Eastvale- We Americans love to boast about our diversity and California can be heard above all other claiming the title of most diverse. It is a very prestigious title indeed when you really look into what diversity can mean to a community. Different cultures, languages, ideas and experiences naturally will produce more new innovative information than homogeneous.

The City of Eastvale, a young community nestled in the Inland Empire, looks like it is growing

up in the right environment to be a successful community for decades to come. Eastvale is among one of the most diverse cities in America, according to an analysis by NerdWallet.com of the distribution of residents across ethnic groups.

Eastvale was ranked as the #1 most diverse city in all of Southern California and the 13th most diverse city in America. The diversity of the Eastvale community breaks down as follows: 38.6% Hispanic or Latino, 25.30% Asian or Pacific Islander, 24.20% are white (non-Hispanic) and 9.70% are

High Speed Chase Ends in Suicide

Corona- A man, who authorities believe may be connected to a Los Angeles County homicide case, shot and killed himself following a high speed pursuit that began in Hesperia and ended in Corona, on Friday, March 23.

The driver, identified as Christopher Spatz, 33, of North Hollywood, was armed with a handgun during the pursuit and was later pronounced deceased from a self-inflicted gunshot wound according to

California Highway Patrol Officials.

San Bernardino County sheriff's deputies began the pursuit around 8:45p.m. on Friday night. They informed the CHP that their deputies were heading south on the 15 Freeway in Hesperia and were in pursuit of a Toyota Tacoma pickup that had been reported as stolen.

The pursuit began when a deputy from Hesperia, who was in the area of Mariposa Road

Sheriff Honored by City Council

Norco- The Riverside County Sheriff's Department team, who were responsible for thwarting an attack on Norco College, were honored by the Norco City Council. The forward thinking team used creative methods to stop the attack before the suspect could even start it.

20-30 people who worked for 18 hours straight on February 19 to identify and locate the suspect before his planned plot was able to be carried out. Fatal Traffic Accident in Corona

Corona - On Friday, March 16, 2018, at approximately 9:14 a.m., the Corona Police Department and the Corona Fire Department responded to a traffic collision involving two vehicles near the intersection of Magnolia Avenue and All American Way.

Upon arrival, bystanders were performing C.P.R. on one of the involved drivers. Paramedics, the Corona Fire Department and American Medical Response took over the patients' care at the scene. After attempting to resuscitate the driver for several minutes, the driver was pronounced deceased.

The other driver at the scene suffered minor injuries but did not require immediate medical attention. The two vehicles at the scene sustained major collision damage and needed to be towed. Several hours later, it was determined that a third vehicle was involved in the col-

lision but had unknowingly left the scene. The third driver later returned to the scene and provided a statement. Their vehicle suffered only minor damage and they were not injured. It has not yet been determined if drugs or alcohol were a factor in this collision.

The Riverside County Coroner's Office responded to the scene. The name of the deceased driver is being withheld at this time pending notification to their family. The Corona Police Department Collision Response Team started their investigation of this collision and it is ongoing. Magnolia Avenue between All American Way and Trademark Circle was closed for several hours in order to complete the investigation, and is expected to reopen by approximately 6:30 p.m. this evening.

Motorcyclist Killed, Corona Man Arrested

Corona - A Corona man was arrested for allegedly driving under the influence when he collided with a motorcyclist early Sunday morning. The collision on the westbound 60 Freeway in Jurupa Valley left the motorcyclist, a Menifee resident, dead, the California Highway Patrol said Monday, April 2.

Tonga Tavake, 59, died at the scene of the accident on the freeway just west of Valley Way, the Riverside County Coroner said Monday. Tavake was struck by several passing motorists as he lay motionless on the pavement, the CHP incident log reported.

The initial call that went out for the 4:07 a.m. crash was that a 2006 Volkswagen had collided with a center divider. Only a few minutes later, a report of a

motorcyclist down in the No. 1 (fast) lane of the freeway in the same area came across the radio, according to CHP reports. Later it was learned that the collision involved both the motorcycle, and the Volkswagen from the earlier report. The motorcycle rider had been ejected from the motorcycle, the Monday report said.

The driver of the Volkswagen, identified as a 24-year-old Wilson Mayora Jr. of Corona, was arrested on suspicion of felony driving under the influence and vehicular manslaughter. He remained in custody Monday night at the Robert Presley Detention Center in Riverside.

Fatal Accident Victim Identified as Eastvale Resident

Eastvale- On March 14, 2018, authorities identified a 24 year old male from the City of Eastvale who was a victim of a freak fatal accident that Wednesday afternoon. The deadly incident occurred on the westbound interstate 210 freeway near the Buena Vista Street off-ramp at approximately 12:42 p.m. The accident was a result of heavy metal debris that allegedly flew through the vehicle owner's windshield; which immediately affected the security of the vehicle, safety of the driver, and induced the passenger to attempt to maintain control of the vehicle, a Volkswagen Jetta. Disclosed by authorities and present witnesses, this incident was the result of a heavy unidentified vehicle (possibly an SUV or pickup truck) that seemingly drove over metal debris which instantly ascended into open air, and unintentionally plowed directly through the window of the Jetta. Although the passenger of the vehicle showed no signs of injury, the driver of the vehicle, later identified as Stace Woodward, suffered a fatal injury to the head as a result to the impact of the metal debris. Woodward was pronounced deceased shortly

after the arrival of the fire department and paramedics, despite the passenger's attempts to revive him with first aid. "Upon our arrival, we noticed that the debris had seemingly entered the Volkswagen through the windshield, and undoubtedly struck Woodward. Afterwards, the No. 1 lane of the Buena Vista Street off ramp was blocked for about three hours while the fatal crash was investigated and the scene was cleaned up." CHP Officer Rodrigo Jimenez stated. This occurrence is not only tragic and unfortunate, but has been presumably difficult to process for Woodward's family. Parents Andrew and Tiffany Woodward who referred to Stace as "A joy to our lives and beloved member of our family who brought life and love wherever he went" in the obituary to their son. The surviving family of Stace Woodward however, will be entitled to a wrongful death lawsuit, in which they will be granted the opportunity to seek compensation for damages including expenses, funeral costs, etc. While condolences are directed towards the Woodward family, if your loved one has been the victim of a wrongful death, contact the Los Angeles and Riverside Wrongful Death Attorney's at 800-235-6801. ■

Area Crime Recap: March 2018

INCIDENT: OFFICER INVOLVED SHOOTING

WHEN: 3/8/18

WHERE: 9900 Block of Willowbrook Rd., Jurupa Valley

On March 8, 2018, at about 5:35 PM, officers from the Riverside Police Department were conducting an investigation for a wanted suspect within the 9900 block of Willowbrook Road, Jurupa Valley. As the officers encountered the suspect an officer involved shooting occurred. Life-saving measures were performed, but the suspect succumbed to his injuries. No citizens or officers were injured as a result of this incident. Deputies from the Jurupa Valley Station responded and assisted Riverside Police Department personnel. Based on this being an ongoing investigation, the identity of the suspect is being withheld at this time. Riverside County Sheriff Department's Central Homicide Unit investigators responded and assumed the investigation. The Riverside Police Department also sent out an investigative team to investigate the incident. Per the Riverside Police Department's policy, the involved officers were placed on administrative leave. DETAILS: On Wednesday, March 28, 2018, about 9:44 a.m., a deputy assigned to the Norco Sheriff's Office, was patrolling near a business, located in the 1300 block of Sixth Street, in the city of Norco. While at this location, a citizen advised the deputy their vehicle had just been stolen from the business parking lot. Deputies obtained the victim's vehicle description and the last known direction of travel. Within minutes, responding deputies located the suspect driving the stolen vehicle on a nearby street. Deputies attempted to conduct an enforcement stop on the stolen vehicle; however, the suspect drove away, and a pursuit ensued. The suspect attempted to evade pursuing deputies by driving onto the northbound I-15 Freeway from Sixth Street. As the suspect drove on the freeway, he collided into a ravine near the right shoulder. The suspect exited the vehicle and attempted to flee from deputies on foot but was quickly apprehended without incident. The driver was identified as Menny Gaytan, age 28, a resident of Pomona. Gaytan was arrested for vehicle theft and evading a peace officer. Following the arrest, Gaytan was transported to a nearby hospital for a precautionary medical evaluation as a result of the vehicle collision. Gaytan was released from the hospital and later booked into the Robert Presley Detention Center in the City of Riverside for the listed charges. The Norco Sheriff's Office is committed to the safety of the citizens of Norco and will be vigilant in investigation all crimes of this nature. April 4, 1968: Dr. King is Assassinated

Just after 6 p.m. on April 4, 1968, Martin Luther King Jr. is fatally shot while standing on the balcony outside his second-story room at the Lorraine Motel in Memphis, Tennessee. The civil rights leader was in Memphis to support a sanitation workers' strike and was on his way to dinner when a bullet struck him in the jaw and severed his spinal cord. King was pronounced dead after his arrival at a Memphis hospital. He was 39 years old.

In the months before his assassination, Martin Luther King became increasingly concerned with the problem of economic inequality in America. He organized a Poor People's Campaign to focus on the issue, including an interracial poor people's march on Washington, and in March 1968 traveled to Memphis in support of poorly treated African-American sanitation workers. On March 28, a workers' protest march led by King ended in violence and the death of an African-American teenager. King left the city but vowed to return in early April to lead another demonstration.

On April 3, back in Memphis, King gave his last sermon, saying, "We've got some difficult days ahead. But it really doesn't matter with me now, because I've been to the mountaintop...And He's allowed me to go up to the mountain. And I've looked over, and I've seen the Promised Land. I may not get there with you. But I want you to know tonight that we, as a people, will get to the promised land."

One day after speaking those words, Dr. King was shot and killed by a sniper. As word of the assassination spread, riots broke out in cities all across the United States and National Guard troops were deployed in Memphis and Washington,

D.C. On April 9, King was laid to rest in his hometown of Atlanta, Georgia. Tens of thousands of people lined the streets to pay tribute to King's casket as it passed by in a wooden farm cart drawn by two mules.

The evening of King's murder, a Remington .30-06 hunting rifle was found on the sidewalk beside a rooming house one block from the Lorraine Motel. During the next several weeks, the rifle, eyewitness reports, and fingerprints on the weapon all implicated a single suspect: escaped convict James Earl Ray. A two-bit criminal, Ray escaped a Missouri prison in April 1967 while serving a sentence for a holdup. In May 1968, a massive manhunt for Ray began. The FBI eventually determined that he had obtained a Canadian passport under a false identity, which at the time was relatively easy.

On June 8, Scotland Yard investigators arrested Ray at a London airport. He was trying to fly to Belgium, with the eventual goal, he later admitted, of reaching Rhodesia. Rhodesia, now called Zimbabwe, was at the time ruled by an oppressive and internationally condemned white minority government. Extradited to the United States, Ray stood before a Memphis judge in March 1969 and pleaded guilty to King's murder in order to avoid the electric chair. He was sentenced to 99 years in prison.

Three days later, he attempted to withdraw his guilty plea, claiming he was innocent of King's assassination and had been set up as a patsy in a larger conspiracy. He claimed that in 1967, a mysterious man named "Raoul" had approached him and recruited him into a gunrunning enterprise. On April 4, 1968, he said, he realized that he was to be the fall guy for the King assassination and fled to Canada. Ray's motion was denied, as were his dozens of other requests for a trial during

the next 29 years.

During the 1990s, the widow and children of Martin Luther King Jr. spoke publicly in support of Ray and his claims, calling him innocent and speculating about an assassination conspiracy involving the U.S. government and military. U.S. authorities were, in conspiracists' minds, implicated circumstantially. FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover obsessed over King, who he thought was under communist influence. For the last six years of his life, King underwent constant wiretapping and harassment by the FBI. Before his death, Dr. King was also monitored by U.S. military intelligence, which may have been asked to watch King after he publicly denounced the Vietnam War in 1967. Furthermore, by calling for radical economic reforms in 1968, including guaranteed annual incomes for all, King was making few new friends in the Cold War-era U.S. government.

Over the years, the assassination has been reexamined by the House Select Committee on Assassinations, the Shelby County, Tennessee, district attorney's office, and three times by the U.S. Justice Department. The investigations all ended with the same conclusion: James Earl Ray killed Martin Luther King. The House committee acknowledged that a low-level conspiracy might have existed, involving one or more accomplices to Ray, but uncovered no evidence to definitively prove this theory. In addition to the mountain of evidence against him—such as his fingerprints on the murder weapon and his admitted presence at the rooming house on April 4—Ray had a definite motive in assassinating King: hatred. According to his family and friends, he was an outspoken racist who informed them of his intent to kill Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. He died in 1998. ■

along with other deputies assigned to the Norco and Jurupa Valley stations were all part of the team.

The team was praised for some serious out-of-the-box thinking by members of the department that helped identify the people that were going to cause harm. The City Council members presented the sheriff's employee's with certificates of appreciation.

It was reported that Mayor Ted Hoffman said, "This is the least we do for the fine job you guys did on this matter. "We

appreciate what you guys have done here."

Riverside County Sheriff's Department adamantly declined to describe the methods used by this team to thwart the attack. They also declined to allow Hall to be interviewed because the investigation is still ongoing.

On February 19, investigators tracked threats made on the Facebook page of Jacob Ryan McBain, 27, of Norco. He was arrested two days later at his Trail Street Home. Reports show that handguns and an assault rifle were seized from the residence.

McBain has been charged

with conspiracy to commit murder, two counts of making criminal threats, possession of an assault weapon, two counts of being a felon in possession of a firearm and three counts of illegally possessing ammunition. McBain plead not guilty to all charges and is due back in court this month.

McBain's social media accounts were then used to identify an alleged co-conspirator, Tarence Michael Thomas, 25, of Milwaukie, Oregon. Thomas was arrested on February 28; he faces one count of conspiracy to commit murder. He is currently awaiting extradition from Oregon. ■

Corona residents sue over 91 fwy construction

tion is what a group of Corona homeowners say is just some of the damage caused by 91 Freeway construction over the past few years.

A group of more than a dozen homeowners decided they had enough so they sued the Riverside County Transportation Commission and two companies that worked on the project in late 2016. The homeowners sued over property damage, loss of quality of life, loss in property values and of course now the cost of attorneys.

The lawsuit was filed over a year ago and the residents said they are still waiting for a resolution on the matter.

John Standiford, deputy executive director for the Riverside County Transportation Commission, declined to comment due to pending litigation. Attorneys for Atkinson Contractors and Walsh Construction Company, the two companies named in the lawsuit, have both failed to respond to a request for comment.

67 year old resident Warren Stockwell, has lived in his Pennyroyal Drive home for more than 30 years, and now has cracks running along his ceiling and driveway. He states that the damage was caused by the construction work related to the lengthening and widening of the Green River Road west-bound off-ramp.

"I'm 67 years old and still partially working," resident Warren Stockwell said. "I don't need this. I want my house fixed." His house still hasn't been repaired.

The Green River Road improvements were part of a larger project that added two toll lanes and a general lane in both directions of an 8 mile

stretch of freeway from Orange County to the 15 Freeway.

The issues for the homeowners began in 2014 when construction started on the 91 Freeway.

The group said they met with RCTC and construction firms at a neighborhood meeting to ask questions in October 2014. Soon after, Stockwell and other residents began seeking legal options to address the damage.

Sheila Lawrence, who has owned a house in the neighborhood since 1996, said the construction caused problems for her renters.

Lawrence alleges rodents, including kangaroo rats, were driven from their natural habitat outside the neighborhood into the neighborhood after crews started working.

One of the off ramps, the much taller one has caused a host of other problems other problems for the homeowners.

"I have more dirt and emissions coming into the yard and into the back of the house," Lawrence said. "They can't even open up the back of the house. If they do, within less than 20 minutes, it is covered in black soot."

Other neighbors, including Diana Sanches and Julie Sanchez, suffered damage to their homes due to freeway construction. Both stayed at hotels during some of the construction phases after lawyers got involved.

It is estimated that it would cost about \$8 million to cover all the damages and attorney fees for the homeowners in the suit. ■

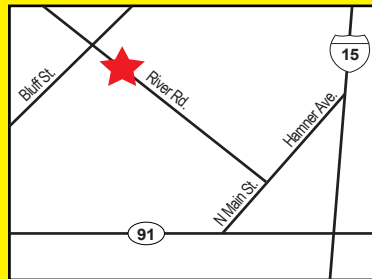

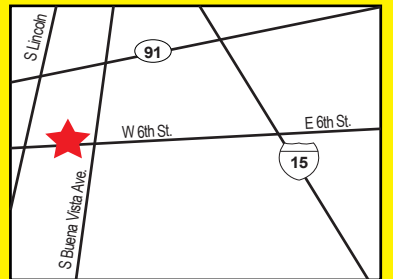

What to Know About Seasonal Allergies and Your Eyes

- Don't rub your eyes, as this will increase your body's over-reaction to the irritants.
- Remove contact lenses, which can attract allergens that accumulate throughout the day. Consider wearing your glasses or switching to daily disposable contacts during allergy season.
- Try over-the counter eye drops. There are a number of allergy drops that are formulated to relieve itchiness, redness, and watery eyes. But consult your optometrist to find out which are the best recom-

mended.

- Consider prescription medications. If the symptoms won't go away, you might need something stronger. Go see your eye doctor to discuss if a prescription medication is right for you. You can find a doctor local to you by consulting the VSP-network at vsp.com/find-eye-doctors.

Maple and Mustard Glazed Pork Chops

with Roasted Potatoes and a Cranberry and Pine Nut Salad

Servings: 4
Nutrition: 580 Calories
Ingredients:

- Multicolor Fingerling Potatoes- 24 oz
- Thyme- ¼ oz
- Lemon- 1
- Maple Syrup- 2 oz
- Dijon Mustard- 4 tsp
- Chicken Stock Concentrates- 2
- Pork Chops- 24 oz
- Fall Harvest Spice Blend- 1 tbsp
- Spring Mix Lettuce- 4 oz
- Dried Cranberries- 2 oz
- Pine Nuts- 1 oz

1 ROAST POTATOES. Wash and dry all produce. Adjust rack to upper position and preheat oven to 450 degrees. Halve potatoes lengthwise. Toss together potatoes, half the thyme sprigs, salt, pepper, and a large drizzle of olive oil on a baking sheet. Arrange potatoes cut-side down on sheet. Roast in oven until tender and browned, about 30 minutes.

2 PREP. Strip 1 tbsp thyme leaves from remaining sprigs; roughly chop leaves. Halve lemon; cut one half into wedges. Stir together chopped thyme, maple syrup, mustard, and stock concentrates in a small bowl.

3 COOK PORK. Heat a large drizzle of oil in a large pan over medium-high heat (use a nonstick pan if you have one). Season pork all over with 2 tsp harvest spice (we sent more), salt, and pepper. Add to pan and cook until browned on surface and just shy of desired doneness, 3-4 minutes per side.

4 GLAZE PORK. Pour maple syrup mixture into pan with pork and let simmer until thickened to a glaze-like consistency, about 2 minutes. Toss pork to coat. Remove pan from heat and stir in a squeeze or two of lemon.

5 TOSS SALAD. Toss together lettuce, cranberries, pine nuts, 2 TBSP olive oil, and a few squeezes of lemon in a large bowl. Season with salt and pepper. TIP: If you have an extra moment, toast the pine nuts first in a small pan over medium heat until golden, 3-4 minutes—the heat will make their flavor pop.

6 PLATE AND SERVE. Discard thyme sprigs from sheet with potatoes, then divide potatoes, pork, and salad between plates. Drizzle pork with remaining glaze in pan. Serve with lemon wedges on the side for squeezing over. ■

The Uniqueness of Christianity

Jesus said in John 14:6: "I am the way and the truth

and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me." This claim rankles people like no other. Christians have been called arrogant, narrow-minded, and bigoted for saying Jesus is the only way to God. But the thing is, Jesus is the one who says that. Christians are just relating what Jesus said.

Part of the reason why this claim is so controversial is because it strikes at the core of three great myths about religion. I'll briefly address the first one. The first myth says: "When you get down to it, all religions are basically the same." The truth is that there are major differences between the religions of the world. And Christianity is like no other. Christianity's uniqueness is rooted in the uniqueness of Jesus himself.

Someone once noted that other religious leaders say, "Follow me and I'll show you how to find truth." But Jesus says, "I am the truth."

Other religious leaders say, "Follow me and I'll show you the way to salvation." But Jesus says, "I am the way to eternal life in heaven."

Other religious leaders say, "Follow me and I'll show you

how to become enlightened." But Jesus says, "I am the light."

Other religious leaders say, "Follow me and I'll show you the door that leads to God." But Jesus says, "I am the door."

Then Jesus adds, "So follow Me."

What the different religions of the world teach contradict each other, so let's not pretend they are all true. That's irrational. They can't all be true. What one needs to look for is who authenticated their claims. Jesus claimed to be divinity and the only way to God, so how does he back up his claims? Jesus backs up his claims with unique credentials that make him uniquely credible.

For example, Jesus fulfilled dozens of centuries-old prophecies against all mathematical odds of probability. And unlike other religious leaders, Jesus performed great miracles that further authenticated his claim of being God's one and only Son. And in the most spectacular demonstration of his deity, Jesus fulfilled his own prediction by rising from the grave after three days exactly as he said he would. And this was witnessed by more than 500 people. No other religious leader ever did the powerful things Jesus did. So, it's not narrow-minded to say Jesus is the only way to God if the overwhelming evidence supports that claim. ■

California. Site 1 is located east of Hamner Avenue at the terminus of Schleisman Road, approximately 3 miles west of Interstate 15 (I-15) in the south-eastern portion of Eastvale on two parcels identified as Assessor's Parcel Numbers (APN) 152-060-002, -003. Site 2 is an approximately 1.38-acre City-owned parcel consisting of vacant land located at the south-west corner of Hamner Avenue and Riverboat Drive, identified as APNs 152-350-010, -011.

Project Description: The Draft EIR addresses entitlements related to two different sites, that may be considered together, or separately, by the City.

- General Plan Amendments on Sites 1 and 2 to change the land use designation to Commercial Retail.
- Change of Zone on Site 1 to change the zoning to General Commercial (C-1/C-P).
- Tentative Parcel Map to subdivide Site 1 into eight commercial parcels and one right-of-way parcel.
- Major Development Plan Reviews for Site 2 and a portion of Site 1. Detailed applications for these buildings have not yet been submitted.

Government Code Section 65962.5: The project site is not located on a site which is included in a list of hazardous materials sites compiled pursuant to Government Code Section

Neither Site is located on a list of hazardous materials sites compiled by the California Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) or the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) pursuant to Government Code Section 65962.5.

and the 15 freeway, received a license-plate reader alert that the Tacoma had been involved in a crime in LAPD's jurisdiction. The deputy attempted to pull the driver of the vehicle over. Spatz apparently had other plans and instead continued driving south on the freeway at a high rate of speed.

Other deputies then joined the chase and pursued the vehicle through the Cajon Pass and into both San Bernardino

and Riverside counties. Once they entered the Mira Loma area, in Riverside County, San Bernardino Deputies dropped out of the pursuit and California Highway Patrol officers assumed the pursuit.

During the pursuit, officials used two spike strips, which flattened the truck's tires, but the driver refused to stop and eventually got onto the westbound 91 Freeway, officials said, exiting at Green River Road in Corona and heading to Rio Vista Street, a dirt road south of the 91. At approximately 9:38 p.m.,

the driver pulled over, turned his weapon on himself and pulled the trigger. The Riverside County Coroner stated that the official time of death was 10:23 p.m.

According to news reports, citing several law enforcement sources, Spatz was the boyfriend of a 25-year-old aspiring model and actress from Macedonia who went missing in Hollywood last month. Authorities suspect that the woman was most likely murdered and believe that Spatz was somehow involved in her disappearance and/or homicide. ■
