

# History 101

### First Drive-In Movie Theater Opens

On June 4 in 1933, eager motorists park their automobiles on the grounds of Park-In Theaters, the first-ever drive-in movie theater, located on Crescent Boulevard in Camden, New Jersey.

Park-In Theaters-the term "drive-in" came to be widely used only later-was the brainchild of Richard Hollingshead, a movie fan and a sales manager at his father's company, Whiz Auto Products, in Camden. Reportedly inspired by his mother's struggle to sit comfortably in traditional movie theater seats, Hollingshead came up with the idea of an open-air theater where patrons watched movies in the comfort of their own automobiles. He then experimented in the driveway of his own house with different projection and sound techniques, mounting a 1928 Kodak projector on the hood of his car, pinning a screen to some trees, and placing a radio behind the screen for sound. He also tested ways to guard against rain and other inclement weather, and devised the ideal spacing arrangement for a number of cars so that all would have a view of the screen.

The young entrepreneur received a patent for the concept in May of 1933 and opened Park-In Theaters, Inc. less than a month later, with an initial investment of \$30,000. Advertising it as entertainment for

the whole family, Hollingshead charged 25 cents per car and 25 cents per person, with no group paying more than one dollar. The idea caught on, and after Hollingshead's patent was overturned in 1949, drivein theaters began popping up all over the country. One of the largest was the All-Weather Drive-In of Copiague, New York, which featured parking space for 2,500 cars, a kid's playground and a full service restaurant, all on a 28-acre lot.

Drive-in theaters showed mostly B-movies-that is, not Hollywood's finest fare-but some theaters featured the same movies that played in regular theaters. The initially poor sound quality-Hollingshead had mounted three speakers manufactured by RCA Victor near the screen-improved, and later technology made it possible for each car's to play the movie's soundtrack through its FM radio. The popularity of the drive-in spiked after World War Il and reached its heyday in the late 1950s to mid-60s, with some 5,000 theaters across the country. Drive-ins became an icon of American culture, and a typical weekend destination not just for parents and children but also for teenage couples seeking some privacy. Since then, however, the rising price of real estate, especially in suburban areas, combined with the growing numbers of walk-in theaters and the rise of video rentals to curb the growth of the drive-in industry. Today, fewer than 500 drive-in theaters survive in the United States. ■

## The Bible Is True

I've driven this same exact way to work every day for the last two years and I've never seen that sticker on that pole before. What are the chances that right when I was questioning the validity of the Bible, I was to see a sticker that said, "The Bible Is True"? Maybe it was a coincidence... maybe. But I didn't think it was because I wasn't looking for an answer. It just showed up.

I immediately started laughing after I saw the sticker because I felt like it was God telling me to stop doubting. God is funny in the way he teaches us. I think a sticker randomly placed on a pole did the trick.

No, the sticker didn't prove that the Bible is true. It didn't show me facts or statistics to prove my point. The sticker did more than that. I believe it showed me that I needed to stop doubting and have faith. But most importantly, I think it showed me that God actually listens. As soon as I asked Him a question about the validity, I saw that sticker. He showed His presence and His comfort in a time of doubt. I think that was better than any statistic or chart I could've seen.

So I know I may not have all the answers, and many may disagree with what this sticker meant or if the Bible is valid or not. But that's okay, because all that does is encourage me to learn more about my faith and to find the answers not for myself, but to help others believe. That's what we as believers of God should do; be like that sticker and show others that... the Bible is true. ■

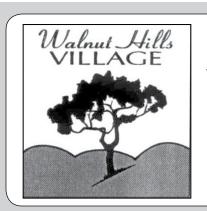

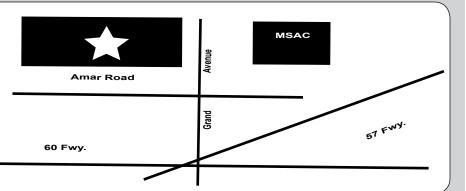

# Click It Or Ticket In Chino

STAFF REPORTS

Chino - In an effort to save lives through increased seat belt use, Chino Police Department will participate in the national Click It or Ticket campaign. With Memorial Day Holiday being one of the busiest weekends to travel, the educational enforcement period was held between May 23rd and June 5th, 2016.

Chino Police Chief, Karen Comstock states, "Time after time, we see the deadly results that come from drivers and passengers refusing to wear a seat belt." Comstock also states, "Wearing a seat belt is one of the most important steps in increasing survivability in a crash, our job is to stop those who are not buckled up, and to keep them from repeating this potentially deadly mistake."

The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) released some research from 2014; nearly half of the 21,022 passenger vehicle occupants killed in crashes nationally was unrestrained. In 2015, research showed that almost 50 percent of occupants of fatal crashes nationwide are not restrained. In other states, fatal crashes due to being unrestrained were at a high of 70 percent. Nationwide, law enforcement agencies are joining the Click It or Ticket campaign to

## Shrimp Taco Lettuce Wraps

With Smoky Chipotle Beans, Charred Fajita Veggies, and Garlic-Lime Crema.

#### By Hello Fresh

Tender Boston lettuce makes for the perfect low-carb vehicle for

tacos. A touch of chipotle powder adds a distinct smokiness to the equation. If heat isn't your thing, a cool garlic-lime crema and creamy avocado are there to cool things off.

Cooking time: 30 min Nutrition: Calories 542, CalFat 20 g, Saturated fats 4 g, Sugars 6 g

### Ingredients

- Shrimp- 10oz.
- Kidney Beans-1box
- Boston lettuce-1 head
- Sour Cream-1oz.
- Lime-1
- Garlic-2 cloves
- Chipotle Powder-1t
- Yellow Onion-1 Green Bell Pepper-1
- Avocado-1
- Olive Oil-2t

### **Preparation**

- 1. Prep the ingredients: Drain and rinse the beans. Core, seed, and remove the white veins from the bell pepper, then thinly slice. Halve and peel the onion; dice one half, thinly slice the other. Mince or grate the garlic. Zest and cut the lime into wedges. Separate the Boston lettuce into individual lettuce leaves.
- 2. Make the garlic-lime crema: In a small bowl, combine the sour cream, ½ tea-

spoon lime zest, a squeeze of lime, and up to half the garlic (start with a little and go up from there!). Season with salt and pepper.

- 3. Make the bean mixture: Heat a drizzle of oil in a medium pan over medium heat. Add the diced onion and cook, tossing, for 4-5 minutes, until softened. Add the beans, remaining garlic, and up to half the chipotle powder (add a little and go up from there!) to the pan. Cook, tossing, for 2-3 minutes, until warmed through and fragrant. Season with salt and pepper. Remove the pan from the heat.
- 4. Cook the shrimp: Heat a drizzle of oil in a large pan over mediumhigh heat. Add the peppers and onions and cook, tossing, for 6-7 minutes, until softened and lightly charred. Season with salt and pepper. Add the shrimp and as much remaining chipotle powder as you like (remember, it's spicy!). Cook, tossing, for 1-2 minutes, until the shrimp are opaque. Season with salt, pepper, and a squeeze of lime.
- 5. Quickly reheat the bean mixture over high heat. Halve, pit, and thinly slice the avocado.
- 6. Finish: Plate the shrimp, beans, avocado, and lettuce cups. Serve the garlic-lime crema to the side. Assemble the shrimp taco lettuce wraps with all the components, finishing with a squeeze of lime. Enjoy! ■



The Bonds were originally sold in 2006 as Series D Bonds in the amount of \$51 million with a final payment in 2031. The District decided to of property taxes for Inglewood homeowners and businesses. "District staff and I identified an opportunity to refinance the District's debt obligations and save the taxpayers money. This was something we could not pass on," said Dr. Matthews.

The interest rates on the old bonds ranged between 4.00% and 5.00%: new rates for the 2016 Refunding Bonds will be 3.60%, a difference that will save Inglewood property owners approximately \$5,137,000.

**IUSD Advisory Board President** Mrs. Margaret Richards-Bowers adds. "Interest rates are near alltime lows and as stewards of the District and local residents, we felt it was the right time to refinance the District's property tax bonds."
