City Of Walnut Slow Down Measures

Walnut – Make sure to slow down Walnut residents now that the City Council recently voted to decrease the speed limits for six segments in Walnut.

The California Vehicle Code requires speed limits on roadways to be reviewed every five years in order to maintain radar accuracy and uphold court rulings in regard to traffic violations.

It is also a matter of safety, and limits on roadways are often studied to help minimize traffic accidents and to help protect motorists and pedestrians.

On July 24, the City Council recommended the approval of a Citywide Speed Survey to

DB Annual Project Repairs Roads

Diamond Bar – While in the second year of the residential program and the seventh year of the arterial program, the City of Diamond Bar's annual Road Maintenance Project will continue to treat and repair several miles of Diamond Bar residential and arterial roadways.

The residential area where streets will be repaired this month is bounded by SR57/60 to the north, Grand Ave. and Diamond Bar Blvd. to the south, and the neighborhood surrounding Quail Summit Elementary School, according to the City of Diamond Bar. The arterial roads are Golden Springs Dr. between

Lavender Dr. and Brea Canyon Rd. and Diamond Bar Blvd. between Brea Canyon Rd. and Brea Canyon Cutoff.

The City of Diamond Bar informs the community that the type of repair each street will receive depends on the severity of

60 Freeway Lanes Closed This Weekend

Rowland Heights – Three lanes of the 60 freeway will be closed again this weekend.

Caltrans have issued a press release last month stating that the Pomona freeway (SR-60) will be closed periodically for pavement rehabilitation work between Fullerton Rd. and Nogales St.

The "55 Hour Weekend Lane Closure" as Caltrans are calling it, states that on the weekends of August 9 and August 23, up to three lanes will be closed for maintenance.

The roads will be under construction due to the heavy weight of cars and trucks over time, requiring a more than two feet deep replacement of pavement and

concrete base. Caltrans say the new surface will provide a smooth, safer drive for motorists, reduce time required for maintenance and minimize the need for further lane closures. Work is expected to be complete in late 2014.

Amber Alert Goes Cellular

If you have a mobile phone, you may have noticed that an AMBER Alert text for the suspected abduction of a 16-year old girl and her 8-year old brother flashed across your screen on the evening of Monday, August 5 (along with a high-pitched siren to get your attention). In fact, it was the first of its kind state-wide cellular alert. WEA, or Wireless Emergency Alerts, is part of the National Emergency Alerts System that allows authorized senders to activate cellular towers for emergencies such as missing children, weather, or presidential issues. In some respects, this is an amazing way to help facilitate law enforcement in the cessation of child abduction. Think of the millions of people now in on the details, looking for license plates, searching the faces of children in crowds. Even digital billboards

are in on the plan with the pictures of potentially abducted children looming 20 feet high. The AMBER Alert program was established to honor 9-year old Amber Hagerman. Back in 1996, this young girl was riding her bike in Arlington, Texas, when abducted, and was later found murdered. AMBER has also become the acronym for America's Missing: Broadcasting Emergency Response. According to the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children's website, AMBER Alerts have contributed to 656 Successful Recoveries. The program is a voluntary partnership between law enforcement agencies, broadcasters, and the wireless industry. They activate an urgent notification via roadway signs, billboards, televisions, radios and capable cellular devices to alert specific areas based upon

Although this story is a lesson in success, I have to ask the most important question of all: What is success? During weekly practice sessions, math club members geared up for the contest with the help of teacher/coach Amy Erickson and Walnut High Math Club members.

Congratulations to the following Math Olympiad winners:

In the 6th grade category, Oscar Chou was awarded the 1st Place trophy. Tiffany Chang, Felianne

Teng and Derick Tseng tied for 2nd Place, scored in the top 10% and received silver pin awards. Sylvester Yue won the 3rd Place award. 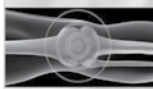

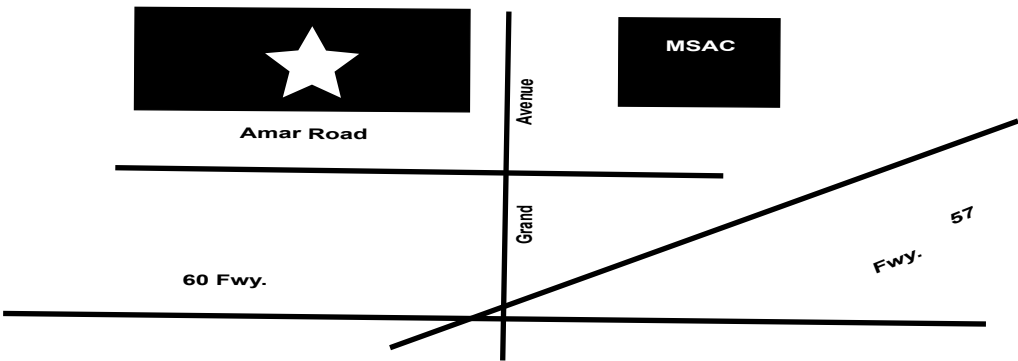

Pomona – On Aug. 5, 2013, a newborn baby boy was safely surrendered at a hospital in Pomona, due to the Los Angeles County's Safe Surrender Program. The newborn is in protective custody and will be placed with families approved for adoption by the Department of Children and Family Services.

"I'm thankful that this mother, despite her desperate situation, decided to surrender her

baby, and give him a second chance at life," said Supervisor Knabe in a press release. "As word continues to spread about the Program, other moms in similar situations can make the right choice for their babies and themselves, because of Safe Surrender."

This is the fourth time a baby has been safely surrendered in LA County this year and the 107th time since the program began over twelve years ago, according to Supervisor Knabe.

The program allows someone to surrender an infant that is no more than three days old, as long as the infant shows no signs of abuse.

The program was initiated by Supervisor Knabe and unanimously approved by the Board of Supervisors in 2001. The Safely Surrendered Baby Law was signed permanently into state law in January 2006.

The Safely Surrendered Baby Law responds to the increasing number of newborn infant

deaths due to abandonment in unsafe locations, according to babysafe.ca.gov. The law's intent is to save lives of newborn infants at risk of abandonment by encouraging parents or persons with lawful custody

to safely surrender the infant within 72 hours of birth, with no questions asked.

Crime Recap

STAFF REPORTS

LA County - This week in crime includes a hit and run, a truck vs. train crash, two freeway accidents, and a robbery.

On Aug. 1, a skateboarder was struck in a hit and run accident at a shopping center in Rowland Heights. After the vehicle hit the skateboarder, the vehicle sped off. The crash occurred at around 1:30 p.m. in front of Baja Fresh Mexican Grill located at 17420 Colima Road, west of Albatross Road and east of the Puente Hills Mall. The victim was brought to the hospital in stable condition, according to the L.A. County Fire Department.

Also on Aug. 1, a truck vs. train collision occurred on Nogales St. between Gale Ave. and San Jose Ave., causing the entire street to be shut down for 24 hours. The driver suffered minor injuries and was taken to a nearby hospital.

On Aug. 2, an accident occurred on the I-10 freeway causing four victims to be airlifted to a local hospital, two of whom were children. The crash occurred on the westbound side of the I-10 freeway near Kellogg Dr. Two vehicles were involved, one of which overturned and ended up on its roof. Two helicopters landed on the Kellogg exit ramp of the I-10 freeway to pick up the four patients, which prompted all of the lanes to be shut down.

On Aug. 4, an accident involv-

ing a vehicle and a light pole occurred. The crash occurred at 18325 Valley Blvd. and was reported at 10:41 a.m.

On Aug. 5, an overturned furniture truck caused an accident on the I-10 freeway, causing the eastbound lanes to be shut down for a brief time. No injuries were reported in the crash.

On Aug. 6, a strong arm robbery occurred on the Cal Poly Pomona campus. Cal Poly released a statement on their

Facebook which read: "Pomona Police are investigating a strong-arm robbery that occurred this afternoon on Valley Blvd. near Kellogg Drive. The crime did not occur on campus."

The victim, who had just exited a bus, said his attacker approached from behind, struck him on the head, and took his wallet and cell phone before fleeing. Members of the campus community are urged to be vigilant and aware of their surround-

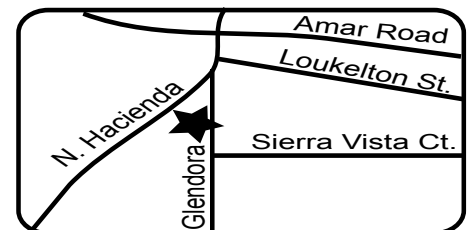

initiate the revision of speed limits on certain streets, and appropriate \$15,000 of City funds to complete the project. The 2013 state-required survey was completed, measuring 67 areas

of traffic for road characteristics, accident history, environmental factors, pedestrian activity and developments in the vicinity. As a result, Ordinance 13-05 was approved, and speed limits have been lowered on six street segments within the City of Walnut.

The following street segments will receive new signs and pavement markers:

- Amar Rd – Nogales St to Sunset Bluff Rd; Reduced from 50mph to 45mph
- Amar Rd – Sunset Bluff Rd to Grand Ave; Reduced from 45mph to 40mph
- Camino de Teodoro

– Valley Blvd to Calle Baja; Reduced from 35mph to 30mph

- Lemon Ave – Amar Rd to Creekside Dr; Reduced from 40mph to 35mph
- Mountaineer Rd – Grand Ave to Sundowner Ln; Reduced from 35mph to 30mph
- Pierre Road – Cardin Street to Vejar Road; Reduced

from 35mph to 30mph

The speed reductions are anticipated to help lower accident rates (Amar Rd and Lemon Ave both have a history of high accident rates); and help contribute to the safety of children around Suzanne Middle School and Walnut High School on the Pierre Road segment.

ends, Caltrans will replace the No. 3 and No. 4 eastbound SR-60 lanes between Fullerton Rd. and Nogales St. These weekends include:

From Fri., Aug. 9 at 10 p.m. to Mon., Aug. 12 at 5 a.m., three lanes of the eastbound 60 will be closed and the following on-

ramps will be closed: Hacienda Blvd., Azusa Ave., Fullerton Rd., and south Nogales St. The following off-ramps will also be closed: Fullerton Rd. and Nogales St.

From Fri., Aug. 23 at 10 p.m. to Mon., Aug. 26 at 5 a.m., two lanes of the eastbound 60 will be closed and the same on-ramps will be closed: Hacienda Boulevard, Azusa Ave., Fullerton Rd., and south Nogales St. The same off-ramps will also be closed: Fullerton Rd. and Nogales St. However, the SR-57 and SR-60 connector will remain open.

Full freeway closures in the eastbound direction between Nogales St. and Fullerton Rd. will be in effect on Sat., Aug. 24 from 1 a.m. to 5 a.m. and on Mon., Aug. 26 from 1 a.m.

to 5 a.m. for concrete barrier removal.

Caltrans recommend planning a different route using their map app at quickmap.dot.ca.gov/. If you know you will be traveling on the 60 freeway during the construction, Caltrans encourage you to bring water, snacks, medications, and entertainment for children because the delay is expected to be

long. As a reminder, a reduced speed limit of 45 mph is always in effect within construction work zones. If traveling through the construction, remember to slow down, pay attention, and watch for signs advising of traffic shifts and other important information.

its wear-and-tear, and will involve a treatment of, or combination of, asphalt patchwork, crack sealing, asphalt grind and overlay, and slurry and chip seal application.

Construction hours will be from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. until the end of August. Depending on the type of road repair, it may be necessary to close streets for several hours during the day. However, all streets will be reopened the same day by 5 p.m., according to the City.

The City's Road Maintenance Project divides the city into seven areas and seven arterial zones, and treats and repairs sections of roadway on a rotating seven-

year cycle. Questions regarding road maintenance projects in Diamond Bar may be directed to the City's Public Works Department at (909) 839-7040.

Sex trafficking arraignment

two felony counts of pandering a minor over 16 years old by procuring, one felony count of pimping a minor for Jane Doe #1, and one felony count of attempting to pimp a minor for Jane Doe #2, with a sentencing enhancement for human trafficking by coercion, deceit and fear. Marshall has a prior conviction for a 2011 residential burglary in Sacramento County. If convicted on all counts, Greer faces a maximum sentence of 30 years to life in state prison, and Marshall faces a maximum sentence of 60 years to life in state prison.

Greer and Marshall are accused of being pimps/modern-day slave owners who exploit women and/or children for financial gain. Pimps often establish rigid rules that their victims are expected to follow including requiring victims to turn over all payment they receive for sex acts from sex purchasers to their pimp.

Months before July 2013, Greer is accused of befriending 17-year-old Jane Doe #1.

On July 29, 2013, Greer and Marshall are accused of meeting Jane Doe #1 and 16-year-old Jane Doe #2. They are accused of convincing the victims to go away with them with the intent to

traffic them and sexually exploit the girls for a commercial purpose under the pretense of going on a road trip. Marshall is accused of posting sexual advertisements featuring Jane Doe #1 on Internet websites known for prostitution. The two defendants are accused of driving the teen victims to San

Jose and then to Orange County. During this time, Marshall is accused of forcibly instructing Jane Doe #1 to perform lewd sexual acts in exchange for money.

On July 31, 2013, Greer and Marshall are accused of putting both girls in a Santa Ana hotel room to engage in commercial sex. The defendants are accused of setting up two encounters with

sex purchasers; one of them was an undercover officer from the Santa Ana Police Department (SAPD). The defendants were arrested that day.

This case was investigated by SAPD. The Federal Bureau of Investigation and the Anaheim

Police Department assisted in the investigation. Deputy District Attorney Bradley Schoenleben of the HEAT Unit is prosecuting this case.

run our organization like a union with a President, a VP and a Board to ensure that everything runs smoothly."

In 2010, the estimated number of Law Enforcement and Fire Fighters living in Eastvale was 1500 and in 2013 that number of L.E.A.F.F. members has grown to around 2500. With the large number of Police Officers and Fire Fighters who call Eastvale home, the group started small and grew to include representatives from virtually every department in four counties and includes: Deputy Sheriffs, Police Officers, Corrections Officers, Parole Agents, Highway Patrol Officers, INS Agents, FBI Agents, Paramedics, as well as all assignments in the various Fire Departments.
