Beware of Door-to-Door Scams

CITY OF DIAMOND BAR

Diamond Bar – It starts with a knock at the door or ring of the doorbell. On the other side is a young person claiming to be selling magazine subscriptions in order to raise money for a school trip or other “worthy” cause. You place and wait for your order, but your magazines

never arrive.

Scams involving deceptive door-to-door salespeople are among the most common complaints received by the Better Business Bureau (BBB), which is why taking the following steps is strongly encouraged:

- Before making a front porch purchase, ask the salesperson to see a valid City business

license – all individuals and businesses doing work within city limits, whether or not they have a physical structure in the city, are required to have a business license.

- Do not feel pressured to make a hasty decision to purchase; instead tell the seller to give you time to think it over, and research the company or

charity with the Better Business Bureau – www.bbb.org. If you own a smart device, downloading the free BBB app is a fast and a convenient way to access a company’s report.

• If the company proves to be legitimate and you decide

2,313 Arrested During DUI Campaign

LA COUNTY SHERIFF

LA County - The 2013 Summer/Labor Day Holiday DUI Mobilization crackdown on drunk and drugged drivers has ended and resulted in a sig-

nificant number of DUI arrests from the sobriety checkpoints, special saturation patrols and routine patrols in Los Angeles County for the past 18 days.

From 12:01 a.m. Fri., Aug. 16, through midnight Mon.,

Sept. 2, 2013 officers representing 100 county law enforcement agencies have arrested 2,313 individuals for driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs. In 2012, 2,098 DUI arrests occurred

during the same time period.

Two individuals have been arrested on felony DUI charges causing death. Reports are still

\$750 Million Energy Crisis Settlement

California - Back in 2000 and 2001, California experienced an energy crisis due to a shortage of electricity. You might remember the large-scale rolling blackouts, the bankruptcy of Pacific Gas and Electric, the threat to Southern California Edison, and other

economic calamities caused by inflated electricity prices, market manipulations and illegal pipeline closures. With decreased supply and an 800% increase in wholesale pricing for the better part of 2000 in company with drought, economic fall-out was a given. Millions of businesses and consumers were affected.

One of the utility companies accused of overcharging during the crisis, British Columbia’s Powerex, Inc. (a subsidiary of British Columbia Hydro & Power Authority), will pay \$750 million to settle market manipulation

month old son by swinging him by the neck with a noose-like blanket and repeatedly punching, strangling, and shaking the baby.

Joshua Allen Robey, 26, of Costa Mesa, was found guilty by a jury Aug. 19, 2013, of one felony count each of attempted murder with premeditation and deliberation, torture, and child abuse, with a sentencing enhancement for causing great bodily injury to a child under five years old. He faces a maximum term of 13 years to life in state prison at his sentencing, Sept. 27, 2013, in the North Justice Center, Fullerton. The time is to be determined.

In October 2011, Robey had a two-month old son, Baby Doe, with his girlfriend of two years. He lived on and off with his girlfriend and her mother in Anaheim until three weeks prior to the attempted murder, at which time he began living in a motel in Costa Mesa.

On Oct. 18, 2011, Robey was at the home of his girlfriend and her mother and had agreed to babysit Baby Doe. Without the defendant's knowledge, his girlfriend set up a hidden camera in the home because she believed him to be cheating.

While alone with Baby Doe and solely responsible for his care, Robey violently abused and attempted to murder the infant. He wrapped a blanket around the baby's neck, picked

him up by lifting the ends of the blanket like a noose, and swung the victim around for over a minute.

Robey laid Baby Doe back down and punched him several times in the chest with closed fists. On multiple occasions he strangled, slapped and punched the baby and grabbed the victim by the throat with both hands, lifted him in the air, and violently shook him.

At one point while Baby Doe was crying, Robey covered the victim's mouth with his hand, grabbed him by the neck, and shook him in the air. He attempted to suffocate Baby Doe by covering the victim's face with a blanket and covering the baby's

mouth with his hand for several seconds. He also covered the victim's nose and mouth with tape to suffocate the baby.

The baby's mother discovered the abuse upon watching the video from the hidden camera. The girlfriend's mother learned of the video the following day and took the baby to the hospital. Hospital staff contacted the Anaheim Police Department (APD), who investigated this case.

Robey was arrested at a motel in Santa Ana by APD officers that night. Baby Doe suffered fractured ribs, bleeds to the brain, and liver injuries.

Deputy District Attorney Barrie Pink of the Family Protection Unit is prosecuting this case.

were arrested for murder in July.

On Sunday, July 21 at around 11:27 p.m., deputies from the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department responded to a shots fired call at a local business. Upon arrival, deputies learned that a security guard at the business was attacked by several subjects who were armed during the encounter, according to a San Bernardino Sheriff Press Release.

Feared for his life, the security

guard fired his handgun at Esteban Fierro. Due to the wounds, Fierro was transported to a nearby hospital, where he was later pronounced deceased. Detectives from the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department Homicide Detail were notified and conducted an investigation.

According to a recent San Bernardino Sheriff Press Release issued August 23, homicide detectives were able to arrest Norberto Mendoza, 24, and a Hispanic male juvenile for their involvement in the death of Esteban Fierro after the investigation. Norberto Mendoza was booked for

murder at the Central Detention Center in San Bernardino, where he is currently held without bail. The juvenile suspect was booked for murder at Juvenile Hall in San Bernardino, where he is also being held without bail, according to the San Bernardino Sheriff Department.

This investigation is ongoing and anyone with information regarding this investigation is urged to contact Detective Bill Doemner or Sergeant Trevis Newport at (909)387-3589. to proceed with the purchase, be certain to get transaction details in writing. In addition to a contract or receipt, the salesperson is legally required to tell you about your cancellation rights and provide you with two copies of a cancellation form.

Remember, the Federal Trade Commission's (FTC's) Cooling-Off Rule allows you to cancel certain purchases made from home valued at \$25 or more; to obtain a full refund you must do this before midnight of the third business day after the sale.

If you have been a victim of fraudulent door-to-door sales,





allegations in 2000 and 2001. The deregulation of the California electricity market, created by 1996 legislation, was taken advantage of by Powerex (and other companies), who purchased and exported enormous quantities of electricity to Canada, only to sell it back to California at excessive prices.

According to a Press Release

issued by the California Department of Water Resources (DWR) on Friday, August 16, 2013, money from the settlement will be used to offset the future electricity bills of Pacific Gas & Electric, Southern California Edison, and San Diego Gas & Electric ratepayers. DWR helped to end California's energy crisis in 2001 and 2002 by purchasing wholesale electricity under long-term contracts on behalf of the three California

utilities.

Once approved by the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission, the settlement will help to offset the monthly bills of millions of Californians. This is such a positive outcome, and one that has been a long time in negotiation. The DWR Press Release also states that over 50 settlements have been reached with various sellers that will result in nearly \$4 billion in refunds to ratepayers.




