

### Visit The 'New' Walnut Library



### Did You Know?

Christmas, the annual festival observing the birth of Jesus Christ is celebrated by billions of people all over the world as a religious and cultural celebration, Christian and non-Christian alike.

Technically speaking, "Christmas" – an Old English term meaning, "Christ's Mass" - is celebrated on December 25. Historians estimate that the year of Jesus' birth was sometime between 7 and 2 B.C., according to Wikipedia; however, the actual date is not known. Around the 4th century, the Western Christian Church attached December 25 to Christmas. It is possible that the date may have initially been chosen to align exactly nine months after early Christians believed Jesus was conceived.

Modern day celebration of the Nativity is often centered around gift-giving - akin to the gifts the three wise men brought to the Christ child in Bethlehem – family and social gatherings, a special meal, church services, decorations and Christmas trees.

The trees actually have more purpose than as an umbrella for presents. They are more of a representation of Christianity. Evergreens - fir, pine, and spruce which don't lose their needles, but stay green year-round - symbolize Jesus' everlasting love; the

shape, a triangle, represents the holy Trinity (Father, Son and Spirit): the shape also points to Heaven; and the tree itself, represents the wood of the Cross.

The birth of Jesus is recorded in two of the Biblical Gospels. In the book of Luke. Chapter 2, "Christmas" was announced thusly: "8 Now there were in the same country shepherds living out in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. 9 And behold, an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were greatly afraid. 10 Then the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid, for behold, I bring you good tidings of great joy which will be to all people. 11 For there is born to you this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord. 12 And this will be the sign to you: You will find a Babe wrapped in swaddling cloths, lying in a manger. 13 And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God and saying: 14 "Glory to God in the highest, And on earth peace, goodwill toward men!"

And this leads us to Santa Claus, Saint Nicholas, Father Christmas. Delighting children with the promise of presents if they are on the Nice List, the portly, bearded, red-suited cherub is the stuff sugar-plumb dreams are made of. With a team of elves and reindeer, this "right jolly old elf" dates back,

perhaps, to Saint Nicholas, a 4th century Greek Christian bishop, known for his generous gifts to the poor.

While Saint Nicholas was a real person, the evolution to the magical Santa Claus of today has had many variations throughout the world, but almost always has been related to the gifting of children or the poor.

In America, an anonymous poem called "Old Santeclaus" describing an old man on a reindeer sleigh bring presents to children – presented itself in New York in 1821. That poem was later attributed to Clement Clarke Moore, and is commonly known today as "The Night Before Christmas."

So, Merry Christmas, Happy Hanukkah, and Happy Kwanzaa! Whatever you celebrate during this holiday season, here's hoping it was filled with love, joy, laughter and peace.

### Attorney guilty of helping launder marijuana profits

Brizendine, 59, of Long Beach, were entered on Mon., Dec. 15, by United States District Judge, James V. Selna. Monday's action concludes proceedings in which Brizendine pleaded guilty to two counts, money laundering and conspiracy to structure cash deposits to avoid federal reporting requirements.

According to the United States Attorney's Office, Brizendine was an attorney for John Melvin Walker, who operated marijuana stores across Los Angeles and Orange counties and generated approximately \$25 million in income over a six-year period. Brizendine conspired with Walker and others to accept cash from the marijuana operation and invest the funds into several corporations. According to court documents,

Brizendine agreed to accept was announced after Judge more than \$10,000 in cash and then make smaller deposits into different bank accounts so as to not trigger federal requirements that financial institutions report currency transactions of more than \$10,000 (this process is called structuring cash transactions). By pleading guilty, Brizendine specifically admitted that he structured approximately \$389,700 for Walker.

The case against Brizendine

Selna unsealed documents associated with the case.

Last year, Walker was sentenced to nearly 22 years in federal prison for operating a chain of marijuana establishments and failing to report millions of dollars in revenues was on his taxes.

Brizendine is scheduled to be sentenced on May 4, 2015. At that time, he will face a statutory maximum sentence of ten years in federal prison. Until that time,

he will remain free on a \$500,000 bond.

The investigation of Brizendine and the marijuana operation was conducted by the Orange County Sheriff's Department; the Drug Enforcement Administration; the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives; IRS-Criminal Investigation; the California Board of Equalization: the Orange County District Attorney's Office; and the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

out prejudice (meaning charges could be re-filed should new evidence come to light). A San Bernardino County District Attorney's Office spokesman is reported as stating that based on their investigation, they were unable to move forward with the case.

Bramlett was initially charged with oral copulation of a child under age 18, and penetration with a foreign object. However, there are reports that the two boys, who accused the teacher of abuse, recanted their story

this past November. There are also alleged reports that one of the boys was in the midst of a burglary at the teacher's home, and used the abuse fabrication to shield his own crimes during interrogation. CBSLA.com previously reported Bramlett's attorney as saying that the first alleged victim "...was facing firstdegree burglary charges when these allegations came up, so he clearly had motivation to be dishonest."

Bramlett, who was free on \$100,000 bail, has been on administrative leave from her job as a Program Specialist. She will be working with the San Bernardino City Unified School District on what steps are needed to return to her job.

At this time, there is no word on whether charges will be brought against Bramlett's ac-

was unable to be resuscitated. A few years previous, Jesse told his family he wanted to become a donor if anything should happen to him; a fortuitous decision for others.

Diamond Bar's Lo family will honor 78-year old donor, Sandy Lo, who not only lived a life of grace and giving to others, but saved the lives of five others through her donations. Lo was an immigrant from Taiwan who worked her way up in the clothing industry. She continued to volunteer in her community long after retirement; including cooking meals for Hurricane Sandy victims in a tireless effort that family reportedly says was just part of her everyday demeanor. Lo passed away in February 2013 from a stroke.

Glendora's 48-year old Joseph

has benefitted more than 95 individuals with cornea, tissue and bone transplants from his gifts. His memory has been greatly enhanced through his donor wishes. Culver's January 1st birthday will also be remembered at the Rose Parade.

For the families of these individuals, there is a certain solace associated with the gifts of life that have occurred because of these acts of generosity. Knowing that your loved one lives on through others, and has created so many possibilities in those lives brings about bittersweet consolation.

"The Never-Ending Story" is the title of the Donate Life Rose Parade float, and it features "beautiful butterflies emerging from storybooks to symbolize the enduring power of organ, eye and tissue donation and transplantation. The butterflies ascend above 72 volumes adorned with Floragraph portraits – all created with organic "Jody" Culver, who in October materials – of deceased donors Parade Float and organ donation, 2008 suffered a fatal heart attack, whose legacies are nurtured by visit www.donatelifecalifornia.org.

The 126th Tournament of Roses Parade begins on New Year's Day 2015 at 8 a.m. and features floral floats, marching bands and equestrian units that all travel the more than five miles down Colorado Boulevard in Pasadena. 




