CNUSD Schools Reopen

STAFF REPORTS

Eastvale - In February, it was announced that the Corona Norco Unified School district was officially in the Red Tier of the Governor's Blueprint for a Safer Economy. Therefore, in addition to reopening Elementary Schools, CNUSD now has the green light to reopen Intermediate and High Schools in a

hybrid model (limited capacity) in alignment with county guidelines. The official return date was March 22nd.

CNUSD has a safety plan in place for students returning to school, including reduced capacity, thorough cleaning of classrooms, and safety precautions. They posted a video to

their Facebook page with a few quick reminders for parents as they prepare for their students' first day back. In that video, they also reminded parents that every Friday is 100% remote learning.

In addition, the "hybrid model for secondary schools has been changed to allow for students to receive on-campus, in-person

Cancer

I am confident that everyone who reads this article knows someone who has had cancer in the past or has cancer now. There is an endless list of cancers that are being treated today. Lung cancer, breast cancer, liver cancer, pancreatic cancer and many more.

When you get off the elevator on the second floor of the St. Jude Cancer Center in Fullerton, California you can only go in two directions. If you turn to the right you will enter the doors of the Women's Center where women go for annual checkups, mammograms and other procedures. However, if you turn left, the hallway leads

to the Infusion Center where patients receive chemotherapy to treat their cancer.

Cancer became part of our family in 2006 when my wife was diagnosed with breast cancer. We knew other people who had cancer but now it had entered our lives. We entered a new world with a new vocabulary of words and terms unfamiliar to us. We met doctors, nurses and staff who assured us that we were not alone. Many other patients had successfully gone through cancer treatment and survived.

The months following her diagnosis included surgery, reconstruction, and chemotherapy. She took a leave of absence from her teaching job. She lost


stones that were used to con-

her hair and experienced side effects from the chemotherapy.

Shortly after my wife's diagnosis a friend gave me a book that helped me better understand this journey. The Breast Cancer Husband by Marc Silver is about his wife's journey. He included interviews with doctors, patients and spouses. It was extremely helpful starting with the size and stage of the cancer to treatment options and much more. I encourage every couple dealing with Breast Cancer to buy this book.

In the following years there have been many ups and downs. The cancer returned in 2011 requiring more surgery and chemotherapy plus radiation. In 2016 the breast cancer metastasized to other organs including her bones and adrenal gland. Cancer activity increased again in 2020. Her doctor used newly developed medicines and treatments that did not exist when her journey began fifteen years ago. Jeanne has led a support group in our home for many years to encourage men and women dealing with various types of cancer. Let me encourage you to get help if cancer enters your home. Find a support group. Be willing to share your story with others. Prav for those who are hurting and look for ways to help them. You will be glad you did and they will too.

Autism Mom

Being a mom of two autistic boys is more challenging than I want to admit. There are days when I say I got this, and then there are days when life brings me to my knees, hands folded tightly, head bowed, asking for God's help and telling Him I can't do this anymore.

The daily struggles of raising an autistic child can take a toll on the spirit of the soul. The easiest of tasks we take for granted can be the most mundane, frustrating moment in time. Simply as looking at my child and asking, where are your shoes? My child will stare back at me and repeat, where are your shoes? With no comprehension of what was just asked.

My boy will not feed himself unless he can pick up the food with his fingers. High locks are put on the door because, given a chance, he would run out like a dog with no fence. Deputies assigned to the SET team received complaints from residents of the city of Eastvale regarding possible illegal indoor marijuana cultivations. The Eastvale SET deputies investigated and determined that properties located in the 6640 block of Leanne St., and the 7000 block of Wells Springs St., city of Eastvale, had been converted to support illegal indoor marijuana cultivation and there was evidence that marijuana plants were being cultivated on the properties.

On February 20. 2021, at 9:00 AM, members from the Jurupa Valley station's SET team served two marijuana cultivation related search warrants on the properties located at the above addresses within the city of Eastvale. During the service of the search warrants, deputies recovered approximately 2750 marijuana plants and several pounds of processed marijuana from the locations.

Yi Bao Feng, 64-year old resident of the city of Eastvale, was arrested for illegal marijuana cultivation, maintaining and operating a drug house, possession of marijuana for sales. Subsequently, he was booked at the Robert Presley Detention Center:

Eastvale Community Enhancement and Safety, along with Southern California Edison responded to the location's and they conducted their own separate investigations into various building and safety code violations.
