# Chino Hills Man Arrested for Kidnapping, Rape

STAFF REPORTS

Chino Hills – A Chino Hills man, along with two other men, have been arrested for various crimes after using a social media app to lure kids.

The three men, in their 20's, were arrested Monday, after police found a girl in a Chino Hills home who followed leads on a social media app, Ontario PD said.

The three men -- Irving Galvan, 22 from Chino Hills, Encino Limon, 21, from Corona and Eric Trejo, 25 -- were all in police custody.

The girl, whose age was not released, was believed to have been kidnapped, held against her will and sexually assaulted,

police said

Galvan was arrested at his home on suspicion of kidnapping, rape, child molestation, and false imprisonment.

Limon was arrested on suspicion of child molestation.

Trejo was arrested in San Bernardino after officers accused him of using the app to contact the same girl. He was arrested on suspicion of contacting a minor with the intent to commit a sexual offense.

Police believe there are more victims and ask if anyone who has had contact with the suspects to call Ontario Police Department at (909) 986-6711 or Detective Chris Ables at (909) 408-1642.

## Chino Groom Beaten at Reception

**Chino** - A Chino man was brutally beaten at his wedding and later died last month according to police

Joe Melgoza, 30, died the day after his wedding, from blunt force trauma to the head, at Chino Valley Medical center.

Two uninvited men, who were wedding crashers, came into the wedding reception and were asked to leave. They came back later, about 2 am, with baseball bats and beat the groom for unknown reasons. The incident occurred at the bride's sisters home in Chino.

Rony Aristides Castaneda Ramirez, 28, and his brother, Josue Daniel Castaneda Ramirez, 19, were arrested without incident Sunday after-



noon. No formal charges have been revealed so far.

Melgoza was found in the backyard of a nearby home, and was taken to a nearby hospital where he died, police said. He has an 11-year-old daughter, of whom he had sole custody, the family told NBC Los Angeles.

The investigation is still ongoing.

# Laws Impacting: From Rent Control to Hairstyles Take Effect

STAFF REPORTS

California – New laws take in effect this month and some in July ranging from rent control and spanning to hair styles. Here is a list of the new state laws that will take effect on January 1, 2020, broken down by Senate Bill (SB) and Assembly Bill (AB) for your reference:

#### **WORKPLACE**

SB 3: Minimum wage

Another pay hike is on the way for minimum wage workers. The minimum wage in California goes up by one dollar to \$12 an hour for workers at companies with 25 or fewer employees and to \$13 an hour for workers at larger companies.

AB 5: Independent workers

While aimed directly at gig workers, this new law may also

apply to many more contract or independent worker in California. Under AB-5, workers would be considered employees and not independent contractors if the employer controls the work, directs them in the course of their work or if the worker's job is part of a company's core business. Uber and several other businesses are suing to stop Assembly Bill 5.

#### SB 188: Hairstyles

California becomes the first state to ban workplace and school discrimination based on a person's natural hairstyle or hair texture, with the Crown Law. Protected hairstyles include braids, twists and locks.

## SB 142: Lactation accommodations

While California has had a law requiring employers to provide breaks for nursing mothers, many were forced to express breast milk in a bathroom stall or office closet. This new law requires companies to provide appropriate lactation accommodations that is close to the employee's work area, has electrical plugs and is free of intrusion.

## AB 51: Arbitration agree-

Starting January 1, workers can't be forced into mandatory arbitration by an employer. The law bans mandatory arbitration agreements with employees. The law does not apply to arbitration agreements entered into prior to January 1, 2020.

## SB 1343: Sexual harass-

Requires businesses with at least five employees to provide sexual harassment training to

# Late Night Crash In Diamond Bar

**Diamond Bar** – A late night crash woke neighbors in a Diamond Bar neighborhood when a solo crash occurred at 2:45 am last week.

The crash occurred when a 19-year-old Rancho Cucamonga teen suffered serious injuries after his car hit two light poles and a fire hydrant on North Diamond Bar Boulevard and Soltaire Street in Diamond Bar.

Deputies responded to a

report of a collision and found an unresponsive driver in the front seat of a sedan, according to Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department Lt. Mario Avola. In addition to the light poles, he said the car also struck a hydrant, which damaged a water line.

Avola said firefighters removed the man from the car and took him to Pomona Valley Hospital Medical Center. The man's injuries included a skull fracture and a ruptured diaphragm.

# Diamond Bar Bank Robbed

A Diamond Bar bank was robbed Saturday morning with the gunman leaving with only \$1,000 cash.

Chase bank, on Golden Springs and Diamond Bar Boulevard, was held up when a man simulated a handgun and demanded cash, a Sheriff's sergeant said.

The bank, located at 334 S. Diamond Bar Blvd, was robbed at about 10:50 am Saturday morning when a suspect ran to a waiting vehicle. Twenty min-

utes after the 9-1-1 call from the bank, a grey mustang was believed to be connected to the robbery. The vehicle was seen near Mission Blvd and Huntington street. The vehicle and driver were found to not be connected to the robbery, according to Sgt. Anderson of the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Walnut/Diamond Bar Station.

The suspect was described as a white man in his 50's, wearing a grey hat, grey hooded sweatshirt and sported a reddish beard and mustache, Anderson said.

its employees within six months of being hired, and every two years after that.

#### SB 83: Paid family leave

New parents will have more time to care for their child. Benefits under Paid Family Leave will increase from six weeks to eight weeks starting on July 1,

#### **HOUSING** AB 1482: Rent control

Communities without their own rent control laws will now be covered by statewide rent control protections. The law limits rent increases to 5 percent each year plus inflation, but never above 10 percent total. The law does not apply to housing built in the 15 years prior. The limit is a rolling number so the date housing is excluded changes every year.

#### AB 652: Religious displays

You have more protections to display religious items like menorahs or crosses outside your home. The law prohibits landlords and homeowner associations from banning the display of religious items on entry doors or door frames. The items cannot be larger than 26 by 12 inches.

#### SB 222: Housing discrimination

This law expands existing law to protect veterans and military personnel against housing discrimination.

**PRIVACY** AB 375: Online privacy Want to know what informa-

tion companies like Facebook or Google are collecting about you. The California Consumer Privacy Act (CCPA) gives internet users more control over their data. Among other things, the law gives users the right to know what data is collected, the right to reject the sale of your information and the right to delete your data.

#### **MARRIAGE**

#### SB 30: Domestic partners

What's good for same-sex couples is good for heterosexual couples. This law allows heterosexual couples to register as domestic partners instead of getting married. Currently, only heterosexual couples age 62 or older were allowed to register as domestic partners because of social security benefits. The new law could help couples with combined higher incomes avoid the federal marriage tax penalty.

#### **EDUCATION** SB 419: School suspensions

Students in elementary school can't be so easily suspended for causing trouble at school. The law bans schools from suspending students in grades 4-8 for disrupting school activities or defving teachers and administrators. Students in grades K-3 already have this protection. High school students must wait until 2025 for the same benefit.

#### **HEALTHCARE** SB 104: Healthcare for un-

documented immigrants

California becomes the first

state in the nation to offer government-subsidized health benefits to young adults living in the country illegally. The law expands the Medicaid program to include low-income adults age 25 or younger regardless of their immigration status.

#### 2119: Transgender youth

Transgender youth in the foster care system will get appropriate health care. The law is the first in the country to include access to gender-affirming medical services, mental health counseling, hormone therapy and surgery.

#### **CRIMINAL JUSTICE** SB 273: Statute of limita-

Extends statute of limitations for domestic violence felonies from three to five years.

#### SB 439: Juvenile hall

This law changes the age that a minor can be sent to juvenile hall. Minors under 12 who commit non-violent crimes would be released to his or her parent or legal guardian instead of being sent to juvenile hall. The law does not apply to minors who commit murder. rape, or great bodily harm.

#### SB 970: Human trafficking

Operators of motels and hotels in California must provide training to teach its staff how to identify victims of human traf-

#### **ANIMALS**

#### SB 1249: Animal testing

Prohibits the sale of cosmetic products with ingredients that were tested on animals

after January 1, 2020. The law does not affect products sold globally where animal testing is required by law.

#### AB 1762: Dog areas

The California Department of Parks and Recreation has until July 1, 2020 to establish a comprehensive list of state parks that allow dogs, including the specific areas that allow dogs and the total miles of trails that are open to dogs.

#### **WILDFIRES**

#### SB 167: Public safety power shutoffs

Requires utilities like PG&E to devise plans on reducing the negative impact of planned power shutoffs to first responders and people with disabilities.

#### AB 247: Tree trimming

Gives the California Public Utilities Commission more oversight over tree trimming efforts by utilities. Power companies would have to submit timely reports on their brush and tree trimming work.

# SB 209: Wildfire warning

Establishes a wildfire warning center to broaden the state's ability to predict and prepare for wildfire. The center would rely on a statewide network of automated weather stations and fire detection cameras.

#### **TECHNOLOGY** AB 1707: Smartphones in polling places

Voters may use handheld electronic devices to help them cast their ballots at polling places, as long as they don't violate other election laws.
