Eastvale Measure on Special Election Ballot

Eastvale - A special election will take place on March 2 and Measure A will determine Eastvale's spending limit. At a Nov. 18th, 2020 City Council Meeting, the Eastvale City Council unanimously placed the 'City of Eastvale No-Tax Increase Gann Measure' on the special election ballot.

"If approved by Eastvale vot-

ers, the measure would allow the City to adjust its state-mandated budget limit, called the Gann Limit, for four years – allowing the city to budget for additional revenues resulting from the City's increased economic development and the return of some State takeaways of local funds," according to a city news release.

If approved, the city's annual spending limit would be raised

from \$25.6 million to \$33 million. The City specified that this type of measure does not raise or impose new taxes on Eastvale residents. Instead, if the measure is approved, it will "ensure that local tax dollars stay in Eastvale for vital services such as Police and Fire

Legislation Reintroduced to Establish A Zip Code For The City of Eastvale

STAFF REPORTS

Eastvale - On Feb. 5, Congressman Ken Calvert (CA-42) announced that he reintroduced legislation H.R. 743, which would allow the city of Eastvale to have their own unique zip code. City residents are currently using zip codes 91752 or 92880. But the 91752 zip code is shared with the city of Jurupa Valley.

"For years, the residents, businesses, and elected leaders of Eastvale have been urging the Postal Service to establish a single, unique zip code for their city," said Rep. Calvert in a news release. "I share their frustration with the Postal Service's inaction on their request. A city of Eastvale's size should not be sharing a zip code with

another city. It shouldn't take an act of Congress to make this commonsense change, but if it does then that's the course I'll continue to pursue. I'm confident that with the advocacy of Eastvale residents we will get this done."

Mayor Jocelyn Yow agrees with Rep. Calvert. She said,

"As the 2nd youngest City in California, having our own zip code helps put Eastvale on the map and eliminates confusion in our region." She discuss the many challenges the city residents have faced with sharing

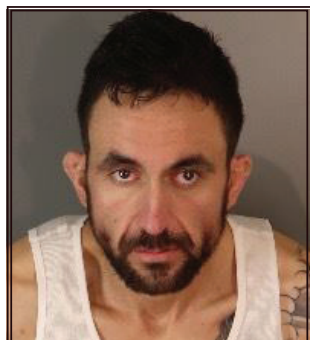

Frequently Asked Questions About Measure A

What is Measure A?

On November 18, 2020, the Eastvale City Council unanimously placed Measure A – the City of Eastvale No-Tax Increase Gann Measure, on a March 2021 special election ballot. If approved by Eastvale voters, Measure A would simply adjust the City’s state-mandated budget limit, (called the Gann Limit) for four years to allow the City to fully budget its already-existing tax revenues for City services.

Why was Measure A placed on the Ballot?

Before Eastvale’s initial voter-approved Gann Limit was calculated, the State removed significant funds from Eastvale and the three other newly incorporated cities – some of which have since been restored to Eastvale. Eastvale has also successfully grown the local economy, providing the City with additional funding. Measure A would allow Eastvale to budget for these restored and new local revenues.



Will Measure A increase the taxes I pay?

Absolutely not. Measure A does NOT increase existing taxes or impose a new tax. It simply adjusts the “Gann Limit” to allow Eastvale to budget to fully use available revenues to provide the services our community relies on.

Why is Measure A on a special election ballot?

As the state-imposed Gann Limit is a budget item, the City wants to present Measure A to the voters before the start of the new fiscal year in July 2021. Measure A will be the only item on your special election ballot.

I am working so hard to earn her trust, to prove to her that I'm capable of loving. I'm learning how to love again.

And I know that a day will come when she'll smile feverishly. She'll stand there, and her eyes will glisten with happiness. Her hand will clasp my own. Her hug will be trusting, and convincing. She'll whisper in my



ear that she loves me. And then she'll smile uncontrollably. And then I'll know, in my heart that I've finally provided her with her fairytale ending, her movie-like love. And when that day comes when I can feel her heart from a million miles away, I'll know that I've finally become her Prince Charming.

Eastvale is a full-fledged City that has quickly become one of the fastest-growing cities in Riverside County. Establishing a zip code for the City is vital to the growth and sustainability of Eastvale."

The zip code would be a great improvement for the city, which has a population of approximately 70,000. The city was incorporated in 2010.

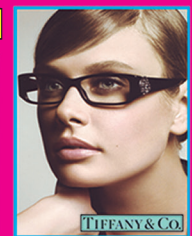

Schedule a weekly phone date with someone who lives alone.

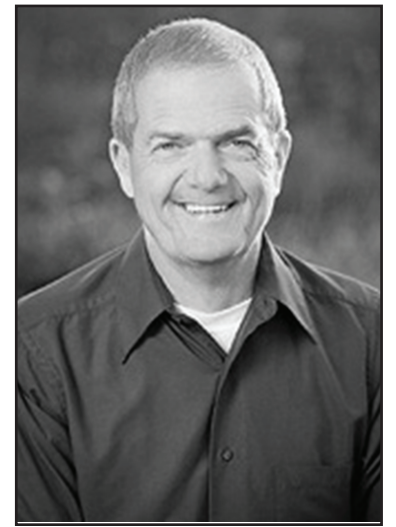
Send a card to this week to someone you know who feels

to the group and tell me what you need some help with. If you are bashful you can just join and listen. I even offer a guided meditation at the end of the groups.

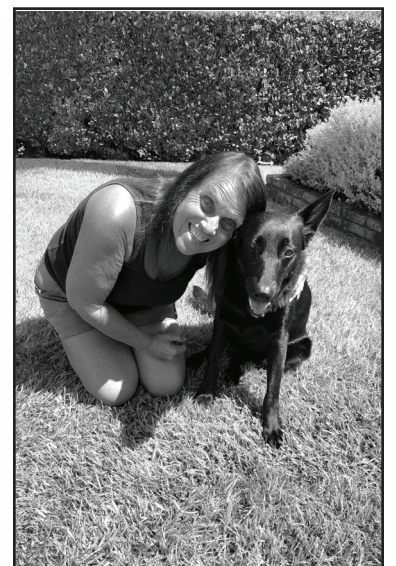

 INCIDENT: Solicitation of Prostitution
 INCIDENT DATE: February 11, 2021

WHERE: 3000 Block of Hamner Avenue, Norco

On Thursday, February 11, 2021, members of the Norco Station Special Enforcement Team (SET), in partnership with personnel from the Riverside County Anti-Human Trafficking Task Force (RCAHT) conducted a comprehensive "John" prostitution sting in an effort to reduce the demand for sex trafficking in the city of Norco.

Law enforcement personnel, operating in an undercover capacity, placed decoy advertisements on several popular classified advertisement websites commonly used for the solicitation of online prostitution. The undercover operators communicated with prospective customers replying to their posted prostitution (decoy) advertisements. After brokering an agreement for paid sexual acts, these "Johns," were then arrested upon their arrival to the meeting location.

As a result of this enforcement effort, a total of 17 men were arrested on misdemeanor prostitution charges. Those arrested were identified as follows:

- Christopher Damron, 46, a resident of Oxnard

- Moises Mendoza, 37, a resident of Norco

- Peter Pacheco, 46, a resident of Fontana
- Jin Park, 20, a resident of Eastvale
- Manuel Perez, 21, a resident of Corona
- Dustin Reeves, 52, a resident of Rancho Cucamonga
- Ignacio Rivera, 26, a resident of San Bernardino
- Robert Sanchez, 38, a resident of Corona
- Joseph Sierra, 21, a resident of Perris

All subjects arrested were booked and released from the Robert Presley Detention Center in Riverside.

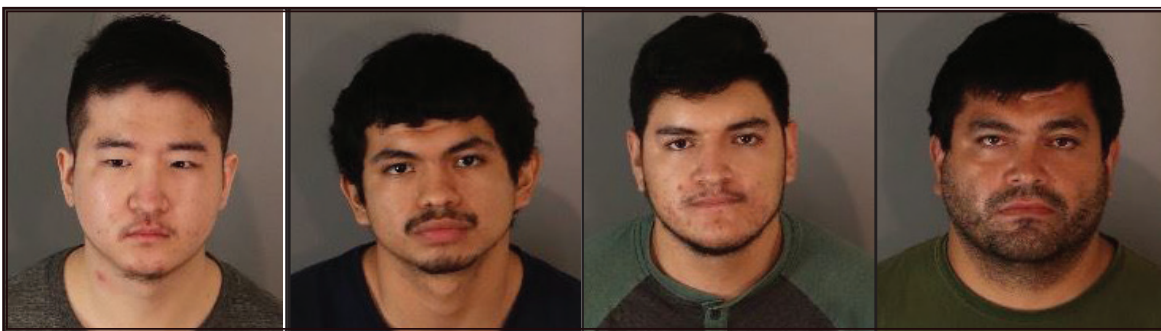
Prostitution is not a victimless crime. Ninety-five percent of sex trafficking victims are women or children. The National Center for Missing and Exploited Children estimates that one in six endangered runaways reported are likely victims of sex trafficking. Sex trafficking victims are often subjected not only to severe forms of emotional, physical, and sexual abuse at the hands of their trafficker, but are also frequently physically and sexually assaulted by those that solicit them for prostitution. Norco Station SET and the Riverside County Anti-Human Trafficking Task Force seek to disrupt and dismantle sex trafficking rings

services," according to the City.

City officials explained why the increase is necessary now. The Eastvale Gann Limit was originally calculated in 2012 using a State-mandated formula. "At that time, the State was taking away millions of dollars annually from the City, which resulted in the Gann Limit calculation being lower

than it would have been had the State not taken the funds," stated a city news release. When the limit was set, this was only two years after the City's incorporation.

Since then, the "State take-aways have stopped and Eastvale has significantly grown its economy and tax base by attracting a number of businesses. But because of the Gann Limit, which only allows for adjustments based on pop-

ulation or inflation changes, the City cannot fully budget for these additional revenues without voter action to raise the Gann Limit."

City Manager Bryan Jones believes this measure will benefit the city. "In these challenging times, we must do everything we can to ensure our taxpayer dollars stay in Eastvale to maintain law enforcement, fire and emergency medical response, address

traffic and keep our streets and roads repaired," stated Jones. "The proposed measure would simply allow the City to use the funds we already have to do just that – without increasing the taxes our residents pay."

If approved, the 'City of Eastvale No-Tax Increase Gann Measure' would allow the Gann Limit to be adjusted for four years so the City can budget all of the existing revenue. March 2021 is the last election

available before the start of the next fiscal year. See page 2 for more information.

Early voting can also take place at the Registrar of Voters Office, located at 2720 Gateway Drive, Riverside through March 1. Voting is available Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., excluding holidays.
