Beware Of Telephone Scams

Los Angeles County – Decades ago a telephone scam consisted of children prank-calling random numbers asking if they had Prince Albert in a can (better let him out!). Today's scammers are much more sophisticated and are costing you money.

According to the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department,

victims are receiving calls from a person claiming to be a deputy sheriff, public safety agency or hospital. The impersonator states that a family member has been involved in an accident or has been incarcerated and they were listed as the emergency contact. The victim is instructed to call a number beginning with *72 to get additional information or to be connected to the officer at the accident scene. When

this number is dialed, a wrong number recording will be heard. Out of concern for the loved one, this is usually followed by a call to a sheriff's station where they are told the deputy does not exist or is not on duty, and they may have been involved in a telephone scam.

The results of this scam are

Nogales Street Construction

STAFF REPORTS

Rowland Heights - The Alameda Corridor-East Construction Authority (ACE) has begun construction on the Nogales Street Grade Separation and Roadway Widening Project in the City of Industry and unincorporated community of Rowland Heights.

The project will consist of a bridge to carry trains over No-

gales Street at its current grade, an underpass for vehicular traffic, and the widening of Gale Avenue and Walnut Drive North from a single lane in each direction to two lanes in each direction. Upon completion, traffic congestion and potential collisions with trains at the crossing and locomotive horn will be eliminated.

Major construction commenced in May 2013. The first

12 months of construction will consist of the street widening of the north side of Gale Avenue/Walnut Drive North, underground utility relocations and preliminary work along Nogales Street. Afterward, Nogales Street will be closed for 24 months between Gale Avenue/Walnut Drive and

Is Anything Really Forever?

The hardest day of my life was a year ago in May. It was like every other morning with the exception that it was their anniversary. Mom and dad got up, went to brunch, went home, and then got into a little argument. My dad wanted somewhere to go to be by himself so he went to check on his rental property that was recently vacant.

I got home that night around 9 p.m. and found out my mother had called. Mom was wondering why dad wasn't home yet, but it was like him to stay at his rental property and fix things. Mom wasn't too worried, so I went to bed. A few hours later she called me again; "Your father still isn't home yet, now I'm worried." At a frantic pace, I went to his rental property and found his truck in the front of a darkened house. With a racing heart and fear to go in and find him, lying there, I called 911 for assistance.

LIFE MAKES A LEFT

I told the operator that I was afraid to enter the house by myself, I was afraid of what I might find. A sheriff deputy arrived and shined his flashlight on the front door. It was so dark at 2 am, I didn't even notice the front door wide open. We walked inside and there was my daddy, lying in the hallway, lying on his side without movement.

I remember yelling; "He isn't moving, why isn't he moving?" The officer grabbed me and dragged me outside, calmed me down, and told me to wait while he checked what on was going on.

At that point I tried to convince myself he was asleep on the floor or just passed out. I was in complete denial that he would be gone – and gone forever – until the paramedics came. They ran into the house in the hopes of helping a victim survive, but three minutes later they walked out. I wasn't sure what to do, but I knew one thing, I had to try to be responsible, I had to go home and tell my mom.

YOU NEVER KNOW WHAT TO EXPECT

When I told my brother and sisters the news of our father, I received a different reaction from each. But the strongest reaction embedded in my memory is the one from my mom. I called my sisters to help me tell mom about dad, but they lived so far away

they couldn't be there for quite some time. I knew I couldn't let my mom wait that long, she was waiting for me to bring my father home. I knocked on my neighbor's door but they couldn't hear me from their back bedroom. It was at that time I realized that no one was around and I was going to have to do this on my own, so be it.

It wasn't the screaming or the crying that affected me so much; it was what my mother said. She was angry because she and my father had promised each other they'd leave this earth together. They made a pact. They had a deal. She was angry because he broke that pact. The deal was off. At that point I admired how strong their love was; I admired how much they really loved each other. So much so, they not only discussed how they'd be together, but how they'd leave together as well. I never knew this, and it saddens me that I had to find out about it this way. I guess sometimes regardless of what this life gives you, and regardless of how much you think you know, you find out that you never know what to expect.

A FIRST FOR EVERYTHING

Whoever said, "the hardest time after a death is the first year" was right. It's been interesting and difficult. Death really does something to people; it really makes them change. You hear things you never thought you'd hear; you see things you never thought you'd see. That first Thanksgiving, that first Christmas. The first time one of your parents isn't at your son's sixth grade graduation or your daughter's recital. Your kid's birthday parties, your son's little league games. You sit there enjoying yourself and then sense that something missing. The first time I felt stressed and dad wasn't there to tell me; "it'll all work out ok," was my hardest. Dad wasn't kidding when he told me; "there's a first for everything."

YOU NEVER KNOW

If there was one thing I've really had to push into my life is to enjoy it. If one of my children gets out of line or has done something wrong, I talk about it. I don't scream and yell, and I don't smack them. I never send them to bed on a bad note, and whenever I leave, I always give them a hug and a kiss (something my 12-year-old son tries to avoid, but I force it on him). I

do this because my father and I had the worst relationship in the world. And then one day, for a reason only God may know, I confronted him with my feelings. We really opened up, laid it all on the table, and enjoyed ourselves. It took time for us to heal, but we worked on it, and in the end I had the fortunate opportunity to have a close and loving relationship with my dad. It was the fastest five years of my life.

We had fun, forgave each other, and told each other we loved each other. I am very fortunate to be able to say that I don't have any regrets about our friendship. I always wanted more from life but he always told me to "stop striving for bigger toys and invest yourself in love, because you never know, son, you just never know."

SOME THINGS ARE FOREVER

There's something about seeing your parents in enormous grief that does something to a person. They're your safety net in life, they're the one thing you can bet your life on who'll always take you back if you failed out there in the world. They're the ones that you knew would love you forever, regardless of what you've done or where you've been. When that gets destroyed or damaged, you come to the realization that you're definitely, and I mean definitely, on your own. Life becomes this big "do

or die" situation. Ready or not it's time to grow up. You get kind of nervous that the encouraging source in your life is gone. The wisdom they provided turns into a distant whisper.

It's kind of like when you were in school; you'd walk into the class and find you were having a pop quiz. You felt this panic overwhelm you, and you'd try your hardest to remember what the teacher told you the day before. You had no warning, no time to prepare, the test is here and it's now. You never anticipated this coming; it never even entered your mind. All you can do now is hope you were paying attention all that time, all you could do was hope you were a good student. Teacher's not going to give you any answers today; you are on your own.

A day will then come, when life tests you and your ability. After you feel confident you've passed that test you realize an important reality: just like the love you never knew that your parents shared, some things really are forever.

Originally published in August of 1998, this is the very first "Our Life" ever printed in The Weekly News, and the reason why we started this newspaper. It was after writing this story that I decided how short life was, and how important it is to do what you believe in. This story helped me realize what we believe in. More San Gabriel Valley Dead Birds Test Positive for West Nile Virus:

SGV -Three more dead birds were found in the cities of Arcadia and Covina this month. All three birds tested

positive for the West Nile virus. Mosquitoes in the area have been tested for the virus, but so far none

have tested positive. The San Gabriel Valley Vector Control

District recommends that residents take

precautions to avoid mosquitoes. First and foremost, do not let standing water accumulate and report

all "green" out of service pools or other areas of standing water to the District. To avoid bites, avoid

outdoor activity in the early mornings and for 2 hours after dusk, when mosquitoes are most active.

squirrels, report them to the WNV hotline at (877) WNV-BIRD. For more

Creekside Drive in the City of Walnut to be Renovated

The project was delayed initially to allow Charter Communications time to move some of their existing equipment below the level of excavation needed for the project.

for."

Some have tried the same concept and have changed back to free online subscriptions; case in point: the LA Times. At one point you could not read the entire story without subscribing

The philosophy? If the news is free, then the readers will

come across the advertising and possibly subscribe.

"If I find a website interesting, I'll subscribe to the printed material," said Dan Radillo, a now subscriber to the Times. "I kept finding interesting information, so I subscribed. The free stuff hooked me in."

The OC Register's phone app

also makes reference to the investment they're making.

"In the past several months, we've made numerous exciting investments to create even more value for our readers. ... (we've) more than doubled our local news by hiring more than

100 journalists," the phone app reads, without allowing access to content.

that *72 automatically forwards all of your calls to the scammer's phone number (if you have Call Forwarding), providing the victim's number for billing, which can include collect calls, forwarding charges for each call,

and long distance charges. Jail inmates are using this scam to make additional collect calls to the number you were told to dial; once their contact accepts the charges, the bill goes to the victim. This scam may not be realized until the victim notices their phone no longer rings, or they receive a bill with unex-

pected charges.

Verizon.com says that another scam regarding Jury Duty has also been happening. Individuals impersonating U.S. Court employees have been making calls asking victims to verify names, social security and credit card numbers. If denied, scammers are threatening victims with fines and prosecution for failure to comply. Federal courts will

never require anyone to provide sensitive information in a telephone call. Most information is provided via U.S. Mail.

Protect your identity! Never activate call forwarding unless it is for your own personal use. Never provide social security or other sensitive information over the phone unless you have initiated the call and know who you are speaking to. *73 usually turns

off call forwarding, however you should contact your wireless or telephone service provider for specific instructions on proper use of call forwarding services. If you believe you have been involved in this crime, Call the California Public Utilities Commission hotline at 800-649-7570, and contact your local sheriff's department. San Jose Avenue. Local access will be maintained using Charlie Road to San Jose Avenue or to Gale Avenue. Vehicle and pedestrian traffic should use Fullerton Road and Fairway Drive as major north-south detour routes. Noise, dust and vibration will be monitored for compliance within applicable limits.

In addition, ACE will install a new storm drain line on Nogales Street and San Jose Avenue as part of the Nogales Street Grade Separation Project. The infrastructure improvements will allow for better drainage in the surrounding area. The new storm drain line will run west on San Jose Avenue beginning approximately 350 feet east of Nogales Street and approximately 600 feet north on Nogales Street into the San Jose Creek. Traffic lanes will be temporarily and partially closed along northbound Nogales Street and westbound San Jose Avenue.

Northbound traffic on Nogales Street and westbound traffic on San Jose Avenue will be maintained and southbound traffic on

Nogales Street and eastbound traffic on San Jose Avenue will not be affected. However, right turns from San Jose Avenue onto Nogales Street will be temporarily prohibited when work is located at the northeast corner of the intersection but access to local businesses will be maintained. Plates will also be placed over the open trench at the end of the work shift to permit roadway access. Motorists and pedestrians are urged to exercise caution while in the

vicinity of the work area. Nogales Street is expected to be closed for construction in summer 2014 for 24 months after a detour route with temporary rail crossing is built to allow local north-south traffic to reconnect with Nogales Street. Most work will take place on weekdays between 7 a.m. and 5 p.m. Construction is anticipated to be complete in summer 2016. wheels to a screeching halt.

Traffic congestion is part of life in all metropolitan areas and Riverside County is not exempt. USA Today recently reported that the average American wasted an average of 42 hours each year just sitting in traffic. The fact is, the 91 Freeway, most specifically the eastbound route between Anaheim and Corona is among the worst 15 areas in the U.S. Those of you regularly

enjoying this commute can attest to this. Nearly 280,000 vehicles utilize this segment on a daily basis. This number is projected to double in size by 2035.

There is relief coming via the 91 Project. According to their website, the Riverside County Transportation Commission (RCTC) will provide additional tolled express lanes, regular lanes, connectors, and improved interchanges, bridges, ramps and local streets. All of these improvements will help to relieve congestion, allow for

quicker emergency response, and improve travel for motorists accessing this route.

The 91 Project is RCTC's number one priority, helping to save time, enhance safety and access, promote ridesharing and pollution reduction, and provide jobs. The website also states, "The project will employ a design-build approach to save three to four years of construction time, build upon the successful Express Lane system in Orange County, and reinvest revenues along the 91".

Construction of the 91 Project will begin in 2014, however,

while we eagerly anticipate its completion, the City of Eastvale reminds us that pre-construction will begin presently. Construction crews will be conducting surveys on the 91 and 15 freeways during off-peak hours with temporary lane closures possible. Please remember to use extreme caution and

extend safety courtesy to these crews by slowing down, safely changing lanes away from construction, allowing extra time for travel, and avoiding the use of any mobile devices (or other distractions) while driving.


