Eastvale – During the closed session portion of last night's City Council Meeting, City Manager, Carol Jacobs, abruptly resigned, effective immediately. According to City Attorney, John Cavanaugh, he will serve as the City Manager until the next City

Council meeting on Sept. 10.

At that meeting council members will announce an interim person until a permanent City Manager can be selected. The decision to appoint the City Attorney as next-in-command was

Eastvale – On Tues., Aug. 12, Lieutenant Patrick Libertone passed away while on duty. A beloved husband, father, friend, and member of the community, Pat will be greatly missed.

Lt. Libertone was conducting a traffic stop in the City of Eastvale after a driver had recklessly cut him off. After speaking with

the driver of the vehicle, Libertone collapsed on the sidewalk as he was walking back to his patrol car. An off-duty paramedic who happened to be nearby attempted to revive Libertone by commencing CPR and other lifesaving measures until other medical assistance

CNUSD Requests New Bond

Eastvale – On August 5, the Corona-Norco School Board voted to place a \$396 million bond measure on the November ballot. This bond comes

just eight years after Measure U, a 30-year, \$250 million bond, for which less than 17 percent of the money went directly to Eastvale. Most of the funds were used to rehab schools in Corona and Norco.

This new bond, referred to as the Corona-Norco Bond, would be used to upgrade classrooms, science labs



Meet New Councilman Tessari

Eastvale - Recently selected to replace Jeff DeGrandpre at the August 6 City Council meeting – by unanimous vote – Joseph M. Tessari has taken the vacant council seat in Eastvale to fill the remainder of the term.

Tessari is a Marine Corps veteran who served with the Infantry and Military police. He

is a Pennsylvania native who became a resident of California in 1987. Tessari worked as an independent contractor in the real estate appraisal industry before being appointed as a Los Angeles County Deputy Sheriff in 1995. He currently works as a Detective for LASD, and is committed to a higher quality, proactive law enforcement presence in our community.

Tessari moved to the Eastvale area with his wife, Lanee,

and their three children in 2006. All of their children have attended or currently attend Eastvale Elementary, River Heights Intermediate and Roosevelt High.

Tessari was a proponent of Eastvale's incorporation and served as one of the City's first Planning Commissioners until August 2014. His new term as a City Council member will end in November 2016.

Tessari frequently volunteers in the community. He is

a board member for the Eastvale Kiwanis Club, and has served as the club's President for the past two years. He is a volunteer in his church and an active member of our community. Tessari can be found at most local community events enjoying the company of fellow residents.

Moving forward, Tessari believes the City needs to remain focused on economic development, superior public safety, and fiscal responsibility.

Eastvale To Implement Bike Master Plan

Eastvale - Recently, the City of Eastvale has endured many heartbreaking tragedies. After the bicycle-related death of Troy Davids, 21, bicycle safety is a popular topic. As a result, Eastvale is in the talks of developing what they are calling, a "Bicycle Master Plan."

The purpose of the Bicycle Master Plan, or BMP, is to promote bicycling by creating a safe, convenient, and visible network for people to use by recommending both bicycle programs and infrastructure projects. The

Plan's ultimate goal would be to provide a safety network for bicyclists, and to advocate that education and enforcement can save many lives.

The BMP is a comprehensive planning approach that will identify bicycle transitions and connections throughout the City. The connections will be evaluated based off of existing street conditions as well as possible new opportunities for further growth. Some of the programs that will be recommended involve the rules of the road, police enforcement, bicycling education and encouragement.

The BMP will coordinate with the police department to identify safety concerns in problem locations, and discuss measures that could be implemented immediately to help address the issues.

In addition to the new programs, projects, and planning, new bicycle safety laws are also being implemented. For example, one of the new bills that is in the works would enact the Three Feet for Safety Act. According to the California Legislative Information site (leginfo.legislature.ca.gov), the Three Feet for Safety Act would "...

require the driver of a motor vehicle overtaking and passing a bicycle that is proceeding in the same direction on a highway at a distance of less than three feet of the bike or its rider. A person in violation of the new law could be punished with a \$35 fine, and an imposition of a \$220 fine on the driver if a collision occurs as a result of breaking the Three Feet rule. The bill would make these provisions operative on Sept. 16, 2014.

The bill would prohibit (with a few specific exceptions) a

vehicle's driver from passing a bicycle that is proceeding in the same direction on a highway at a distance of less than three feet of the bike or its rider. A person in violation of the new law could be punished with a \$35 fine, and an imposition of a \$220 fine on the driver if a collision occurs as a result of breaking the Three Feet rule. The bill would make these provisions operative on Sept. 16, 2014.

Workshops for the BMP will be integrated into the City events, and the various projects will be implemented as funding is obtained.

a decision made just recently at the Aug. 13 council meeting; a motion that was moved by councilmember William Link and passed with a 3-1 vote (with council members Welch abstaining, and Mayor Pro-Team

Adam rush voting No).

Councilmember Link said, "We are sad to see Carol go and wish her the best in any future endeavors she plans to pursue."

According to Link, the City Council will begin reviewing applicants for the position and will

hire an interim City Manager for 60 to 90 days while they finalize the ideal candidate choice. This will take place after the City posts the position, which according to Public Information Officer, Michele Nissen, should take a few weeks.

According to Nissen, the

City cannot provide information about matters that happen during closed sessions, however, the City wishes Jacobs the best.

Mayor Pro-Tem Adam Rush said, "Carol is a great City Manager and devoted everything to establishing the City's solid

foundation. I wish her the best and know she will succeed in her career as a City Administrator."

Carol Jacobs has been the City Manager for Eastvale just shy of two years, and made approximately \$204,000, plus benefits.

Watch Your BAC: DUI Prevention In Eastvale

Eastvale – The Eastvale Traffic Team – in its continued dedication to public safety – conducted a special DUI Prevention Program at the local Buffalo Wild Wings restaurant on Fri., Aug. 15. The purpose of the program was to educate the public on just how alcohol may affect you. While many residents were concerned that the event would deter business

at the restaurant, the opposite seemed to happen.

Officers of the Traffic Team made their way throughout Buffalo Wild Wings, located in Eastvale's Gateway shopping center, performing screenings on willing participants. The team performed Blood Alcohol Content (B.A.C.) analyses using a Preliminary Alcohol Screening device, or PAS. The popular restaurant, which is equal parts family seating and sports bar, was packed that night as patrons were approaching officers and eagerly

awaiting their turns.

The legal alcohol limit is 0.08%, and many participants were surprised to see that they were above that level. It was also interesting to see how people of different sizes were affected by the same amounts of alcohol.

Throughout the night, participants were educated about the dangers of driving under the influence. They enjoyed a fun event with our local law enforcement, who takes a proactive approach in the education of our citizens.

Meet Captain Jason Horton

Eastvale – The Eastvale Police Department – in contract with the Riverside County Sheriff's Department – is under the command of Captain Jason Horton, acting as Police Chief. The personnel under Horton's command operate out of the Jurupa Valley Station, and they are dedicated to providing progressive, innovative and efficient public safety.

Horton began his law enforcement career with the Riverside County Sheriff's Department in 1989 as a Reserve Deputy Sheriff, patrolling the communities now serviced by the Jurupa Valley Station. At the time, he was the youngest Reserve Deputy Sheriff to be hired in the history of the Department, at age 19.

Four years later, in 1993, Horton graduated from the Riverside County Sheriff's Basic Academy, was hired as a full-time Deputy Sheriff. During the time Horton spent as a Deputy Sheriff, and subsequent promotions to the ranks of Senior Deputy Sheriff and Corporal, he held assignments in corrections and field operations. While assigned to patrol, Horton held collateral assignments as a Field Training Offi-

cer, Special Enforcement Team member, and School Resource Officer at Jurupa Valley High School. The majority of his field service time was spent patrolling communities within Jurupa Valley.

Horton was promoted to the rank of Sergeant in 2004. He worked as a sergeant for five years and was assigned to the jail, academy training unit, and patrol. In 2009, Horton was promoted to Lieutenant and was assigned to the jail, patrol, and the Special Investigations Bureau. During this time, Horton was involved in transitioning three newly created contract cities from previous unincorporated county areas including Eastvale, Jurupa Valley, and Menifee. Each of these cities began with newly created teams of existing Sheriff's personnel to provide law enforcement services to their jurisdictions. Horton was promoted to Captain in 2013 and is currently assigned to Jurupa Valley Patrol as the Station Commander.

Horton has earned a Bachelor's Degree from California State University San Bernardino in Criminal Justice, and a Master's Degree from the University of Redlands in Management. Horton is a graduate of Class #214 of the Sherman Block Supervisory Leadership Course

(SLI), a leadership school for law enforcement sergeants throughout the state.

Horton is proud to be the fourth generational member of his family to serve in law enforcement, which started with his great-grandfather being a member of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police in the early 1900s, serving in the Yukon Territory. Horton's father was also a member of the department, serving almost 30 years with much of it patrolling in the Jurupa Valley area. Horton is married, has four school-aged children, and resides in Riverside, California, where he has lived most of his life.



CNUSD Renames One School And Announces Another

Eastvale - Corona-Norco Unified School District (CNUSD) will rename Yorba Elementary as Ronald Reagan Elementary.

After researching the area's history, CNUSD Board Member, Bill Newberry, found that the Yorba Family Rancho was actually on the other side of the Santa Ana River. The District had decided to name the school Yorba Elementary after the Yorba family in 2005. However, with the latest findings, the

Board recently voted to rename the school.

The future Ronald Reagan Elementary is currently under construction on Fieldmaster Street, next to Half Moon Park in Eastvale, and is expected to open for the 2015-2016 School year.

Previous Clara Barton Principal, Susan Helms, has been selected as the future school's first principal.

With many of Eastvale's schools at or near capacity, there is good news that another elementary school will be con-

structed to serve students in the area north of Schleisman Roach and east of Archibald Avenue.

Philistine Rondo Elementary will be the seventh elementary school in Eastvale, and will most likely open five to six years from now. The District is still trying to secure land and additional information prior to construction.

Rondo Elementary will be named after Philistine Rondo, who was the first woman and African American superintendent in CNUSD. She taught for

12 years at Garretson Elementary in Corona, and became an interim superintendent in 1993.





and technology systems for career and technical education classes, including infrastructure for wireless Internet access for almost every school in the district. In addition, the bond would be used to replace or repair old roofs, plumbing, electrical, etc. Portable classrooms and security systems may also be replaced, as well as upgrades to fences, gates, classroom locks and outdoor lights.

But what does this mean for Eastvale? How do we ensure that our schools get their fair share of the bond money as opposed to the mere 17 percent Eastvale schools received in 2006? At a school bond discussion meeting a few months back with various members of the community and CNUSD Superintendent, Michael Lin, councilmember William Link expressed this very concern.

"As a councilmember representing this City, I expressed my concern that any money paid by Eastvale residents toward the bond needs to be kept in Eastvale Schools. Once I received a copy of the bond I forwarded it on to our City Attorney, John Cavanaugh,

ugh, to review and really make sure that the verbiage is clear and accurate."

Many in Eastvale feel that our schools did not get their fair share of the last bond, especially when Eastvale residents pay such high taxes. On a recent Facebook group discussion, Eastvale Resident Lisett Beytia said, "I will be voting NO. I don't think the school district has really shown how my bond money has benefited the Eastvale schools. I know it's selfish, but if I'm paying ex-

tra taxes for schools I want the money to stay in Eastvale. □"

CNUSD board member, Bill Newberry, who was not on the board during the 2006 Measure U Bond vote, would also like to ensure that bond money paid by Eastvale residents stays in Eastvale.

"I have been in meetings with bond attorneys, tax attorneys, bonding companies, our District's legal staff, and I have ensured, as Bill Link said, that in the legal Bond Resolution it will stipulate that the money

raised in each community of our district will be spent in that community of our district. I will make certain that a legal document is made available to anyone. This bond will ask for \$24 per \$100,000 of Assessed Value, so in Eastvale approximately \$96 per year."

One of the biggest items that the new bond could affect is the overcrowding of Eleanor Roosevelt High School. According to Newberry, ERHS will reach capacity by the 2015-2016 school year. If the bond passes, one of the biggest items and most expensive projects would be

the proposed Academy/Magnet High School to be located in the back of the High School parking lot. The new school would be geared toward high end Science, Technology, Engineering, and Medicine academics and house approximately 800 students.

As more information comes out about the bond, one thing is certain, do your homework. Stay informed, ask questions and really read what you are voting for. For more information about school bonds check out CNUSD's website at <http://www.cnusd.k12.ca.us>.

JCSD Successful In \$97 Million Refinance

Jurupa Valley – The Jurupa Community Services District (JCSD) has successfully completed the refinancing of \$97,030,000 in special tax bonds for 11 Community Facilities Districts (CFDs). Many new communities, such as Eastvale, require the construction of infrastructure such as parks and public facilities, street lights, and connections to water and sewer systems. CFDs levy special property taxes paid by homeowners for the construction of such infrastructure, also known as Mello-Roos.

This refinancing is estimated to generate approximately \$962,000 of annual debt service savings. The total savings

over the life of the bond in today's dollars is equivalent to approximately \$13,154,000 savings for property owners. As a result of the lower debt service payments, the homeowners will have a reduced special tax levy beginning with the upcoming December 2014 property tax bill. The annual per parcel tax savings for each of the 11 CFDs will range between \$63 and \$342, depending on location.

The refinancing of existing CFD bonds does not extend the original terms of repayment to maximize the total interest savings for each resident of the CFD.

This refinancing reflects JCSD's ongoing commitment to maintain the lowest cost

financing available for the CFD debt. JCSD reviews the CFD debt on an ongoing basis and refinances existing debt when there is an opportunity for savings. The current round of refinancing was preceded by \$33 million of CFD debt that JCSD refinanced in 2013. That refinancing produced a total of \$1.86 million of savings for four CFDs and generated more than \$148,000 in annual debt service savings for these four districts.

The total combined amount refinanced in 2013 and 2014 is approximately 40% of the total CFD debt outstanding.

arrived at the scene. Libertone was transferred to Corona Medical Center, where doctors continued to attempt to save his life; however, they were not successful. He was soon afterward pronounced dead due to a massive heart attack that claimed his life.

Libertone lived in Eastvale with his wife and the youngest of his six children. He had served the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department for 31 years, and was assigned to the Fraud and Cyber Crimes Bureau before his passing.

Throughout his years of service and involvement within the

community, Libertone was the recipient of many awards and recognitions. Beloved by his family, friends, and coworkers, he will continue to be missed by many. At the memorial service, loved ones shared stories about how he was "born to be a cop," always quick to put the needs of others before his own, and how he loved a good laugh.

Not only are the people that knew Libertone directly feeling the loss of such a great man, but the community has been greatly impacted as well. As a result, many have banded together to provide support to Libertone's family. On the morning of the services, the community paid respect and showed support to his family

by making signs and gathering to see his funeral procession off. Children from the nearby schools stood on the sidewalks waving American flags proudly and holding up signs thanking him for his service.

City council recap

vale, addressed the council. Ravaro has lived in Eastvale for many years and has been the victim of excessively loud noises coming from parties held at a home in her neighborhood. These parties have been going on for three years and she felt the Police Department should be doing more about it. The decibel level is reportedly so high in her house that even with the television on high and all her windows shut, she can still hear the noise. She pleaded with Council to help her find some type of resolution.

Todd Corbin with JCSD reported to the Council about actions that would need to take place in response to the recent state drought regulations passed by Governor Brown. JCSD will need to come up with a water shortage plan and an ordinance to comply with these regulations. More information about this issue can be found on their website at www.jcsd.us. Once JCSD prepares their plan, it will be brought back to Council for review.

The Consent Calendar was approved 5-0, with the exception of item 5.3, an update on the City's Strategic Plan. The

item was pulled because new information was recently requested and staff needed time to update for accuracy.

There were no Public Hearings or Old Business Items.

The New Business section of the meeting included Item 8.1, which was tabled for discussion at a later date. Items 8.2 through 8.4 were passed, 5-0. Item 8.5, the approval of the City's Local Hazard Mitigation Plan was also approved, 5-0. This resolution is for Eastvale's eligibility for state and federal funding in the event of a major disaster. Even though the City is in the process of updating the plan, the approval was needed to ensure coverage for Eastvale. Item 8.6 was for the purchase of a Paramedic Squad for Eastvale Fire Services in the amount of \$151,565. The cost was already included in the 2013-2014 budget, and the Item was approved, 5-0.

For Item 8.7, Temporary Signs in the Public Right of Way, an ordinance was passed earlier this year outlining guidelines for when and where signs may be placed on public property. This ordinance applies to campaign signs as well. There have been some issues with this as candidates who are not well known rely on signage to

get their names out into the community. After much discussion, the ordinance will remain as is until another solution can possibly be found.

Item 8.8 discussed the Chain of Command in the City of Eastvale. It was decided that in the event the City Manager is unable to accomplish assigned duties due to an emergency event or vacancy, the City Attorney will be the next in command.

Item 8.9, called for an amendment to the 2014-2015 budget to fund crossing guards for the intersections at Peach Blossom and Scholar Way, as well as Scholar Way and Baltimore Street. This item passed, 5-0. Items 8.10 through 8.12 also passed, 5-0. There was not a City Manager's Report.

In Council Communications, council members Tessari and Welch expressed their condolences over the passing of Lt. Patrick Libertone. The Meeting was adjourned at 8:40 p.m.

The second City Council meeting of the month was held on August 27, with all council members present. The invocation was led by Pastor Tim Eaton of Edgewater Lutheran Church. There were a few presentation's given by the City. Certificates of Appreciation were given to the National Night Out Participants: WOLFF, Target, Eastvale Com-

munity Foundation, Tequila 88, and the volunteers from the Riverside Sheriff's Department. Rollin Edmunds gave a presentation regarding school boundaries in the Corona-Norco Unified School District. Sharyn Link, with the Eastvale Community Foundation, gave an update and announced the two newest board members. City Manager, Carol Jacobs, gave an update for the Public Safety Commission, as they were unable to attend.

During the Public Comment/Citizen Participation section of the meeting, Dickie Simmons asked the Council to reconsider making any decisions regarding the City Manager position so close to an upcoming election. Mr. Simmons cited that many cities have a policy of not making decisions concerning City Managers within 60 to 90 days of an election.

Mangie Rios with the 88 iMPACT Foundation thanked the community for attending the first annual iMPACT Festival. They had over 30 vendors, 400 participants, and are excited to be working on several other future events. They also presented the Military Banner Program with a check for \$1,419.76, enough to pay for eight more military banners.

The Consent Calendar was approved, 5-0. There were no Public Hearings.

In the Old Business Section of the meeting, Items 7.1 through 7.5 were approved, 5-0.

In the New Business Section of the meeting, Item 8.1, an agreement to enter into a professional agreement for Architectural and Engineering Services with WLC Architects for Eastvale Fire Station 2, in the amount of \$436,000, was approved, 5-0.

For Item 8.2, staff asked the Council permission to close City Hall on Columbus Day to allow the staff a day for Records Retentions. With the amount of plans and other public record items increasing, staff felt the need to take an entire day to concentrate on organizing and properly handling the items. Council asked them to consider doing this on a Friday when the office is already closed to the public. The Item was continued to the next meeting.

Items 8.3 through 8.8 were also discussed. After brief comments and exchanges between the council members and the City staff, the meeting was adjourned. For a more in-depth look at the agenda please visit www.cityofeastvale.com.

to 17. After several minutes passed, the adult noticed that one of the small children was unresponsive in the pool. Although Pan received CPR immediately, he was ultimately unable to be resuscitated. Pan died a few hours after he arrived at Kaiser Foundation Hospital in Ontario.

In another tragic accident, Jeterra Jones, 34, and her son, Jordan Millan, 2, were found deceased in a backyard swimming pool in the 6900

block of Farmall Way. According to a Press release from the Riverside Sheriff's Department, Deputies arrived at the residence at 8:30 a.m. on Aug. 24 and immediately located the two individuals. At this time there are no signs of foul play and all evidence leads to this incident also being an accidental drowning.

The Riverside Sheriff's Department reminds the public that pool submersions involving children happen very quickly and often there is no splashing to alert anyone that the child is

in trouble. In order to prevent accidental drowning, parents and caregivers should constantly supervise children and install barriers such as doors, fences, gates with latches, audible alarms, or pool safety covers. During social gatherings at or near a swimming pool, a "designated watcher" should be appointed to protect young children from pool accidents. 

Inside Baseball

"I know that you want truth to be in my heart. You teach me wisdom deep down inside me," Psalm 51:6.

Sometimes in the midst of correcting your kids, you can easily lose sight of the main reason you discipline them in the first place. It's not just to get their clothes picked up, or to eat

the meal you've prepared, or to stop hitting a sibling. The reason for discipline is to develop inner character, the kind that knows and is learning how to respond to life's challenges.

The core of a baseball is made of hard rubber. But imagine if the core were marshmallow. What would happen as the string wrapped around it or when a bat smacked it hard several times? It would smash into a mess.

It's the inside that counts; the character you're growing in your children. As life begins to happen, as circumstances and

decisions begin to wrap around them, it's their character that will hold them together.

Tami and I define character as "response-ability" - the ability to make the right choices in response to authority and to life's circumstances. From the time your children leave the cradle, your work as a parent is to turn life situations into teaching situations, growing their "response-ability" one day at a time, teaching them how to respond to you, to others, to life and to God.

In the next few days, you'll

have plenty of opportunities either to overreact to your children's behavior or to address the roots of their development, and to deal with externals or to train their hearts. Remember, you're growing character here. It's only the ones who grow strong at the center - especially as character is strengthened by commitment to God's Word - who are able to hold up to the challenges they will face in life.

Live it: One of the biggest challenges to a parent is building character on the fly, in the midst of a busy schedule and a

family with a multitude of different needs. Talk about how you can take advantage of natural teaching opportunities to train your children in how they should respond.

Pray: Pray for God to give you the discernment to know what issues need to be addressed and what issues you need to let go.

Chino PD Issues Warning - Family Emergency Scam

CITY OF CHINO

Chino - Across the county, people are falling victim to a nationwide scam in which individuals pose as family members and urge victims to wire thousands of dollars due to an emergency. In another scenario, callers claim to be employed by the IRS and are calling to collect a debt.

Although the circumstances vary from case to case, typical schemes include using information (usually obtained via the internet, including social media sites and illegally obtained email) to impersonate a family member and/or a legal represen-

tative, such as a lawyer. This individual often insists that the victim keep the request confidential and asks that the money be wired immediately. By the time the person realizes they have been victimized, the money is gone and cannot be traced. Most cases lead law enforcement to locations outside of the county, making

these crimes very difficult to investigate.

If found in this situation, Officers of the Chino Police Department urge residents and members of the business community to protect themselves by utilizing the following prevention tips:

- Resist the urge to act im-

mediately, regardless of the sense of urgency implied by the caller.

- Verify the identity of the person by asking specific questions a stranger could not answer.

- Try to contact the alleged family member if possible.

- Verify the story with some-

one close to the family member.

- Report possible fraud to your local law enforcement officials.
