New Call-Back Program At Eastvale Schools

CITY OF EASTVALE

Eastvale - On Monday, August 5, 2013, Corona Norco Unified School District (CNUSD) began Phase I of a two phase call back program for students who have been placed in "over-

load" schools in the past years.

Phase I will begin with approximately 115 children returning to their home school, Clara Barton Elementary, and 29 children returning to their home school, Rosa Parks Elementary, who had previously had been attending

"overload" schools such as VanderMolen Elementary, Harada Elementary and schools in the City of Norco.

Ordinance Cracks Down On Drug Houses

Eastvale - The City of Eastvale and the Eastvale Police have issued two new ordinances to help crack down on the recent surge of drug houses in our neighborhoods. The first ordinance is Eastvale's aggressive Zero Tolerance Policy. The

Riverside County Sheriff and City staff have been diligently working together to promptly identify and immediately shut down grow houses in Eastvale. In an ongoing effort to combat this issue, the City will be using existing laws such as the "Drug Abatement Law" under the State of California Health and Safety Code. Ad-

ditional aggressive measures include working directly with key staff at Southern California Edison (SCE) to identify houses that are suspected of bypassing the SCE electrical meter, implementing a rental

91 Project - Fast Forward

Riverside County – It used to be, a long time ago, that there was freeway traffic congestion in the morning going to work, and in the evening coming home. Nowadays, it seems like there is rush hour traffic seven days a week and you have to allow extra travel time to get anywhere, at any time. Even when you expect the freeways to be bare in the wee hours of the morning, construction can bring your wheels to a screeching halt.

Traffic congestion is part of life in all metropolitan areas

and Riverside County is not exempt. USA Today recently reported that the average American wasted an average of 42 hours each year just sitting in traffic. The fact is, the 91 Freeway, most specifically the eastbound route between Anaheim and Corona is among the worst 15 areas in the U.S. Those of you regularly enjoying this commute can attest to this. Nearly 280,000 vehicles utilize this segment on a daily basis. This number is projected to double in size by 2035.

There is relief coming via the 91 Project. According to their website, the Riverside County

Transportation Commission (RCTC) will provide additional tolled express lanes, regular lanes, connectors, and improved interchanges, bridges, ramps and local streets. All of these improvements will help to relieve congestion, allow for quicker emergency response, and improve travel for motorists accessing this route.

The 91 Project is RCTC's number one priority, helping to save time, enhance safety and access, promote ride-sharing and pollution reduction, and provide jobs. The website also states, "The project will employ a design-build approach to save three

to four years of construction time, build upon the successful Express Lane system in Orange County, and reinvest revenues along the 91."

Construction of the 91 Project will begin in 2014, however, while we eagerly anticipate its completion, the City of Eastvale reminds us that pre-construction will begin presently. Construction crews will be conducting surveys on the 91 and 15 freeways during

off-peak hours with temporary lane closures possible. Please remember to use extreme caution and extend safety courtesy to these crews by slowing down, safely changing lanes away from construction, allowing extra time for travel, and avoiding the use of any mobile devices (or other distractions) while driving.



Local Resident Defies Odds And Wakes Up After Six Years In A Coma

Corona - July 17, 2006 is a day that will live in Diane Ward's heart for the rest of her life. At 9:30am she received a call informing her that her brother, Charles Wolcott, "Charlie", had been killed in a pedestrian vs. vehicle accident. On the drive to Riverside Community Hospital she hoped and prayed that somehow a miracle would happen that would save her brother. "I just looked at the picture of us that I had with me and prayed and prayed," Diane recalls as she tries to explain what awaited her at the hospital. Instead of finding her brother deceased, she found him barely hanging on to life. Charlie would spend the next six years of his life in a coma, fighting his way back to his friends and family. His mother,

sister and family were close by his side the entire time, either physically or via phone, and they refused to give up on him. After a few years, he started to slowly emerge from his coma, achieving small goals to some, but monumental goals considering where he came from. Charlie is now able to mouth words and enjoys visiting with his family and friends. His awakening after a six year coma was a dream come true to Diane, who describes him as, "...a kind and good man; a real good guy that would give you the shirt off his back". Now seven years later, Charlie is able to celebrate the anniversary of this life-altering event by helping to raise awareness about pedestrian-related accidents. For the last few years the City of Corona has been conducting sting operations to help pedestrians learn how to cross safely and to inform motorists to pay attention to crosswalks and pedestrians. On July 10th, the Corona Police Department's Traffic Bureau conducted a Pedestrian Safety Mobilization during business hours in the downtown area of the city. This mobilization was an early kick-off to the City's Pedestrian Safety Awareness Month, which will be celebrated during the month of August. The City of Corona's official press release states that: "One of the most dangerous situations for pedestrians occurs when a vehicle is stopped for a pedestrian crossing the street and another vehicle approaches from the rear and overtakes the stopped vehicle." This is exactly what happened to Charlie Wolcott, an accident that forever changed his life. Although pedestrians are re-

quired by law to yield the right-of-way to vehicles on a roadway that are close enough to be a hazard, motorists are required to yield the right-of-way to a pedestrian crossing the street within any crosswalk. Pay attention, be aware of the people around you, and take care to find out why a vehicle is stopped before trying to go around it and cross the intersection. A small moment of investigation just might save a life.

Carrots And Tomatoes: A Love Story At Amy's Farm

Ontario – I love my drive to and from work. It's an easy jaunt from Archibald, and then west on Edison toward Chino. The streets are lined with farm after farm, peppered with horses, cows and crops – I'm interested in all of them. On one such trip, I decided to take a small detour south on Bon View to Eucalyptus and visit Amy's Farm. I remembered it from my grandson's amazing tales from a school fieldtrip and a subsequent visit to buy organic produce.

Upon arrival, I caught site of Amy, and asked her if I might write about her farm. She referred me to her father, "The visionary", Randy Bekendam. Randy graciously allowed me to take up his time, and educated me on the principles of organic farming. While we spoke, he prepared red onions, just a short time out of the ground, and the aroma coming from them was intoxicating. My mind was spinning with ideas on how to chef them into a culinary masterpiece. I can't remember red onions ever smelling like this in the supermarket.

Randy's soft-spoken intelligence as he tells me about his farm suggests a lifetime as a vegetable farmer, but he is only five years into this passion.

Like his father and grandfather before him, he was a dairyman. "Six years ago I knew none of this, which is a testimony to how simple it is," he says of organic farming.

Amy's is an organic farm, but they are not "Certified Organic" by choice. The USDA does deem some chemicals as safe. Randy chooses not to use any chemicals for his crops. "All you need is seed, water and natural fertilizer," he says.

"You build your soil. The healthier the soil, the healthier the produce will be. I don't want to kill any of the microbes in the soil. When a plant is stressed due to unhealthy soil, its taste changes. Bugs are opportunists; they will attack a weak plant like a wolf circling a weak animal," Randy teaches me. He likens the health of the farm to the abilities our bodies have to build resistance. He says, "There are no bad bugs or weeds, they all provide a balance. The bio-diversity of everything coming together in nature is what creates a successful farm. You plant seasonally with as much diversity as possible and let nature take its course." Pairing that with crop rotation and companion planting, it all works in concert. Did you know that carrots love tomatoes? Together they attract and deflect just the right balance of bugs and weeds

in order to thrive. Who knew?

On the farm you will find the circle of life. The soil is fed by the fertilizer produced from the animals; they, in turn, are fed produce grown from the soil which they helped to produce. I made the slight faux pas of walking over to say hello to a nearby goat. Within seconds every goat and sheep in the pen came at a run toward me. "Animals love me," I'm thinking. "They think you have food for them," says Randy. Whatever. Randy allows me to feed them the clippings from the red onions he has been preparing, and as I do so I can see that every animal is clear-eyed, beautifully coated and healthy. The circle of life is obviously working well as these animals make the onions disappear in seconds.

Come to Amy's Farm and taste your fruits and vegetables the way God intended. Randy says, "Very few know what that taste is like. Healthy eating is like preventative medicine for our bodies." Supermarket crops are often picked long before their peak and allowed to ripen in transit – frequently thousands of miles away. I can just see the nutrients escaping along the way; that fresh smell dissipating.

As I shook Randy's hand in gratitude and farewell, it had the strength of a man at one with the soil around him. You can tell he loves what he does every day. I walked away enlightened and encouraged to eat closer to nature...and to return to Amy's Farm in the very near future.

Visiting Amy's Farm is a time-worthy event. Through a family outing or a school field trip, learning how food gets from farm to table can provide a whole new opportunity to get children to eat their vegetables. A carrot is more appetizing when you pull it from the ground; a pea is more appealing in its pod with its siblings. A tomato is more tantalizing with fresh mozzarella, basil and balsamic vinegar...but I digress.

Amy's is also a great place to volunteer. Their volunteer program allows them to do what they do. Just show up some morning at 9:00 a.m. and

you can learn first-hand about farming. There is a sense of pride that comes from nurturing something from seed to feed.

As Randy says, "If the gate is open, come on in."

3 Common Estate Planning Mistakes To Avoid

Eastvale - From time to time, it's good to review why having a complete, up-to-date estate plan is so important. In addition to confirming our own actions, it can provide us with valuable information to pass along to friends and family who, for whatever reasons, have yet to act. So, here are three common estate planning mistakes to avoid, provided by Charlene L. Usher, Esq.

1. Not having a plan. Every state has laws for distributing the property of someone who

dies without an estate plan—but not very many people would be pleased with the results. State laws vary, but generally they leave a percentage of the deceased's assets to family members. (Non-family members, like an unmarried partner, will not receive any assets.) It is common for the surviving spouse and children to each receive a share, which often means the surviving spouse will not have enough money to live on. If the children are minors, the court will control their inheritances until they reach

legal age (usually 18), at which time they will receive the full amount. (Most parents prefer their children inherit later, when they are more mature.)

2. Not naming a guardian for minor children. A guardian for minor children can only be named through a will. If the parents have not done this, and both die before the children reach legal age, the court will have to name someone to raise them without knowing whom the parents would have chosen.

3. Relying on joint ownership. Many older people add an adult

child to the title of their assets (especially their home), often to avoid probate. But this can create all kinds of problems. When you add a co-owner, you lose control. Jointly-owned assets are now exposed to the co-owner's creditors, divorce proceedings and possible misuse of the assets, and the co-owner must agree to all business transactions. There could be gift and/or income tax issues. And if you have more than one child but only name one to be co-owner with you, fluctuating values could cause your children to

receive unbalanced/unintended inheritances.



Crime recap

Grow House was shut down after police obtained new information in their ongoing investigation of grow houses in the City of Eastvale. Officers obtained a search warrant for the residence located in the 14000 block of Ithica Drive. Upon serving the warrant, two suspects were arrested. The residence had been modified for the sole purpose of cultivating, processing, and packaging marijuana. Officers also discovered that a dangerous butane extraction process was being used to produce large quantities of concentrated cannabis. During this investigation, officers seized 149 marijuana plants, 17 pounds of processed marijuana, 30.5 ounces of concentrated cannabis, and packaging material. One of the suspects arrested was booked into jail at the Robert Presley Detention Center. He has been identified as Joseph Lim, 34-year-old resident of Eastvale. Lim is being charged with conspiracy and cultivation of marijuana, producing a controlled substance by chemical extraction, and possession of marijuana.

July 20 - The Jurupa Valley Station in Norco conducted a DUI/Driver's License checkpoint at Hamner Avenue and Commerce Street between the hours of 8:00 p.m. and 2:00 a.m. Checkpoints are placed in locations that have the greatest opportunity for achieving drunk and drugged driving deterrence and provide the greatest safety for officers and the public. The checkpoint had 558 vehicles enter and all 558 were screened, according to police reports. Of those 558 vehicles and drivers, three were arrested for DUI, 16 were cited for operating a vehicle unlicensed, two were cited for driving

with a revoked/ suspended license, five citations were issued for other California Vehicle Code violations, and seven vehicles were towed and stored. The Jurupa Valley Station will be conducting another DUI/Driver's License Checkpoint on or about Saturday, August 17, in their ongoing commitment to lowering deaths and injuries upon our streets and highways.

July 29 - City of Eastvale officers responded to a 911 call from a residence in the 7400 block of Carrollton Avenue, in reference to a burglary-in-progress. The residents woke up to find an intruder inside their home who attempted to sexually assault a family member. They took quick action and detained the intruder until police officers arrived and took the suspect into custody. Eastvale investigators arrived and assumed control of the situation shortly thereafter. They determined that the suspect entered the residence with the intent to commit a sexual assault. The suspect was identified as 18-year old Eastvale resident, Isaac Jenkins. Jenkins was arrested and booked into the Robert Presley Detention Center for burglary with the intent to commit a sexual assault, and first degree burglary.

July 30 - City of Eastvale firefighters responded to a house fire in the 7700 block of Stonegate Drive, at about 8:30pm. Once the fire was extinguished, it was determined there were no occupants in the residence. During the post-fire safety check, firefighters discovered what appeared to be a large marijuana cultivation operation and immediately notified the Eastvale Police Department. Investigators confirmed the operation via search warrant on July 31 and seized 596 marijuana plants and 3.5 pounds of processed marijuana. Electricity at the residence was bypassed around the meter, caus-

ing the fire and resulting in thousands of dollars of structural damage.

August 1 - Officers of Eastvale's Special Enforcement Team obtained new information regarding a residence being utilized as a Marijuana Grow House. An investigation was launched and a search warrant was obtained. On Thursday, August 1 at 4:00pm, officers entered the residence and determined that it was unoccupied and had been modified for the purpose of cultivating and processing marijuana. Officers seized 100 marijuana plants, two pounds of processed marijuana, packaging materials, digital scales, and \$2,700 in U.S. currency. The suspect, Hung Vinh Ngo, 28, of Eastvale,

returned to the residence and was arrested without incident for cultivation and possession of marijuana for sale. He was booked into jail at the Robert Presley Detention Center.

The Eastvale Police Department is committed to the safety of the citizens of Eastvale and will be vigilant in investigating all crimes of this nature in accordance with their Zero Tolerance Policy. The investigation is ongoing and they are reaching out to the public and asking anyone with information about this incident to contact Officer Patrick Walls at the Jurupa Valley Station at (951) 955-2600. Citizens may also submit an anonymous tip using the Sheriff's CrimeTips online form.

Ordinance cracks down on drug houses

inspection and registration program, as well as launching a city-wide Neighborhood Watch Campaign, an event that kicked off on July 19, 2013 on Springvale Court.

City Manager, Carol Jacobs, stated, "Our message is clear in Eastvale. If you rent your property to an individual or group of people at which illegal activity occurs, then you, the property owner, are responsible. The "I didn't know" defense is no longer acceptable. This team approach will affect positive change in Eastvale."

Mayor Ike Bootsma also vowed, "The City Council is committed to eradicating Marijuana Grow Houses in the City of Eastvale. By working with the Sheriff Department, City staff, community partners, and the residents, we will solve this problem. This type of illegal

activity will not be tolerated in the City of Eastvale."

The second ordinance requires landlords, property management firms and real estate agents who rent their Eastvale property or manage the rental of Eastvale properties to obtain a business registration from the City of Eastvale.

The City launched its Business Registration Program on March 20, 2012 and has received tremendous response to the program with over 1,000 businesses currently registered. This program has compiled a comprehensive inventory of businesses in the City of Eastvale, which enhances public safety and helps achieve compliance with federal, state and local regulations.

Both ordinances have been used to help identify more grow houses within

the City, however, anonymous tips from residents has been most helpful, recently helping to tackle two more grow houses last month. The Riverside Sheriff's Department has provided tips on how to help spot a marijuana house. The tips include looking out for windows that are covered from the interior, lights and televisions on timers, subjects moving in commercial grade electrical equipment during the late night or early morning

hours, no signs of normal residential occupation, and the smell of marijuana emitting from the home.

It is also advised to never approach someone you may think is operating a grow house for your own safety. There may be criminal activity involved.

If you, or someone you know, suspects a home of being a grow house, you are strongly advised to call Deputy Javier Morando at the Jurupa Valley Station at (951) 955-2600, or the Riverside County Sheriff's Department Dispatch Center at (951) 776-1099.



The Best Parenting Lesson I Ever Learned

I live in a home where I am the only female. I am constantly surrounded by feet, armpits and "mystery smells". My fridge is always empty, no one knows where anything is and the toilet is always sticky in the way only a mother of boys will understand. I have bought stock in Clorox wipes and toilet paper and the cashiers at most of the supermarkets know me by name or by reference: that crazy lady with all those boys. My husband and I have tried to raise all of them with the same morals and values and often the same rules, but re-



cently I decided to change things up a bit. While I used to be so obsessed with making sure that everything was equal, I now focus on making sure things are fair.

The idea of parenting each child "fairly" is much more complex than making sure everything is equal. A soccer coach friend

of ours (who also has all sons) visually explained this to us by drawing a picture. In the picture there were three different sized boys trying to look over a fence and the question was, "What's better, Fair or Equal"? Of course, we all said, Equal. However, if they all stood on the same and equal box, then only one of them would be able to see over the fence, but if each child had a box customized to their size and thus was given a "fair" box, they would all get to see. Moral of the story, sometimes being fair is so much more effective than being equal, as equality isn't always the answer. What works for one may

not work for all, especially when children aren't the same. This little lesson provoked a conversation between the boys and I about how things should happen at our house and I found that they were fond of this idea as well.

Each one of my boys has a distinct and defined personality that differs from the other. One is athletic and tough. One is tender and smart. One is an introvert who is nervous about new things and one has distinct special needs. I cannot approach them with the same approach because they are so completely different and require a unique approach. I now look at them with a new purpose

and try to explain to them that I will treat them fairly, but one may be able to do things that another isn't able to do based on their behavior, abilities and personality. Luckily, my boys seem to get this, and while each one still thinks that they have it the worst in comparison, the concept is clear. How many times have you heard a parent lament over why they just can't understand how two kids who were raised exactly the same came out so different? Perhaps it's time we change our parenting style to reflect the needs of each individual child instead of expecting their needs to reflect our parenting style?

the Council.

The first discussion was regarding the speed limits for certain streets. This ordinance would cause sections along Archibald Avenue to have the speed limits lowered to 45mph from 50mph due to a survey conducted that showed a large number of accidents along that stretch of road. The other street to have speed limits reduced was a section of Hamner Avenue, also being lowered to 45mph.

The next discussion was on the use Eastvale city vehicles. Eastvale resident, Dickie Simmons, brought up some issues that he felt should be acknowledged by the City Council, however, most of his concerns have already been enacted within the City.

Councilman Jeff DeGrandpre brought up the rules of decorum regarding any appointments within the City. Further discussion on this topic is pending.

The final issue was concerning the use of a facilitator to assist the Council Members in settling their differences

in meetings. This topic was previously brought up by DeGrandpre, who felt it was a necessary element of a more professional meeting. However, when the estimated costs were proposed, DeGrandpre retracted his proposal, deciding to opt for other alternatives to settle differences, such as a retreat.
