Eastvale - Overall, the City of Eastvale does have one of the lowest crime rates in the area. Neighborhood Scout

(neighborhoodscout.com) gives it a ranking of 72.5% within a 1 mile radius outside the city, and a 62.45% ranking within a 5 mile radius (based upon 100% being low crime rates, and 10% being

Eastvale - Corona-Norco Unified School District has begun the transition process to the new state mandated Common Core State Standards. 46 states brought together experts, teachers and researchers to write the Common Core State Standards (CCSS), which were adopted by California in 2010. CNUSD then began the process of transitioning into this new standard by spending the 2012-2013 school years raising awareness, the 2013-2014

school year planning the transition and finally, will conclude with the implementation of the CCSS for the 2014-2015 school year.



Eastvale's Strategic Plan Addresses Economic Development

On May 8, 2013, the Eastvale City Council adopted the City's 1st Strategic Plan. Through the public input process and discussions with City Council members and community stakeholders, the following goals were identified in the strategic plan:

1. Establish a solid fiscal foundation for the City.
2. Optimize the City's economic development potential.
3. Maintain an excellent level

of public safety.

4. Provide high quality public facilities and infrastructure.

These goals were also included in the FY2013-14 budget. On June 12, 2013, the Eastvale City Council adopted the Annual Operations Capital Improvement Budget for Fiscal Year 2013-2014. This is a balanced budget for fiscal year 2013-2014 which focuses on the key priorities such as public safety and business development. The Strategic Plan is available for viewing on the City's Economic Development page and the FY2013-14 Budget document is also available on the Finance page of the City's website.

An Economic Development Committee was recently established to begin tackling the many specific objectives and action items outlined in the stra-

tegic plan. The Economic Development Committee consists of Mayor Ike Bootsma, Mayor Pro Tem Adam Rush, Chairman of the Planning Commission Bill Link, City Manager Carol Jacobs and two staff members from City Hall.

Based on the data compiled for the Strategic Plan, we have determined that food service, education services, retail trade, wholesale trade and warehousing/logistics are currently the five most important industries in our City. However, the five most important industries to the Inland Empire in terms of growth are manufacturing, health care, transportation/warehousing, food service, wholesale trade, and administrative support. With the addition of medical offices by San Antonio Community Hospital (breaking ground late 2013), the City is tapping into the

growing health care industry.

The City of Eastvale is taking a more aggressive and proactive position on Economic Development than in previous years. The City incorporated on October 1, 2010 and the priority was to set a solid foundation for City operations and services. Now that the foundation has been laid, the City can focus on shaping the future local economy with smart growth and a targeted strategy to bring employers to the community. The City has been focusing on building strong relations with our current major employers and identifying opportunities for growth and expansion in their market sectors. The City has also created a resource for employment opportunities within the City and has built relationships with the Riverside County Workforce Investment

Board, Small Business Development Center and the Norco College to fulfill the needs for a skilled labor force. Job growth is an area of focus that the City has just begun to delve into, therefore, the programs and approach will continue to evolve over the coming months.

Using the Strategic Plan to guide their efforts, the Economic Development Committee is well on its way to shaping Eastvale into one of the most desirable cities in Riverside County.

Did YOU Know?

CITY OF EASTVALE

Did you know that it is illegal to display your vehicle for sale? According to Municipal Code Section 10.20.120. - Displaying vehicle for sale:

(a) No person shall park any vehicle or place any structure upon any city highway for the purpose of selling therefrom any article or thing, and no person shall sell, display for sale, or offer for sale any article or thing, either in or from any such vehicle or structure so parked or placed; but this section shall not prohibit a seller from taking orders or delivering any commodity from a vehicle on a city highway adjacent to the premises of the purchaser, nor shall it prohibit any person from temporarily parking any vehicle upon a city highway while actually engaged in making a sale

to a customer wishing to buy.

(b) Exceptions; *prima facie* evidence of violation; administrator.

(1) Except as provided for in subsection (b)(2) of this section, no person shall park, stop, place or leave standing any vehicle or cause any vehicle to be parked or placed upon any private or public street, highway, parking lot or other private or public property located within the city for the purpose of selling, displaying for sale or offering for sale any such vehicle.

(2) Subsection (b)(1) of this section shall not prohibit any person from selling, displaying for sale or offering for sale a vehicle on private property, provided the person owns or occupies the property or has written permission of the property owner, authorized agent of the property owner or the person

in lawful possession of such private property. Such written permission shall be displayed in or on the vehicle in such a manner as to be clearly visible, and upon request by a peace officer or code enforcement officer employed by the city, such written permission shall be made available for further inspection. This subsection shall not exempt a person from compliance with county zoning ordinances or any other ordinance or law governing the sale of vehicles on private property.

(3) The parking or placing of any vehicle with a sign or other advertising device thereon or proximate thereto, indicating such vehicle is for sale shall constitute *prima facie* evidence that such vehicle was parked or placed for the purpose of displaying the vehicle for sale.

(4) The provisions of this

subsection may be administered and enforced by the city council or designees.

illegal activity in the City. Developing an active Neighborhood Watch program is a great way to improve security, reduce crime and combat illegal activity.

Amber Alert Goes Cellular

If you have a mobile phone, you may have noticed that an AMBER Alert text for the suspected abduction of a 16-year old girl flashed across your screen back on the evening of Monday, August 5 (along with a high-pitched siren to get your attention); in fact, it was the first of its kind statewide cellular alert. WEA, or Wireless Emergency Alerts, is part of the National Emergency Alerts System that allows authorized senders to activate cellular towers for emergencies such as missing children, weather, or presidential issues.

In some respects this is an amazing way to help facilitate law enforcement in the cessation of child abduction. Think of the millions of people now in on the details, looking for license plates, searching the faces of children in crowds. Even

digital billboards are in on the plan with the pictures of potentially abducted children looming 20 feet high.

The AMBER Alert program was established to honor 9-year old Amber Hagerman. Back in 1996, this young girl was riding her bike in Arlington, Texas, when abducted, and was later found murdered.

AMBER has also become the acronym for America's Missing: Broadcasting Emergency Response.

According to the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children's website, AMBER Alerts have contributed to more than 656 Successful Recoveries, including the recent 16-year old abductee. The program is a voluntary partnership between law

enforcement agencies, transportation agencies, broadcasters, and the wireless industry. They activate an urgent notification via roadway signs, billboards, televisions, radios and capable cellular devices to alert specific areas based upon their proximity to the emergency. The system is used in all 50 states, Puerto Rico, and the U.S. Virgin Islands.

With the addition of cellular texts broadcasting for AMBER Alerts, there are even more opportunities to save lives. If you think you have seen a missing child or have knowledge about a possible abduction, you can contact the National Center for Missing & Exploited Children, 24/7, via their CYBER TIPLINE: 1 (800) 843-5678 or www.cybertipline.com.

CNUSD seeks \$299m bond input

located at the southwest tract of homes near Chandler and Archibald, next to Half Moon Park, and would relieve the extensive overcrowding this young community has encountered.

"Yorba Elementary has the funding from the school district but is lacking the matching funds from the state," said Kelly Bruce and Evita Gonzales from CNUSD at the June 12, 2013 Town Hall Meeting. The District will start some initial work in October but will not be able to complete construction until

the funds are delivered from the state, or are paid for by the bond initiative, they added.

CNUSD had proposed a bond initiative last year, but changed their minds after other initiatives hit the ballot.

"Do we need a bond? Absolutely," Thomas Pike, Assistant Superintendent for Executive Services, said in an interview with Eastvale News last August. "The board feels additional time is needed to continue studying what options will be best for students, the timing of the measure and to assess whether the necessary resources exist to effectively manage a campaign," he had

added.

The currently proposed \$299 million 30-year bond measure would also be used to upgrade facilities, build new schools and update technology resources within the District's 49 schools.

The District had identified three major issues for consideration on that proposed bond measure and sought feedback from the local community.

CNUSD was interested in 1) providing funding for instructional technology improvements such as infrastructure and student/teacher devices, 2) providing funding for continuing facility improvement projects at older elementary schools and all intermediate schools throughout the district, and 3) establishing a technology fund to support annual upgrades, new purchases and maintenance.

"Funding for these technology improvements at schools district-wide would ensure instructional equity for all students," said Ted Rozzi, Assistant Superintendent of Facilities.

This year it appears they are seeking the same feedback as registered voters were sent last week a "Back to School Update" slash "Tell Us What You Think" questionnaire, targeting seven direct questions and asking the voter to rate "HIGH, MED, or LOW."

"Please rate the importance of the following school priorities," the prepaid mail in card read. "Update classrooms for career and technical education; Repair/replace aging school roofs, floors, walkways, lighting and wiring; Improve energy efficiency to save money; Upgrade technology in classrooms, libraries, and science labs; Improve student safety and security; Repair/upgrade outdated classrooms and schools; and the final question: Relieve student overcrowding."

In addition to the proposed bond for next year, taxpayers are currently paying for another bond passed seven years ago.

In November 2006, the voters of CNUSD approved Measure U, a \$250 million general obligation bond for the construction, reconstruction, rehabilita-

tion, or replacement of school facilities at CNUSD. If you have any questions about Measure U passed in 2006, please call the Facilities Division office at (951) 736-5045.

The level of annual taxation a voter might support, and the importance of other issues facing the community are expected after the survey results are compiled. Those conducting the surveys will also note how individuals prioritize the need for a school facilities bond, and gather general demographic data.

Once polling results are reviewed and any additional community outreach is complete, the CNUSD Board of Education would need to call a bond election for the November ballot no later than July, unless its proposed for an earlier election. The time frame for a resolution to be passed is about 4 months prior to an election, explained Assistant Superintendent Ted Rozzi.


L.E.A.F.F. has been busy out and about in Eastvale.

I dread September and have every year since 2009. I know the day is coming and as each day draws closer, the clock slows down and I know it's coming. September 20th, the day we lost mom and the day that everything changed. My dad lost his soul mate, my grandparents lost their daughter, we lost our mother and so much more. To my dad, my mom was his every minute, to my brother and I, she was our every day. At 30 years old, I still needed my mom and best friend and was forced to face a life without her and her support and love. Every time I called her with a problem, a joke or

I played her final message on the answering machine so many times that I finally wore the tape out, and the clothes I have of hers I have no longer smell like her. My father moved on and remarried a wonderful woman, who also lost her spouse. My brother got married and had 2 beautiful baby boys that I know my mother would have loved. I love harder because I have to love them for her, too. I try to make her proud of me by being the woman I know she raised and wanted me to be, but it still doesn't make it easier. She's still not here.

Minutes before she died, I whispered in her ear that she could go because I'd take care of my dad and brother as she did. Her heart stopped beating at that moment and she left us for a far better place; and just like that, life "after mom" began. A funeral was planned, family came to say goodbye and we all walked around with that horrible feeling in the pit of our stomachs that only a fractured heart can bring. The sun rose, the sun set and life kept moving as if the world was unaware that our lives would never be the same.

While I was secure in where she was and that she was no longer suffering from the ravages of ovarian cancer, I still missed her

and struggled to overcome my grief. Then one day, after much prayer and personal reflection, my dad shared with me a phrase that kept running through his head, "Because loss gives no remorse but benevolence over the holy". Taking his focus off his grief and focusing on helping others helped him to slowly move on and gave me the much needed push to do the same. So instead of drowning in my own pain and the deep crack that still ran through my heart, I began to put that energy into helping others and found that the pain did begin to subside. Putting my focus on others who



needed help and stepping out of "myself" gave me the perspective that I needed to ensure the path to healing my own heart.



Crime trending in Eastvale for vehicular and residential burglaries most often happened Tuesday through Friday, between the hours of 8:00am and 4:00pm.

During the period of January 1 to June 30 of 2013, Eastvale Crime Statistics reported 14,452 calls for service, 5,394 traffic and parking citations, 19 DUI arrests, 38 injuries, 64 non-injury collisions, and 0 fatalities.

Most calls for service are ranked by priority. Priority 1 is characterized by a threat to human life marked by violence and the potential for serious injury; Priority 2 is for urgent, but non-life threatening calls; Priority 3 is for non-urgent nor life-threatening calls; and Priority 4 is for most past calls, with the exception of several felonies. The response time to these calls, from January 1 to

June 30, 2013, is as follows:

Marijuana Grow Houses seem to be in the news quite a bit lately, and Eastvale has identified at least 31 of these houses to date. Grow Houses are a crime, and are identified by abnormal signs of occupancy.

- Windows are often covered from inside the residence.
- Commercial-grade air conditioners and electrical equipment may be seen being moved in or installed.
- Individuals other than uniformed utility workers may be accessing electrical vaults near the street.
- Lights and televisions are set on timers, turning on

and off and at the same times daily.

• Individuals may arrive and leave within a few hours on a regular basis, and may pull directly into the garage and immediately shut the door.

• There may be a constant humming sound coming from the residence.

If you suspect a Marijuana Grow House in your neighborhood, contact your local law enforcement (listed below).

The City of Eastvale is also home to L.E.A.F.F. (Law Enforcement AND Fire Fighters), the only organization of Law Enforcement and Firefighters in the entire nation. L.E.A.F.F. is a group of approximately 2,500 police and fire personnel who call Eastvale home and are dedicated to ensuring that it remains a great place to live. This is definitely a contributing factor to our low crime rates. You can find more information about L.E.A.F.F. by visiting www.eleaff.org.

You can help to keep the crime rates in Eastvale low by doing a few simple things as well. Keep your doors locked, get involved in a Neighborhood Watch program, keep spare keys with a trusted friend or neighbor (as opposed to under the doormat), and eliminate places intruders may hide such as dark entryways or overgrown shrubbery.

City council recap

\$86,037.26. This project will allow the construction of new sidewalks on Orange Street. The award was approved unanimously with a 5-0 vote.

Council members also discussed the adoption of a Legislative Committee for the council. The goal of this committee would be to appoint two council members to help provide direction on legislation by the state and federal government that cannot be accommodated with the parameters of a normal City Council meeting. Kelly Howell suggested that the Mayor and Mayor Pro-Tem should be the ones elected for the committee. The decision was passed with a 5-0 vote with none dissenting.

Next, they discussed the roles of Mayor and Mayor Pro-Tem, which was recommended by Councilman Jeff DeGrandpre. DeGrandpre felt that the City of Eastvale was not being fully represented at several meetings that were missed and gave a list of eight meetings that were missed this month. Mayor Ike Bootsma responded by saying, "Everything we get invited to, we can't go to." Mayor Pro-Tem Adam Rush also stated that these meetings and events are costly and the City has a limited bud-

get for meetings. The council members did not deem that a committee was the right step to take and instead, City Manager Carol Jacobs decided to take it upon herself to assist the council members with recommendations to attend certain meetings.

The final item on the agenda was another recommendation by Councilman DeGrandpre to somehow create a process to mediate the council. "We have some issues we need to get hashed out," stated DeGrandpre. However, DeGrandpre's previous suggestion of having a "council retreat," where the council can hash out their differences, could not go into ef-

fect due to the California open meeting law that was already passed. City Attorney John Cavanaugh stated that two council members can able to meet privately, but no more than that.

The council then went to the council communications portion of the meeting, where council members can talk to each other regarding items that

are not on the agenda. In this section, Ike Bootsma suggested the possibility of starting an ice cream truck ordinance due to ice cream truck drivers serving ice cream to children through the chain link fence. He also stated that some of the trucks look a little unclean and wanted to have an inspection done of all ice cream trucks, to ensure they are all safe for children.

Townhall Meeting Update

Eastvale – Eastvale held its quarterly Townhall meeting on Aug. 6. Items that were discussed range from the City update, updates from JCSD, CNUSD, CALFIRE and an updated crime report from the Riverside County Sheriff's Dept.

The meeting began with the City update conducted by Eastvale Mayor Ike Bootsma. The update consisted of many things going on in Eastvale such as, announcing the adoption of the budget on June 12, the addition of staff within the city, and that Eastvale will get its own paramedic squad sometime in Nov. or Dec. Also, Bootsma announced that Schleisman Ave. will be under construction for about 5 weeks in August to widen the road now that the cell tower is gone.

The next item on the agenda was an update by Supervisor of Riverside County, John Tavaglione, who discussed what's going on in the Riverside County. The biggest item in the update was that Riverside County was opening the first new medical school on the west coast in nearly 50 years. Tavaglione was also questioned by residents on the Hamner Bridge project. Tavaglione responded that the bridge project would be finished in approximately five years if everything goes according to plan.

The next item on the agenda was the CNUSD School Board Update given by Bill Newberry and Mr. Kelly Bruce. In this update, they introduced the new principles in the Corona-Norco School District. For more about these principles, read the story on page 1. They also pressed on the matter of the schools overcrowding to which they announced their Student Call Back program that was implemented on Aug. 12. The program would bring over 100 students back to Clara Barton Elementary and 12 students back to Rosa Parks elementary. He also stated that portables

were being built at both schools to bring back another 100 students. Finally, he touched on the school systems looking into a technology bond to allow for a more technological school system with better computers and devices to assist the kids in learning.

Then, members of the Eastvale Community Foundation came up and spoke a little about themselves. They also stated that a sign on the Eastvale water tower is in the works, but didn't say when it should be completed.

Members of JCSD also came up to give their update. One of the issues JCSD talked about was working to coordinate recycled water for parks and recreation facilities. They also stated that the Community Park Prospect would be completed by the end of the year.

The Police and Fire services were the last to give their updates on local events. First to speak was a representative from CALFIRE to announce that the Eastvale Fire Dept. will be adding another medic staff onto their crew, consisting of two people. They will also be bringing in a fire protection specialist to assist them in future endeavors, as well as opening a second Fire Station on Chandler and Shelby, just west of Archibald.

Then the assistant Chief of Police, Lieutenant Michael Yates, went up after CALFIRE to give a crime report update. The crime update showed the crime trends that exist and existed in Eastvale. To read more about these reports, please read the story on page 1. Yates also told the community how calls are handled and prioritized. Finally, he went into the recent marijuana grow house epidemic that has been sweeping Eastvale. In total, Eastvale has had 31 grow houses this year. However, efforts are in place to stop the grow houses from further extending their reach throughout the City.

The Eastvale Townhall Meetings are not City-run events. They are held quarterly at Rosa Parks Elementary located at 13830 Whispering Hills Dr. in Eastvale. The meetings are open to the public and encourage residents to come and ask questions.

sexual assault investigation. After the officers ensured the safety of the victim, they located the suspect in a nearby residence a short time later. The suspect was identified as Ruben Mendez, 61, of Eastvale, who was arrested and booked into the Robert Presley Detention Center for multiple felony sexual assault related charges and committing a sexual assault crime in violation of his terms as a registered sex offender.

On August 1, another arrest was made in regard to an illegal marijuana grow house in Eastvale. Officers assigned to the City of Eastvale Special Enforcement Team obtained new information regarding a residence being used for an illegal marijuana grow operation. An investigation was initiated and a search warrant was obtained for the residence. At around 4 p.m., officers served the search warrant. Once inside, officers discovered the residence was unoccupied and had been modified for the sole purpose of cultivating and processing marijuana for sales. Officers seized 100 marijuana plants, two pounds of processed marijuana, packaging material, digital scales, and \$2700 in U.S. currency. The suspect later returned to the residence and was arrested without incident into the Robert Presley Detention Center. The suspect was identified as Hung Vinh Ngo, 28, of Eastvale, who was charged with cultivation and possession of marijuana for sale.

On August 10 at about 3:15 p.m., officers assigned to the Eastvale Special Enforcement Team received new information regarding another marijuana house and served a search warrant on the 13500 block of Rainier Ave. Officers discovered the residence was unoccupied and had been modified for the sole purpose of cultivating, processing and packaging marijuana for sales. The marijuana plants had been removed and it appears the residence had been abandoned for about a week. Although the marijuana cultivation operation had been recently abandoned, it was estimated to be an 800 to 1000 plant grow while operational. As a result of this marijuana cultivation operation, the residence sustained major structural and water damage, estimated at \$75,000 to \$100,000. Additionally, electricity was still being bypassed around the meter, causing a serious fire hazard and resulting in approximately \$5000 per month in stolen electricity.

On August 10, officers assigned to the Eastvale Special Enforcement Team received information from anonymous citizens of illegal narcotics activity occurring at a residence located in the 7600 block of Turtle Mountain Circle. At around 8:30 p.m., officers observed a vehicle leaving the residence and a traffic stop was conducted. Prior to yielding for officers, the driver threw a large bag out of the vehicle. The driver yielded and was detained. Officers recovered the bag and found a loaded .38 caliber revolver and a large amount of methamphetamine with items indicative of narcotic sales. The adult male driver was identified as Brian

Nunn, 28, El Cajon, and the adult female passenger was identified as Tayler Jenkins, 22, Norco. Both were arrested and booked at the Robert Presley Detention Center. Nunn was arrested for possession of methamphetamine for sales, transportation of methamphetamine, felon in possession of a loaded firearm, violation of his Post Release Community Supervision, and under the influence of a controlled substance. Jenkins was arrested for being under the influence of a controlled substance and violation of probation. A follow-up investigation was initiated and a search warrant was obtained for the residence.

On August 14 at 8:30 p.m., a search warrant was served by officers assigned to the Eastvale Special Enforcement Team, resulting in three subjects detained at the residence for possession methamphetamine and heroin. Officers also located several victims of identity theft and credit card fraud by locating several pieces of identification, social security cards, and credit cards. Officers are in the process of locating and contacting the victims of the thefts. The two adult males and adult female were arrested and booked at the Robert Presley Detention Center. They have been identified as Sommer Strickland, 29, of Eastvale, Jeffrey Dines, 29, of Eastvale, and Jarred Wallander, 28, of Eastvale. Strickland was arrested for possession of methamphetamine, theft, fraud, possession of stolen property, under the influence of a controlled substance, and violation of probation. Dines was arrested for possession of methamphetamine, theft, fraud, possession of stolen property, and

under the influence of a controlled substance. And Wallander was arrested for being under the influence of a controlled substance and violation of parole.







New common core standards announced

standards will bring, CNUSD hosted a parent information night on August 28, 2013. The District will also host another informative meeting at Santiago High School in the theatre on Thursday September 12, 2013 at 6:30pm. At these meetings, parents will be able to learn about the curriculum and the new learning standards from teachers and district administrators. Parents will also be able to ask questions and instruction on how they can assist their children in their quest for academic success.

At the Parent Information Night on August 28 at Corona High School, teachers and administrators shared with the community pertinent information about the new California Common Core State Standards, the main goal of which is to make students college and career minded and able to compete with the world. Teachers will concentrate more on working with students to deliver receive instruction ensuring a

deeper level of mastery and problem solving. There will also be a more coherent progression of learning expectations in English, Language Arts and Math; which are designed to prepare K-12 students for College and career success. This success is based on a firm foundation of "Anchor Standards" that applies to each grade level. The complete list of standards can be found at <http://corestandards.org/the-standards>. However, the overall goals of these standards are to provide students with a more rigorous education in content and application that is aligned with college and real world work expectations.

Testing will be done to ensure that students are performing well and that they are able to communicate successfully throughout all subject areas in the form of the Smarter Balances Assessment Consortium (SBAC). This assessment will be given to students in third grade, eighth grade and eleventh grade beginning in 2015. To find out more about the SBAC and to receive updates,

The implantation of the CCSS will result in a shift from the "normal" English/Language Arts and Math standards and classrooms. In the English and Language Arts classes, the shift will take place by putting a greater emphasis on non-fiction work and less of a focus on the "classics" and other works of fiction. While fiction will still be a part of the curriculum, students will rely more heavily on non-fiction, scientific and technical books to obtain information. Reading, writing and speaking will also be more heavily grounded in evidence from text and other forms of information. Students will also practice with complex text and using its academic language. Since the ability to read and read well, leads to the ability to write well, the heightened focus on historical, scientific and informational reading should help students to be better prepared for college and careers.

Math Standards will also shift in three major areas. The first shift will be to focus

on moving from coverage to mastery. This will be done by encouraging focus and deeper instruction on fewer topics instead of trying to fit a large number of lessons into the school year. The second shift will work toward coherence by teaching students to think across grades and link to major topics within each grade. Lastly, rigor in the form of pursuing conceptual understanding and procedural skills and literacy with the final result of applying these lessons with equal intensity is the final goal. The idea is to teach students that it is about more than just doing the math, it's about USING the math. Students are expected to be involved in rigorous tasks that require thinking and then be able to verbalize, discuss and write about the thought process that they used to arrive at answers.

Students, who are below grade level, have special needs or are English language learners will not be left behind when these new standards are implemented. Instead, teachers will have more time to cover subjects in greater detail and students will have an opportu-

nity to really understand what is being taught. Teachers will use scaffolding strategies to support students who are below grade level or need more help. Different states will also work diligently together to constantly improve upon any issues so that that these students do not get left behind.

The change in the classroom will be evident, but teachers and administrators hope that the change will be welcomed. However, learning doesn't just happen at school and parents are encouraged to get involved by talking to their kids about school, homework and what their future holds. It is important to talk to kids about college and graduating high school, as well as being involved with your children's school and activities. With the adoption of these new standards, states and districts can share experience, methods of assessment, teaching practices and materials to help parents support learning at home. Remembering To See The Beauty

At the end of July, I went on a Missions Trip to Haiti with about 12 people from my church and from other churches. This was the first time I had ever been out of the country and had ever been on a Missions Trip, and I decided to make it count by going to a 3rd World Country.

If someone mentions Haiti, some think of the earthquake that happened in 2010, some think of poverty, some think of diseases and some think of the corrupted government. Even though all of this is true about Haiti, now that I have been there, these aspects are not the first things that come to my mind. When I think of Haiti, I think of the beautiful mountains that surround the villages. I think of the clear blue water of the Caribbean Sea that some of my teammates were fortunate enough to get baptized in. I think of the fields of crops that the Haitians grew themselves in order to survive. I think of the Haitian people in the villages waving at us and saying "Bonswa" (meaning hello in Creole) as you walk through the villages. I think of the children who ran after our car just to get a glimpse of an American, as if we were famous.

When I think of Haiti, I can't help but to think of the beauty of the country, mainly because of how welcoming the people are. We were strangers to these people and they didn't know what we were doing there or what we were even saying, but they welcomed us into their homes, they let us hold their children, they let us pray with them, they smiled at us as we walked by, and they said hi to us as if we were a part of their

everyday lives. Even the Haitians (both children and adults) who could speak a little bit of English would try so hard to just have a simple "Hi, how are you?" or "What's your name?" conversation with us...those small talk conversations we all dread in the United States.

You see, Haiti IS filled with poverty. It is filled with houses that are made of tree branches and tarps. It is filled with people who barely have food, clothes, and water. It is filled with people who shower once a week in a river in the middle of the day. It is filled with people who walk miles just to get a jug of water for their families. It is filled with people who rely on the sun to know what time it is or when it's time to go to sleep, because they don't have electricity. And it is filled with thousands of children who don't have parents or families.

Knowing this, the first thing that probably comes to our minds is: how sad. How sad it is to live in this kind of environment. How sad it must be to have a child run up to you and hold your hand as you are walking through the village, just because they normally don't get that affection. How sad that children are running around without clothes or diapers on, because their parents can't afford it. How sad that some of the people survive on a meal of rice once a day. How sad.

But you see, despite all this, I think the real statement is how sad we are. How sad it is that we have so much in our lives, have so much food, shelter, clothes, family, water... and we take it all for granted. We waste it. And worse, we strive for more.

The Haitians are the com-

plete opposite. They are praising God every second of every day for the little they have. They are appreciating every second of life and every scrap of food they can provide for themselves and for their families. They even appreciate something as simple as a picture we printed out for them, because they had never even seen their own face, let alone have ever had a picture of themselves.

There are so many little things we take advantage of because we tend to forget how fortunate we really are. So my challenge to you is to start noticing the beauty in your lives, and to appreciate everything you have. Start appreciating your family, friends, food, water, electricity, clothes, jobs, and for the amazing country we live in. Because as one of my teammates brought to our attention in Haiti: we didn't earn this lifestyle. Almost all of us didn't work hard to be here in America. We were just born into a fortunate country, while others around the world were born into poverty. There was no difference or special task we did to be here. But as our leader said, with that great fortune is a responsibility. We have a responsibility to appreciate every little thing we have, and a responsibility to help the ones that don't have much.

As much as I want to tell you to take a trip to another country to help others, I know that not everyone can just get up and go. But there are so many ways you can help from afar. Our team is still trying to help the Haitians from afar by collecting clothes, shoes, diapers, etc. and sending it out to Haiti for the people who need it. If you would like to donate,

I delivered the poor who cried for help, and the orphan who had no helper. Job 29:12

One of the things we tend to forget, overlook or just simply ignore when thinking about adoption is how desperately needy some children are. This came to mind again when hearing the story of a couple who felt the need to share their family of six with a child from Guatemala.

All that's known about young Heidy Paola is that she was found in a cardboard box by the side of the road. She was less than a year old, abandoned to die until a policeman walked over to dispose of what he thought was an empty carton. Inside he found a sunburned, dehydrated infant, still breathing... somehow.

His decision to take her to a nearby orphanage probably wasn't automatic. Many children are left unwanted in underprivileged countries, where poverty and need outrank parental concern in case after case. One more wasn't a surprise. But because of God's working through one man's rescue efforts, a little baby left to die ultimately became a little girl growing up in an orphanage.

When her adoptive parents first entered the dormitory where Heidy had lived since arriving at the orphanage, she rushed from her caretaker's side and lunged into her new mommy's arms. The bond was powerful and immediate. Nothing could be closer to God's heart than this.



I firmly believe that adoption is one of the central efforts in our day that can define the Church's compassion for the world. With no one to protect them, children are in such distress. Their need is so great. May God raise up families who will reach out and give the helpless a home -- a mommy and daddy who will protect them.
