WCPD Chief Wills Retires

West Covina – June marked the end of an era in local law enforcement as one of the longest-serving police chiefs in Southern California retired.

Frank Wills, who had helmed the West Covina Police Department for more than fourteen years, announced his retirement last month.

A 1978 graduate of the Rio Hondo Police Academy, Wills

spent fifteen years as a member of the Pasadena Police Department before being appointed Chief of Police for the City of San Marino. He was sworn in as the West Covina Police Department's tenth chief in November, 1998.

Wills implemented a number of successful programs during his tenure in West Covina,

Tree Vandalism Prevention In Walnut

Walnut – You don't have to be a tree-hugger to agree that trees are beautiful and have a very positive impact on the environment. Trees not only clean the air and provide oxygen, but they help to cool city streets, conserve energy and save water.

Trees can also help nurture us by providing food and a habitat for wildlife.

The City of Walnut obviously agrees with these sentiments and is doing everything it can to protect the trees in its public areas from vandalism by introducing Public Tree Ordinance No. 13-03 and a corresponding City

Tree Policy Manual, which would be the official guidelines for the maintenance, preservation and protection of Walnut's city-owned trees. The City Council Meeting, held on June 26, included the recommendation to adopt the

Lanes Will Close On 60 Freeway

Rowland Heights – Three lanes of the 60 freeway will be closed on four weekends in July and August due to construction.

Caltrans have recently issued a press release stating that the Pomona freeway (SR-60) will be closed periodically for pave-

ment rehabilitation work between Fullerton Rd. and Nogales St. The "55 Hour Weekend Lane Closure" as Caltrans are calling it, states that on the weekends of July 12, July 26, August 9, and August 23, up to three lanes will be closed for maintenance.

The roads will be under construction due to the heavy weight

of cars and trucks over time, requiring a more than two feet deep replacement of pavement and concrete base. Caltrans say the new surface will provide a smooth, safer drive for motorists, reduce time required for

Plume Cleanup: Is The Water Safe?

The Archibald Trichloroethylene Plume located in the City of Ontario and south of the Ontario International Airport is believed to be moving in a southerly direction towards the wells pumped by the Chino Desalter Authority. This desalter is a water source for Chino Hills, Chino, Norco, Eastvale, Ontario, Jurupa Valley

and the Western Municipal Water District. Residents fear that the contamination from Trichloroethylene, TCE, will reach their water supply and contaminate the water. TCE, is an industrial degreaser and solvent used to remove grease from fabricated metal parts and in the production of some textiles.

According to the EPA website, "Trichloroethylene, is a volatile

organic chemical, a colorless or blue liquid with a chloroform-like odor." The Safe Drinking Act of 1974, requires the EPA to measure the level of contaminants in drinking water at which no adverse health effects are likely to occur. The measurement in which they base the maximum

Natural Gas Transmission Pipeline Safety

SGV— The Southern California Gas Company (SoCalGas) is the nation's largest natural gas distribution utility, serving nearly 21 million people in Southern and Central California. Natural gas is delivered through pipelines to residential consumers for cooking and heating, and to commercial customers for product manufacturing and electricity. SoCalGas monitors the gas for quality and adds a distinctive odor to help make it easy to detect leaks.

In an effort to put safety first, SoCalGas recently sent a mailing to all residents living near major pipelines. Enclosed was a letter and brochure providing education on recognizing leaks, precautions for digging near underground utilities, and what to do if you if you detect a leak.

Most pipelines are buried underground, and there are markers to indicate locations near you. Markers do not indicate the depths or number of pipelines, so it is critical to take precautions before digging for landscaping, construction or other excavations. Only use hand tools within 24 inches of any marker. Mark your planned area for digging and call the Underground Service Alert at 811, 6:00 a.m. to 7:00 pm. Monday through Friday, a minimum of two days before you begin digging in

order receive proper instruction. This is a free service to help keep you safe.

Leaking gas can cause fires, explosions, property damage and serious injury. To recognize a leak, look for any damaged connection to a gas appliance, dirt or water being blown in the air, dead or dying vegetation near a marked pipeline, or an exposed pipeline after any natural disaster. Listen for hissing, whistling or roaring sounds near a marker or gas appliance. And, natural gas has a very distinctive odor, which

you may have noticed if you've ever turned on a gas stove burner when the pilot didn't ignite.

SoCalGas is intent on providing safe and reliable service, and they routinely perform pipeline inspections, testing and repairs. If you suspect a gas leak or pipeline damage, evacuate the area and call 1 (800) 427-2200 from a safe location, or call 911. Remember that no damage is too small to report. 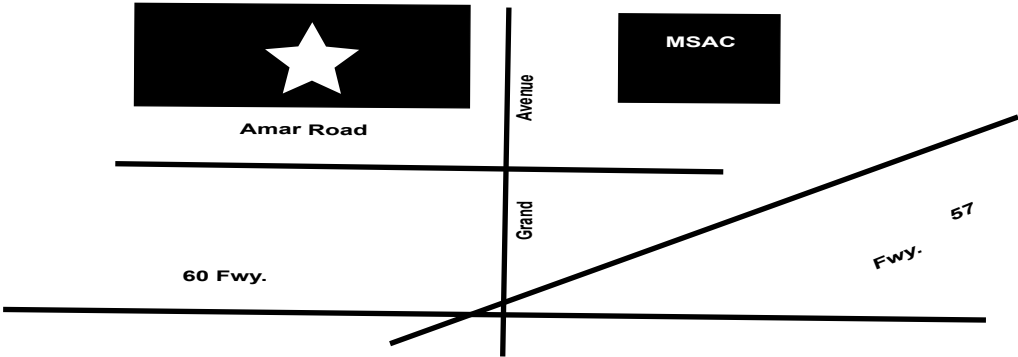

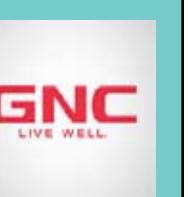

Crime Recap

STAFF REPORTS

This week for crime includes an update on a Walnut woman who stabbed her husband, a freeway crash, and multiple arrests and citations issued in a motorcycle sting.

On June 26, Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department conducted a crackdown on motorcyclists

Deputies from the Risk Man-

agement Bureau's Traffic Services detail conducted the Motorcycle Safety Enforcement Operation. Officers stopped 35 riders in total. Of those 35, 25 of them were issued citations for various violations, two were arrested for unlicensed driving, and another was arrested for a suspended license. Officers also impounded two motorcycles for 30 days, and stored another for one day, according to authorities.

The purpose for the opera-

tion was to reduce the number of deaths and injuries in traffic collisions, according to a press release.

"Extra deputies were on duty patrolling areas frequented by motorcyclists and where motorcycle crashes occur," officials said in the press release. "Deputies were looking for drivers and riders who are under the influence of drugs or alcohol and cracking down on traffic violations made by motorcyclists, as well as other vehicle drivers, that

could lead to motorcycle collisions, injuries, and fatalities."

On June 27, two motorists were injured in a multiple-vehicle collision involving at least one big rig on the eastbound Pomona Freeway in Hacienda Heights. Both motorists were taken to the local hospital however their injuries were not immediately released.

On the same day, a woman accused of fatally stabbing her estranged husband back in October of 2011 pleads not

guilty. The defendant, Socorro Mora was arrested Oct. 19, 2011 and charged with murdering her estranged husband, George Mora, at his Brookside Court home in Walnut.

The father of four was found dead from multiple stab wounds minutes after Socorro Mora called the Los Angeles Sheriff's Department to report a domestic disturbance at the home. She will reappear in court on Aug 14 for a pretrial conference and trial setting.

Senate Education Committee Passes AB308

Sacramento—Assemblyman Curt Hagman (R-Chino Hills), Assembly District 55, recently had success with the unanimous passing of AB308 with a 9-0 vote by the Senate Education

Committee.

According to a June 19 Press Release, Assembly Bill 308 would authorize the State Allocation Board to establish a program requiring school districts, charter schools, and county offices of education that sell real prop-

erty initially purchased with state funds, to return the state's portion in specified instances.

Assemblyman Hagman said that "AB308 encourages sustainability of state funds and greater spending efficiencies. This bill ensures that money allocated

from the state goes to the purpose funded, while creating more opportunity for educational institutions.

In order to keep facility funds for actual facility use, this measure will discourage districts selling or renting properties pur-

chased, constructed or improved with state funds from using the proceeds for general fund purposes.

Water Safety Equals Summer Fun

SGV — With high temperatures, swimming is definitely one of the most popular summer activities. It's a wonderful way to cool off and a lot of fun if you stay safe.

You've heard the saying, "Children drown without a sound". In fact, it takes only a few seconds for a life to be lost. Children drowning in backyard pools and spas were often thought to be somewhere else in the home.

Drowning is one of the nation's leading causes of ac-

cidental death. According to the County of Los Angeles Fire Department, there is an average of 120 drowning incidents in Los Angeles County each year alone. That is exactly 120 too many. With an ounce of prevention, we can all help to reduce that number dramatically.

To help keep your summer fun and everyone safe near the water, remember these simple rules from the American Red Cross:

- Never take your eyes off a child in or around water, even

for a second. This includes everything from the bathtub to the ocean (even buckets and toilets can be a source of drowning).

- Allow children to swim only when a responsible adult is present.

- If a child is missing, check all water sources first. Seconds count!

- Keep toys and other tempting items out of pools and spas when not in use.

- Keep doors and gates to pools and water areas locked when not in use.

- Teach your children to

swim and learn water safety as soon as possible. There are local classes available for all ages, from infants to seniors.

- Never swim alone; always have a buddy with you.

- Use U.S. Coast Guard-approved life jackets when boating or near natural bodies of water (or anywhere appropriate).

- Establish water safety rules for your family and enforce them without fail. All family members can contribute to safety in some manner just by following

the rules, knowing how to dial 911, or even learning CPR.

- Avoid alcohol use when swimming, boating (or other water activities), and especially when supervising others in and around the water.

ordinance on its agenda.

According to the City Council Report of June 26, 2013 regarding Ordinance 13-03, Walnut Deputy Director of Community Services, Hector Kistemann, recommended that the City Council adopt the Public Tree Ordinance and approve the City Tree Policy Manual. At a City Council Study Session held on April 24, staff had reported that public trees had been vandalized by severe pruning, trimming or removal by residents or contractors not employed by the city. Trees have also been planted on public right of ways without city authorization.

Already in place is Ordinance 03-05 intended to preserve

Walnut's heritage trees, the Oaks and Black Walnuts native to the area. The new ordinance would join No. 03-05 in helping to protect all trees, regardless of their species.

The City Council Report also noted that Ordinance 13-03 would assist Walnut in applying

to be recognized as "Tree City USA", which would allow for future grant funding opportunities.

Help the City of Walnut protect and maintain the beauty of its trees by obtaining a Tree Report and a Tree Permit prior to conducting any maintenance.

"We are fortunate to have a staff dedicated to ensuring our

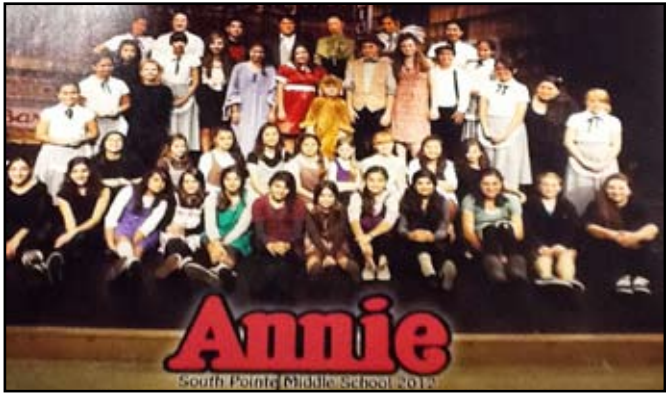

maintenance and minimize the need for further lane closures. Work is expected to be complete in late 2014.

During the following weekends, Caltrans will replace the No. 3 and No. 4 lanes of the westbound SR-60 freeway between the Fullerton Rd. and Nogales St. exits. These weekend closures include:

From Fri., July 12 at 10 p.m. to Mon., July 15 at 5 a.m., three

lanes of the westbound SR-60 will be closed; northbound SR-57 to westbound SR-60 connector will be closed; and the following on-ramps: Brea Canyon Rd., Fairway Dr., Nogales St., and Fullerton Rd. will also be closed. At midnight on Friday, only the car-pool lane will be open to all vehicles. Some lanes will reopen at 10 p.m. on Saturday and all lanes will reopen at 5 a.m. on Monday.

From Fri., July 26 at 10 am to Mon., July 29 at 5 a.m., two lanes of the westbound SR-60 will be

closed and the northbound SR-57 to westbound SR-60 connector road will be closed. The same on-ramps will be also closed: Brea Canyon Rd., Fairway Dr., Nogales St., and Fullerton Rd. From midnight on Friday until 5 a.m. on Saturday, all westbound lanes will be closed. Some lanes will reopen on Saturday, but all lanes will be closed again at midnight on Sunday until Monday at 5 a.m.

During the following weekends, Caltrans will replace the No. 3 and No. 4 eastbound

SR-60 lanes between the same two exits. These weekends include:

From Fri., Aug. 9 at 10 p.m. to Mon., Aug. 12 at 5 a.m., three lanes of the eastbound 60 will be closed and the following on-ramps will be closed: Hacienda Blvd., Azusa Ave., Fullerton Rd., and south Nogales St. The following off-ramps will also be closed: Fullerton Rd. and Nogales St.

From Fri., Aug. 23 at 10 p.m. to Mon., Aug. 26 at 5 a.m., the same on-ramps will be closed: Hacienda Boulevard, Azusa Ave., Fullerton Rd., and south Nogales

St. and the same off-ramps will also be closed: Fullerton Rd. and Nogales St. However, the SR-57 and SR-60 connector will remain open.

Caltrans recommend planning a different route using their map app at quickmap.dot.ca.gov/. If you know you will be traveling on the 60 freeway during the construction, Caltrans encourage you to bring water, snacks, medications, and entertainment for children because the delay is expected to be long.

contaminant level goal is called MCLG and the MCLG for trichloroethylene is zero. Contaminants are any physical, chemical, biological or radiological substances or matter in the water. Trichloro-

ethylene is known to cause cancer and due to its toxicity it fell out of use over 20 years ago.

In an effort to avoid contamination and to solve the problem before it gets to these areas, Chino Desalter Authority, Jurupa Community Services District,

Ontario, Upland, Western Municipal Water District and Inland Empire Utilities have agreed to work together to clean up the contamination before it becomes a problem. The Jurupa District Board of Directors approved the agreement, called a memo-

randum of understanding, on May 13th. The agreement will hopefully allow the agencies to work together to solve the problem instead of wasting time and money in litigation. The water quality control board issued draft cleanup and abatement orders

and the agencies will have to develop a clean-up strategy to apply for state and federal funding to pay for the work.

We will report on this story as it continues to develop and as more information becomes available.

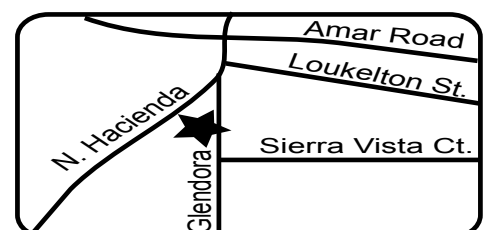

DEAR DR. AKIYOSHI,

In the past few years, my weight has gone out of control! I need help! My husband makes it really hard for me to resist when he brings snacks to bed when we watch TV at night. He brings pie, ice cream, popcorn, nuts, and even cocktails. I admit I have always loved this snack time, but I told him I am trying to lose weight. He sees me exercising and walking 4 days a week! He has a normal weight and eats everything! I feel like he is sabotaging me. I struggle to stay on my diet even when I'm cooking meals for my family. I do have some will power, but I need his cooperation so it's not so hard. How can I get through to him?



I really feel for you. Excess weight is one of the hardest issues to deal with. In all of my years as a Naturopathic Doctor, I have found that getting a patient to change their eating habits is a very hard thing to do. Popular theory is the calories in...calories out concept. Obviously this is failing for many people. Different bodies gain weight for different reasons, and in different ways. I know a woman who ate 800 calories a day for 2 weeks eating only rice cakes and peanut butter. Her scale didn't budge. Her body couldn't manage the carbohydrates would be my guess. I know people who eat three times the amount of food I eat on a continual basis and they don't have an extra pound on their bodies, and it's not because they're involved in vigorous exercise. I am not fortunate in this way

either, so I truly do understand your struggle.

However... It is a mistake to blame your husband for your situation or for your discomfort when he eats things in front of you that are not on your eating plan. He has the right to his own choices, even when they seem insensitive to you. You have a right to your choices as well. So let's take a look at you taking a little personal responsibility for achieving your goal. It seems to me that doing the family cooking is working against your health and weight goals, so perhaps your husband can take that over for you. You wouldn't ask him to make the cocktails at a party if he were trying to cut back or quit drinking, right? You would be supportive and allow him to keep some distance until he became stable and accomplished what he set out to do. As for the late night snacking in front of

the TV, I think it would be a better idea if you spent your time doing something else until he is finished with his snack fest. Maybe read, or watch TV in a different room or step out for a bit. I'm sure you enjoy spending time with your husband, but for now, adjustments need to be made. It's not a good idea to ignore this situation, as it won't be long before you become resentful. Or perhaps he will, if he is forced to change his eating habits to suit your needs.

Sacrifice yourself, or save yourself. The choice is clear. People with certain personality types often make choices that don't serve them well personally, and or physically, in order to do what they think is best for the whole family. I hope you will try to balance this out as you work on your physical well being. Body weight issues are very complex, and can be addressed in a variety of ways. I wish you

well in finding the path that feels right for you, and I hope you work out a plan to be true to yourself and your needs.

Lessons From A Plumber

Recently, my son and I were trying to repair a plumbing problem at his condo. Something had clogged one of the water pipes restricting the flow of water into his shower.



After putting up with a trickle of water for months, we finally got up the courage to do something about it. Most problems don't fix themselves; you either call a professional or you get out your own tool box and take action.

We got out our tools and cut a hole in the dry wall in a closet behind the shower because it was the only way we could access the shower diverter. There is a scene in the movie Untouchables where Sean Connery says to Kevin Costner, "Are you prepared to go through that door? If we go through that door, there is no turning back."

We turned off the water supply to the condo and cut the water pipes around the shower fixture. Now, there was no turning back. We were committed until the job was completed!

Taking things apart is only half the battle. Once we cut all the connecting pipes, we had to go out and purchase a new diverter and the various copper elbows, pipes and connectors to put it back together.

Home repair projects usually take twice as long and cost twice as much as you expect. I have learned that most projects require at least three trips to Home Depot – often a lot more! Pretty soon the store employees become your personal friends and your wallet shrinks in size.

The most difficult step is putting things back together. This is especially true of plumbing because the water pressure can result in drips and leaks.

This step did not go so well. We tried to reassemble the pipes with a propane torch while trying not to burn down the condo. We slowly tightened the fittings and let the pipes cool.

Finally, it was the moment of truth. We turned on the water and sure enough there were

several drips and leaks. It was so frustrating to have spent so much time and money on a project that didn't go as planned. Home repair projects usually don't go very well so we must not expect success on the first try.

When in doubt, call a plumber! That is what we did. When the plumber was done, the pipes no longer leaked and the shower worked like a charm!

Before you start your next home repair project, you may want to call the expert first!

one felony count of possession of materials with intent to make an explosive, one felony count of possession of a zip gun, one misdemeanor count of possession of illegal fireworks, with a sentencing enhancement for possessing 28.5 grams or more of methamphetamine with intent to sell. If convicted, he faces a

maximum sentence of six years and four months in state prison. The People will request Parr be held on \$500,000 bail and he is expected to be arraigned at the West Justice Center, Westminster.

At approximately 4:35 p.m. on April 2, 2013, Parr is accused of causing an explosion and subsequent fire in his garage. Westminster Police Department (WPD) and Huntington Beach

Fire Department were called to Parr's home after receiving reports of a loud explosion and fire at the residence.

Parr is accused of possessing various chemicals, powders, and other items that are dangerous and highly explosive, including rolls of fuse, specialized containers, homemade mortars, and a tumbler used to refine the powders to make them more explosive. Parr is also accused of possessing a zip gun and illegal

fireworks.

Parr is accused of storing these items on the workbench area of his garage where the fire occurred. Orange County Fire Authority arson investigators and the Orange County Sheriff's Department bomb squad were called to the defendant's residence to assist in the investigation.

The defendant is also accused of possessing packaging materials and a small digital scale along

with approximately 33 grams of methamphetamine separated into plastic bags. Parr is accused of possessing a loaded shotgun near the methamphetamine.

The defendant suffered severe burns to his face and head and was hospitalized for these injuries. Parr was arrested today, June 26, 2013, by WPD.

Deputy District Attorney Andrew Katz of the Special Prosecutions Unit is prosecuting this case.
