that over to the sheriffs department. It's not an employee issue, it's a criminal issue."

The missing funds, which come from Community Club fundraisers, would have been used to support the costs of field trips and assemblies. The dis-

trict will keep the scheduled trips on the itinerary for the next school year, so that neither teachers nor students are affected by the circumstances.

"The district is committed to making sure that no one loses opportunities because of this situation," says Conklin. "We will make sure that any activities planned by the Community Club will take place."

would eliminate at-grade crossings between the Union Pacific Railroad mainline track and Fullerton Road, reduce vehicular traffic congestion and queuing and improve the level of service.

"The study for Fullerton Road was done to study congestion release improvement along Fullerton Road that could be done in addition to the grade separation," says John Ballas, City of Industry

city engineer.

The cost estimates for ultimate improvements are considered to be about \$3 million for the City of Industry and \$10 million for the County of Los Angeles, says Ballas.

The study analyzes the 15 signalized intersections accessible from Colima Road, Gale Avenue and Railroad Street. Of these 15, nine are located between the one and a quarter mile long stretch from Colima Road and Valley Boulevard. This area was chosen due to the

observed locations of congestion and proximity to the Los Angeles subdivision railroad crossing and the 60 freeway interchange.

In order to assess future conditions, with the horizon year being 2032, a growth factor of 0.4 percent annual growth was applied to the 2012 existing volumes to forecast the conditions. A 100 percent increase in train activity was also applied.

In its conclusion, the study says "The proposed grade separation and associated planned improvements would help the Fullerton

Road corridor operate with less congestion, queuing and vehicle delay." In addition to the grade separation, it was recommended to add north and south bound right and left turn lanes to Fullerton Road/Gale Avenue and Colima Road and an

addition of north and south band through lanes to Fullerton Road/ 60 East off-ramp.

City of Industry City Council has agreed to look over the report, but no decisions have been made in regards to construction or funding.

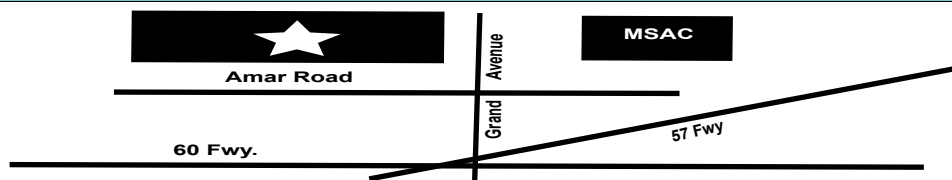

products, in an eyecare setting.

year bond measure would have been used to upgrade facilities, build new schools and update technology resources within the District's 49 schools.

"Do we need a bond? Absolutely," says Thomas Pike, assistant superintendent for executive services. "But after studying this further, we have decided that this

is not the best time to place this on the ballot."

Pike says there will be many competing issues, including Governor Jerry Brown's proposed Proposition 30 which would increase both income tax on high earners and sales tax by a quarter percent to help fund state public higher education.

The board feels additional time is needed to continue

studying what options will be best for students, the timing of the measure and to assess whether the necessary resources exist to effectively manage a campaign.

"I think there needs to be more lead time to develop and implement an effective campaign," says Pike. "We will at some point propose a school bond, but it will not be on the November ballot."

for sexually assaulting a 12-year-old girl he met on MySpace.

Castaneda was found guilty by a jury on May 14, 2012, of two felony counts, including one felony count of aggravated sexual assault of a child and one felony count of lewd acts on a child under 14.

Castaneda was on parole for a 2007 prior conviction for felony domestic violence and violating a restraining order.

In November 2009, Castaneda met the 12-year-old girl on MySpace and began communicating with her online. On Feb. 17, 2010, he met the victim near South Coast Plaza in Costa Mesa and took an Orange County Transit Authority

bus with her to Anaheim.

At approximately 6 p.m., after walking around in two different parks, the defendant took the girl to his motel room at Zaby's Motor Lodge on Harbor Boulevard and Katella Avenue in Anaheim. He sexually assaulted the victim at the motel and then fled the scene.

At approximately 6:30 p.m., she left the room, found an Anaheim Police Civilian Traffic Controller, and asked to be taken home. The victim was reported missing that same day to the Santa Ana Police Department (SAPD).

On the evening of Feb. 19, 2010, Anaheim police officers located and arrested Castaneda at a warehouse on Placentia Avenue in Costa Mesa.

Castaneda's lifetime sex

offender registration bars him from entering County recreational areas and City parks that have passed the Sex Offender Ordinance including Costa Mesa, Huntington Beach, Irvine, Laguna Hills, Lake Forest, La Habra, Los Alamitos, Mission Viejo, Rancho Santa Margarita, Santa Ana, Seal Beach, Westminster and Yorba Linda.

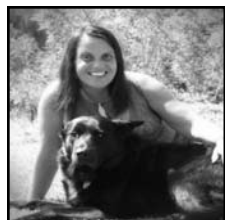

Straight Talk With Danice

My middle aged sister has been financially dependent on our father her whole adult life. She has a decent job, but fails to live within her means. My dad has always cushioned her life financially, but she remains a mess. I don't like to see her take advantage of him, but when I would bring up the subject, my dad would more or less say it was none of my business. He said he felt sorry for her because she never got married. I tried to understand his feelings.



Now my father has a terminal illness. During a recent visit with him, he told me he knew he could count on me to take care of my sister after he passed away. I just nodded my head, because I didn't want to upset him when he is feeling so ill. I am very angry, and I don't know what to do. My sister never contributes anything to my dad or our family, but expects to get regular cash hand outs. Any suggestions will be appreciated.

Hello,

I am sorry you are facing the loss of your father. This is a very difficult time in your life, so I will try to make things simple for you.

Your dad is an enabler. Your sister is a master manipulator, and probably uses the emotion of guilt to get what she wants. She most likely has a victim mentality. And guess what? It has worked where your father is concerned. In a way, your dad has also used a subtle form of manipulation on you, when he said he knew he could count on you to pick up the responsibility for your sister after he is gone. Guilt is a powerful emotion, but nothing good ever gets

accomplished from prolonged guilt. Notice how he never really "asked" you. He does not leave any room for a negative response from you. I'm sure he is not feeling up to a big conversation about this, so just forgive him and move on.

Based on results... Your father's financial assistance has never really assisted your sister at all. You say she is still a mess, right? Real "Help" should empower a person. It's obvious your sister is disempowered by your father's hand outs. So, what your father provided was never really help. He enabled her to stay dysfunctional. Quite often, people like your sister end up resenting the people who help them stay in their bad situation. And in many cases, they form a sense of entitlement that de-

fies logic. They feel weak and helpless and blame their caretaker for it, therefore feeling no remorse when their perceived requirements get out of balance. When you do for others what they should really be doing for themselves, you diminish their opportunity for growth, personal power, and basic dignity.

So based on these guidelines... Offer to "Help" your sister if she really wants to improve her life, and explain that she must be a full participant. Make it clear that you will not carry her as

your father has done. Healthy, able bodied adults should take personal responsibility for their own lives.

My hope is for you to start a new way of behaving in your family. Breaking the old cycle will benefit all future generations.
