## Speed Limits Change In City Of Eastvale

**Eastvale** - At the Eastvale Town Hall Meeting in May, Mayor Ike Bootsma reported that a speed limit study was being conducted on all the main nonresidential roads in the city, and new speed limit signs may be posted in the future. As a result, you may have seen Speed Awareness Monitors around

town over the last month or so.

In order to uphold court rulings in regard to traffic violations, the California Vehicle Code requires cities to conduct new speed surveys every five years to enforce speed limits on city streets that use radar. As construction of streets and buildings continues

## JCSD Change In Sewer Rates

**Jurupa Valley** - In 2009, the Jurupa Community Services District (JCSD) Board of Directors adopted a five-year rate plan scheduling an average annual increase of 16% over

the period. In 2011 and 2012 the increases were reduced to 9% because an operating/capital budget was developed below the original estimates. In May of this year it was determined that the scheduled increase would again be reduced to 9% based on an

analysis of revenues and expenses over the next year. A Residential Notice with this information was recently mailed to the JCSD local district.



# A Resident's Guide to Public Participation in City Planning

In a city that is growing as quickly as Eastvale, there's a lot to keep track of. Projects are moving through the planning process and seeking approval from the City Council nearly every month of the year. How can you stay up to date on what's being planned for the community?

Community involvement in the planning process helps ensure that Eastvale will become the City it hopes to be in the future. The State of California requires cities and counties to involve residents in the planning process. The level of public involvement in different types of projects varies from a simple notice of a public hearing for a permit, to something as significant as special advisory committees formed for the development of a long range plan such as a General Plan.

The City may mail notices about site-specific projects such as a development project, to adjacent property owners within a 300 foot radius. For other planning projects, official legal notices for public hearings will be posted in the newspaper, City Hall, meeting locations and the Eastvale Public Library at Eleanor Roosevelt Library. These public notices are also shared on the City's official website, Facebook page, and Twitter feed.

The City's process for reviewing and approving projects provides many opportunities for public participation. All development projects approved by the Planning Commission or City Council require a public hearing, and public testimony will always

be heard at the meeting before a decision is made.

Normally when a new project comes into the City, the developer will submit their plans and meet with the planning staff to discuss the project and make necessary changes as recommended by the planning staff and public works department. During this process, the project applicant will typically prepare several different studies such as: a traffic study, environmental impact report (EIR) and greenhouse gas study. Once the planning staff feels the project is ready for consideration, they will prepare an agenda packet and take the project to the Planning Commission for their review, comment, and recommendations for approval or denial. Often times, the project will then go to the City Council for their final review, comment and approval or denial. At each meeting, the public has the opportunity to provide their comments and concerns about the project prior to final

approval or denial.

Public review and comment is an integral part of the process of preparing and approving the environmental documents that accompany various types of projects and plans. State law requires that the public is provided with several opportunities to read and comment on environmental documents. By law, all of the comments received require a response. With so many different types of projects happening in Eastvale at one time, how can you find information about the projects that most interest and impact you? The City's website ([www.eastvaleca.gov](http://www.eastvaleca.gov)) is the best place to start! Residents who are particularly interested in planning issues should sign up for e-notification on the City's website — click "stay informed" on [www.eastvaleca.gov](http://www.eastvaleca.gov) and select "Planning Commission Meetings" to receive a copy of the upcoming agenda. The website's planning page features clear explanations

about the process for different types of projects, highlighting opportunities for public involvement. You can also find contact information for elected officials and City staff, as well as upcoming meeting dates and agendas. Keep in mind that official information, facts, and figures about proposed development projects should be obtained directly from the Eastvale Planning Department.

Finally, you can drop by the City's planning counter during regular business hours (Monday-Thursday 7:30 to 5:30) and talk with a planner about current projects. If a planner is not available, you can also take advantage of our "virtual planner" by utilizing Face-time and an iPad at the front counter to get face to face time with a planner that is

able to answer your questions. The Planning Department is located in City Hall: 12363 Limonite Ave, Suite 910 (near the Chipotle restaurant in the Eastvale Gateway shopping center).

Should you have any questions or comments, City Hall may be reached at Hall (951) 361-0900. City Hall office hours are Monday-Thursday from 7:30 am – 5:30 pm, closed every Friday.

## Did YOU Know?

CITY OF EASTVALE

It's that time of year - summer fun and vacations are upon us! When preparing to use your boat, RV, trailer or other recreational vehicle(s), please keep in mind the parking standards in the City of Eastvale and pay close attention to your street sweeping schedule as posted at the main entrance to each development.

According to Municipal Code Section 120.05.080. - Neighborhood preservation standards states the following: (2)(a-c) No vehicle shall be parked upon a public street for more than 72 consecutive hours within a radius of 500 yards and shall be subject to citation and/

parking of commercial vehicles is permitted.

No recreational vehicles shall be parked in any front yard area of a property. No



or removal by the city as provided for in state law; No person shall construct, repair, grease, lubricate or dismantle any vehicle, or any part thereof, upon a public street, sidewalk or right-of-way, except for temporary emergency purposes; No vehicle, such as a car, truck or motorized bike, shall be parked in any landscaped area.

recreational vehicle, or any part thereof, shall encroach upon a public street, sidewalk or right-of-way. Recreational vehicles shall be allowed, if they are screened behind a

fence or wall of at least five feet in height and parked in a garage, side yard or rear yard. A recreational vehicle may be parked in a public right-of-way or approved parking area for



a period of not more than 48 hours twice a month for the purposes of loading or unloading said vehicle.

In addition, Section 120.05.080. (e) states that No commercial vehicles, or any part thereof, shall be parked upon a public street, sidewalk, right-of-way, private yard or private driveway, except when it is actively used for loading or unloading purposes. No overnight

# Fun Summer Activities That Involve ALL The Kids...Even The Special Ones

Finding activities to keep kids busy isn't too difficult when you live in a city so near the mountains, the beaches and inland activities. But what do you do when one of your kids has special needs and you need to find activities that all of your kids can enjoy?

As the mother of three growing and busy boys and one who has special needs, this has been a challenge for me every summer. Often times I have found it difficult to find something that they can all enjoy at the same time without someone having to sit out on the sidelines. Our biggest challenge this year was swim lessons! While Eastvale offers a variety of public and private swim lessons, I found it difficult to find a place where they could all go.

The Cove in Riverside, which is only a 10 mile drive from Eastvale, offers an adapted swim lesson program called Star F.I.S.H., where each child is individually assessed by a credentialed instructor and matched with the right teacher. Each instructor carries a credential in Adapted Aquatics by the AAPHERD, which sets the standards for adapted aquatics education. They help provide a non-threatening learning environment by using teaching methods that will enhance the student's learning process.

The water is warm, the instructors are kind and understanding and it also helps build not only their swimming skills but their social interaction skills as well.

The best thing about these lessons is that while my son was taking them, my older boys were able to enjoy the waterslides and

the Lazy River, and then we were able to enjoy the rest of the park together as a family without anyone being left out. The Cove Waterpark section boosts a variety of fun water activities that we were all able to do and the lifeguards worked with me to accommodate my son as best as they could. Sometimes teaching a lifeguard a few signs for "stop", "wait" and "go" is all it takes to make my little guy's day go much smoother. Communication is key when trying to find activities to do together as most places will accommodate you, you just need to speak up, be reasonable and be patient.

If water is not your thing, then try out Sky High Sports in Mira Loma. The first Tuesday of every month

from 3pm-6pm, they turn down the music and dial down the distractions for the comfort of their "extra special jumpers" and their families to enjoy an afternoon of fun and exercise. Jumping on the trampolines is not only fun, but extremely good for balance, motor control and building strength. This special session is only \$5 for each child and the parent/therapist is free. However, I

have also taken my sons there during their normal hours and they have been extremely accommodating for us.



# Traffic issues in Eastvale: plans to ease congestion

of confusion seems to center around the idea that focusing on traffic issues would take away from the funding allocated for crime prevention. This is simply not the case. The City of Eastvale has two deputies who are dedicated to traffic control. Their main function is to patrol our streets for traffic violations, guide and direct traffic and to make sure that people are following the traffic rules for the safety of everyone. Eastvale also has other deputies that are dedicated to crime prevention, patrol, etc.

Our new budget, which took effect on July 1, 2013 will raise the number of hours from 70 hours per day to 80 hours per day (hours spread between multiple deputies). These extra ten hours per day are a reflection of a decision made by a multitude of organizations in

order to help better patrol our City. However, the increase in our budget is what really made this a reality. As the City of Eastvale stated, "The allocation of resources is a determination made by the staff at the Sheriff's Department in conjunction with the City Manager based on data that is collected by the Sheriff's Dept. and Public Works."

With this distinction made, the City of Eastvale is determined to get the dialogue started and to take steps to creating some type of solution for the current traffic problems.

One of the major problems is the close proximity of three large schools, Roosevelt, River Heights and Eastvale Elementary. Within a 40 minute period in the morning and afternoon, there are thousands of students and parents in this small stretch of road. On top of that, kids who once were bused in, are now being dropped off and picked

up, adding even more to the congestion. Stop signs are ignored, red curbs are parked at, and as one Eastvale resident commented, "It's an accident waiting to happen". There is a great need for something to be done to ease the congestion and create some sort of organization to all the traffic issues.

Mayor Ike Bootsma believes that it is up to the City of Eastvale to work with the School District to try and figure out a way to ease the problem. "While we aren't going to be able to completely solve the problem, we have to start somewhere." The City has started a program in conjunction with the Corona-Norco School District and the 100 Mile Club called "Walking to School is Cool" in hopes of making it cool to walk to school again. For more information about this program, read the story on page 1. Hopefully, the continued effort of dedicated citizens, parents and programs

help to ease the traffic congestion around schools.

The community has also been helpful by voicing their concerns over high traffic areas, speeding cars and kids not wearing helmets. These comments have helped to increase enforcement of traffic and helmet laws in problematic areas.

Speeding and the speed limit were another concern voiced by Eastvale residents, as many felt that the speed limits in many areas were just too high. The Eastvale City Council voted 4-0 to decrease the speed limits throughout parts of Eastvale. For more information about these speed limit changes, read the story on page 1.

Road improvements on Citrus Street near Roosevelt High School started on June 10 and are expected to continue through August. The modification of traffic signals at Citrus and Scholar Way and at Citrus and Granja Vista/ERHS should also help to ease congestion in

that area. A new traffic signal at Sumner and Citrus is also in the works. Construction on Pine in Chino west of Hellman is also expected to continue through August and will re-open with four lanes when complete. Since this is a major route into Eastvale, the construction has caused a lot of delays for the morning and evening commuters, but the extra lanes should help to alleviate some of the traffic.

With the continued effort of our dedicated City and the Sheriff's Department, it is our hope that we can all continue to work together to continue to make Eastvale a safe community to live. If you have questions or concerns, make sure to attend meetings for the Planning Commission and the Public Safety Commission. The Planning Commission meets the first and third Wednesdays of the month at 6pm at Rosa Parks. The Public Safety Commission meets on the third Monday of the month at Rosa Parks.





# Plume Cleanup: Is Eastvale Water Safe to Drink?

**Eastvale** - The Archibald Trichloroethylene Plume located in the City of Ontario and south of the Ontario International Airport is believed to be moving in a southerly direction towards the wells pumped by the Chino Desalter Authority. This desalter is a water source for Norco, Eastvale, Ontario, Chino Hills, Chino, Jurupa Valley and the Western Municipal Water District. Residents fear that the contamination from Trichloroethylene, TCE, will reach the Eastvale water supply and contaminate our water. TCE, is an industrial degreaser and solvent used to remove grease from fabricated metal

parts and in the production of some textiles.

According to the EPA website, "Trichloroethylene, is a volatile organic chemical, a colorless or blue liquid with a chloroform-like odor." The Safe Drinking Act of 1974, requires the EPA to measure the level of contaminants in drinking water at which no adverse health effects are likely to occur. The measurement in which they base the maximum contaminant level goal is called MCLG and the MCLG for trichloroethylene is zero. Contaminants are any physical, chemical, biological or radiological substances or matter in the water. Trichloroethylene is known to cause cancer and due to its toxicity it fell out

of use over 20 years ago.

In an effort to avoid contamination and to solve the problem before it gets to our area, six inland water providers have agreed to work together to clean up the contamination before it becomes a problem. The Jurupa District Board of Directors approved the agreement, called a memorandum of understanding, on May 13th. The agreement will hopefully allow the agencies to work together to solve the problem instead of wasting time and money in litigation. The water quality control board issued draft cleanup and abatement orders and the agencies will have to develop a clean-up strategy to apply for state and federal funding to pay for the work.

Eastvale and Jurupa Valley residents can rest assured that Jurupa Valley Water District is working to ensure that this plume of contamination is

cleaned up long before it reaches our cities. We will report on this story as it continues to develop and as more information becomes available.

site, the Sewer System Operations Group responsible for the collection and transportation of wastewater is focused on reliability and accountability. Their personnel operate a complex matrix of systems to protect the

public health and maintain compliance with all regulations.

Rates are currently determined each year by average water usage in the district over the winter months, with the average based on the two lowest usage months December through March. The more water you use, the higher the

rates will be.





trict will hear more about this program when it is presented to the school board on July 18 for approval. The City hopes to work closely with the School District as well as School principals to further develop this program and to address concerns from parents.

In a presentation at the June 12th City Council meeting, the City explained some of the benefits associated with walking

to school. Reduced car emission, reduced traffic around school sites, improved safety, and exercise for both children and parents are just a few. The City has also applied for sidewalk funds to assist with pedestrian connectivity to ensure that parents and children have a safe place to walk.

According to their Power Point presentation, the City will also prepare maps, meet with principals and PTA organizations and work with the Sheriff's Department to develop safety tips for pedestrians and bicyclists. Children that live further than "walking

distance" to schools can have their parents' park at parks and in residential areas closer to the schools, and walk from there. The main idea is to clear the areas around the schools and to get the kids walking and exercising. As always, children are encouraged to never walk alone and to instead walk with parents or small groups to ensure their safety. The City also wants to include the 100 Mile Club into the program and hopes they will be able to offer the incentive

of earning 2 miles per week to students who participate. The 100 Mile Club, is a program that is in place at all the elementary and intermediate schools throughout Eastvale, offering incentives such as T-Shirts and awards for achieving certain benchmarks in walking or running during the school year. Most children in Eastvale participate in this program while walking or running laps during school hours and the added incentive of earning extra miles may just make it an even better program for students.

# Zero Tolerance Policy Established In The City Of Eastvale

CITY OF EASTVALE

**Eastvale** - The Eastvale City Council announced today that it is implementing a multi-faceted zero tolerance policy on marijuana grow houses in Eastvale. Over the next 60 days the community will see a number of policies implemented in a continuing effort to proactively combat marijuana grow houses in the city.

The Riverside County Sheriff and City staff have been diligently working together to promptly identify and immediately shut down grow houses in Eastvale. In an ongoing effort to combat this issue, the City will be using existing laws such as the "Drug Abatement Law" under the State of California Health and Safety Code. Additional aggressive measures include working directly with key staff at Southern California Edison (SCE) to identify houses that are suspected of bypassing the SCE electrical meter, implementing a rental inspection and registration program as

well as launching a city-wide Neighborhood Watch campaign with a program kick-off event on July 19, 2013 at 6:00 p.m. on Springvale Court.

Illegal grow house activity inside an Eastvale rental property.

City Manager Carol Jacobs stated, "our message is clear in Eastvale, if you rent your property to an individual or group of people at which illegal activity occurs then you, the property owner, are responsible. The "I didn't know" defense is no longer acceptable. This team approach will affect positive change in Eastvale."

Over the next several months, the City of Eastvale will be providing the community with on-going information and tips on how to identify "grow houses". This will include: rental registration, business registration for property owners who rent their properties, an inspection program, information on how to choose a legal renter, how to work with the real estate and property management companies and using the

Drug Abatement laws as an aggressive deterrent.

The City's Chief of Police, Captain Danny Feltenberger said, "Every tip we have received from the community regarding suspected grow house activity has been confirmed. The residents are batting 1,000!" The residents of Eastvale are the best eyes and ears for thwarting this type of illegal activity.

Mayor Ike Bootsma vowed, "The City Council is committed to eradicating marijuana grow houses in the City of Eastvale. By working with the Sheriff Department, city staff, our community partners and the residents, we will solve this problem. This type of illegal activity will not be tolerated in the City of Eastvale."

City Attorney John Cavanaugh stated, "The City Council has given a clear mandate to the City's Attorney's Department to take all necessary legal actions in an effort to compel property owners to take more responsibility for renting their investment properties to tenants

for illegal purposes."

About the City of Eastvale:

Eastvale, one of California's newest cities, incorporated on October 1, 2010. Roughly ten years prior, Eastvale was a part of the world-famous Chino dairy area, home to thousands of dairy cattle and only a handful of residents. According to the City Council Meeting held on June 12, in accordance with Eastvale Municipal Ordinance 2013-10, Eastvale's Public Works department completed a study on 29 segments where the speed limit was established five years ago, or where a street segment was recently opened to traffic. Limits are based upon four major categories of data collection, including street surveillance, speed surveys, any conditions not obvious to motorists, and accident analysis. The information is also reviewed by the Eastvale Police department.

Of the 29 segments, 17 were determined to be appropriate, five segments will have speeds reduced, and new speeds will be established at the remaining seven locations. Of note,

are Hamner Avenue, between Schleisman and Limonite, which will decrease in speed from 50mph to 40mph due to accident history and to maintain speed

consistency between street segments; and Archibald Avenue, between Wind River/Grapewin and Schleisman, and Schleisman and Bellegrave, which will

both decrease from 55 to 50mph due to accident history.  
Once the ordinance is amended, the new speed limit signs will be installed.

# Crime recap

7400 Block of Elm Grove Avenue, officers responded to a child sexual assault crime. Once officers on scene secured the child, their investigation revealed that a male adult had sexually assaulted the child over a period of time. On Tuesday, June 25, 2013, the male adult had turned himself in. 35-year-old Eastvale resident, Steven Laurence Rivera was arrested and booked into the Robert Presley Detention Center for several separate felony charges related to sex crimes against a child and his bail was set at one million dollars.

Later that day, a marijuana grow house was shut down on the 14000 block of Tiger Lily Ct in Eastvale, officers responded on scene. Once inside the residence, officers seized 333 marijuana plants, 3 1/2 pounds of processed marijuana and digital scales. Additionally, electricity was being bypassed around the meter, causing a serious fire hazard and resulting in approximately \$3750.00 a month in stolen electricity.

On June 22, officers conducted a DUI/ Drivers license checkpoint on Hidden valley Pkwy and Corona Ave. During the check point hours, officers had 731 vehicles enter the check point, 663 of those vehicles were screened. Officers arrested 5 DUI-alcohol suspects and cited/arrested 13 suspects for driving unlicensed or while suspended/revoked.

On June 27, officers responded to a residence in the 13500 block of Laurel Court, Eastvale to assist the Los Angeles County Sheriff Department to serve a search warrant. During the operation, deputies from the Los Angeles Sheriff's Department located two suspects in possession of illegal firearms and marijuana. The suspects have been identified as Duane Keith Davis, 50, and Terrence D'Shon Harrison, 25, both residents of Eastvale. D'Shon Harrison is a documented gang member out of the Los Angeles area. Both suspects were arrested for weapons violations and felony possession of marijuana.

On June 27, a resident informed us of an unknown person driving a gray truck that drove through a fire hydrant and into a wall in a residential area off Cedar Creek Rd. near Schleisman Ave. They then proceeded to reverse, but instead went forward and almost lost control, almost hitting a resident parked inside his truck. The suspect then reversed and drove off towards the park. The fire hydrant nearly flooded the street, according to the resident who reported the incident. If you have any information regarding this incident, please call the Eastvale Police non-emergency dispatch line at (951) 776-1099.

On June 28, officers served a search warrant on two marijuana grow houses. The first house was on the 12000 block of Mississippi Dr in Eastvale. Upon serving the search warrant, officers discovered the residence was unoccupied and had been modified for the sole purpose of cultivating and processing marijuana for sales. Officers seized 1,266 marijuana plants. Additionally, electricity was being bypassed around the meter, causing a serious fire hazard and resulting in approximately \$5,000.00 a month in stolen electricity.

The second house was on the 14400 block of Saline St in Eastvale. At 5:50 pm, the search warrant was served by officers assigned to the city of Eastvale's Special Enforcement Team. During the service of this search warrant, two subjects were detained inside the residence. Officers discovered the residence had been modified for the sole purpose of cultivating, processing and packaging marijuana, concentrated cannabis and psilocybin mushrooms for sale. Officers also located evidence that a dangerous Butane extraction process was being used to produce large quantities of concentrated cannabis. During this investigation, officers seized 278 marijuana plants, 65 pounds of processed marijuana, 50 fluid ounces of concentrated cannabis suspended in liquid, 5 ounces of concentrated cannabis, 17 ounces of psilocybin mushrooms, scales, packaging material and over \$4000.00 in U.S. currency. Both subjects were arrested and booked into jail at the Robert Pre-

sley Detention Center. They have been identified as Gabriel Roger Minkie, 29, and Jacob Aaron Minkie, 27, both of Eastvale. Both suspects were charged with conspiracy, cultivation of marijuana and psilocybin mushrooms, producing a controlled substance by chemical extraction, possession of marijuana, concentrated cannabis and psilocybin mushrooms for sale and maintaining a residence for the sales of controlled substances.


In lieu of the recent surge of marijuana grow houses, the City of Eastvale has established an aggressive zero tolerance policy towards marijuana grow houses. Due to the diligent and proactive measures of the City and

Eastvale's Special Enforcement Team (SET), many marijuana grow house operations have successfully been shut down. The City and Eastvale's Special Enforcement Team will not tolerate this illegal activity in the City and will continue to be vigilant in investigating all crimes of this nature. 

## Pastors' Corners

### Life in the Fast-Food Lane

By PASTOR ROB NORRIS

Remember the sabbath day, to keep it holy.

Exodus 20:8

When Truett Cathy opened his Dwarf House restaurant in the Atlanta suburb of Hapeville, Georgia in 1946, he made a decision never to deal with money on the Lord's Day. The Dwarf House was always closed on Sundays.

Perhaps this policy didn't seem extremely revolutionary to his post-World War II American patrons. But that small restaurant was the first franchise for Chick-fil-A®-- and by the organization's sixtieth anniversary it had multiplied into over 1,200 restaurant locations. As Chick-fil-A continues to grow, it also continues to close its operations on Sunday, traditionally one of the biggest days for food service.

Being closed on Sunday is a reflection of Truett's purpose

statement for his company. It's an investment in the spiritual lives of his employees and a witness to both the watching world and the restaurant industry. He still refers to his closed-on-Sunday policy as "the best business decision I ever made." In fact, Chick-fil-A restaurants often generate more money in six days than other comparable restaurants do in seven.

I believe that when we yield control of our lives to the Father--when we reserve our Sundays to turn from our activity to rest and to abide more fully in Him--we receive strength for daily living throughout the coming week and live under the blessing of God.

The Sabbath is God's invitation to draw near to Him. It's how He helps detoxify you from the pressures of life. It's how He restores your soul.

Perhaps it's even how He makes Chick-fil-A sandwiches taste so good on Monday.
