# Don't Support Panhandling in Eastvale

Eastvale - Many have noticed an increase in panhandlers in the City of Eastvale. Community members have shared pictures of panhandlers in the shopping centers, restaurants, roadways and freeway off ramps. The panhandlers will have different signs, indicating they are homeless, out of work, or even raising money for funeral arrangements. Many residents will give willingly to those on the side of the road, while others

are skeptical of the legitimacy of the signs since there have been several scammers in the surrounding areas.

The Jurupa Valley Sheriff's Station issued a statement stating they do not encourage panhandling in Eastvale. The statement said the increase in panhandlers is "partially due to the great support that they receive from our wonderful citizens." However, sheriff officials state that giving money to panhandlers can cause several issues such as:

-Disorderly conduct issues and H&S safety concerns

- -Harassment and intimidation
- -Drug and alcohol abuse
- -Distracted drivers / acci-
- -Increase in trash / debris
- -Business loss

The station's Problem Oriented Policing Teams have made a difference in reducing panhandling, but the community's help is still needed. If you encounter a panhandler that is

# Road Enhancements Off Citrus/Harrison

Eastvale - The road off Citrus Street and Harrison Avenue will have a few upgrades soon. At the last City Council Meeting on March 24, the City Council approved roadway safety enhancements at the Citrus Street and Harrison Avenue intersection and along the Citrus Street corridor. "The work

will enhance existing traffic signage, lane striping, and lane/ intersection visibility," stated

"The overall goal of the work is to encourage safe driving practices along Citrus Street and enhance the visibility and signage at the Citrus Street and Harrison Avenue intersection," stated the City.

All traffic signage and striping enhancements at the Citrus and Harrison intersection will be implemented through ongoing maintenance, according to the City. However, the striping enhancements along Citrus Avenue will be completed during the annual asphalt overlay

Capital Improvement Project anticipated in Summer 2021.

The City posted several pictures of how the streets will look after the enhancements. Many residents expressed their

# Crime Recap

Eastvale/Norco - In the last month, a few incidents took place in the City of Eastvale and the City of Norco. The incidents are listed below, courtesy of the Riverside County Sheriff 's Department.

INCIDENT: Assault with a **Deadly Weapon** 

INCIDENT DATE: April 3,

LOCATION: handler Street x Hall Avenue, Eastvale

DETAILS: On Saturday, April 3, 2021, at 8:45 PM, deputies from the Jurupa Valley Sheriff's Station responded to the area of Chandler Street crossing Hall Avenue, in the City of Eastvale, regarding a shooting investigation. The investigation revealed that an unknown suspect fired several handgun rounds at a passing vehicle from a dark color van as they approached the intersection of Chandler Street crossing Hellman Avenue. The hand-

gun rounds struck the victim's vehicle and caused minor, non-life-threatening injuries to the victim. After the shooting, the suspect fled the area and has not been contacted. The victim was transported to a local hospital to be treated.

This is an active and ongoing investigation, and no additional details are currently available. The Riverside County Sheriff's Department encourages any-



Marc Silver not only addressed the medical side of cancer but he also provided helpful information about the emotional and physical side



I have always been known as pretty conservative when it came to spending money. But cancer changed my perspective. I think I am more willing to spend money and enjoy things now than I did before cancer. Every day is a gift and we plan and spend differently than we did before.

Another thing you learn about cancer is that you are not alone. There are thousands of families and individuals that have cancer in their homes. The waiting room at the doctor's office is filled with patients. You will see adults of all ages in the hallways of the medical center. It is a quiet, resilient company of people who have a life threatening disease in com-

There is a verse in the Bible that says, " God comforts us in our distress so that we may comfort others too" (Second Corinthians 1:4). Pastor Rick Warren says - God never wastes a hurt and your area of ministry will probably be in the area of your greatest hurt. Let me encourage you to look for ways to comfort others who are on a cancer journey. Don't go through cancer alone. Find a church and support group near you. Read a book like the Breast Cancer Husband, Open your Bible and read some of the Psalms too. You will be glad you did and I will too!

INCIDENT: Marijuana Cultivation Warrant

INCIDENT DATE: March 30, 2021

LOCATION: 14000 block of Sleepy Creek Dr., Eastvale

DETAILS: Members of the Jurupa Valley Station's Special Enforcement Teams (SET) representing the cities of East-vale and Jurupa Valley have been aggressively targeting illegal indoor marijuana grows throughout the cities of East-vale and Jurupa Valley in 2021.

Deputies assigned to the SET received complaints from residents of the City of East-vale regarding a possible illegal indoor marijuana cultivation taking place out of a residence in the 14000 block of Sleepy Creek Dr. in Eastvale. The SET deputies investigated and determined there was probable cause to author a search warrant for the residence.

On March 30, 2021, at 12:30 PM, members from the Juru-

pa Valley station's SET team served a cultivation related search warrant at the property located at the above address within the City of Eastvale. During the service of the search warrant, deputies recovered approximately 700 marijuana plants and several pounds of processed marijuana from the location.

Yi Ying Chen, 48-year old resident of the City of Eastvale, was arrested for illegal marijuana cultivation, maintaining and operating a drug house, possession of marijuana for sales. Subsequently, he was booked at the Robert Presley Detention Center:

Eastvale Community Enhancement and Safety, along with Southern California Edison responded to the location and they conducted their own separate investigations into various building and safety code violations.

The Jurupa Valley Station continuously strives to ensure the citizens of Jurupa Valley, Eastvale and the unincorporated areas, live comfortably and their quality of life is unimpeded. As a reminder, "Community

Policing" involves partnerships between law enforcement and community members. Business owners and residents are encouraged to report criminal activity directly to law enforcement by calling Sheriff's Dispatch at (951) 776-1099, or by calling 911 if the matter is an emergency.

INCIDENT: Identity Theft Arrests

INCIDENT DATE: March 15, 2021

LOCATION: 3400 Block of Hamner Ave, Norco

DETAILS: On Monday, March 15, 2021, at 12:31 PM, Norco deputies responded to the report of a victim's stolen identity being used at a local hotel in the 3400 block of Hamner Ave, Norco. Upon arrival, deputies identified the three suspects as Juan Morfin (35 years of age from the city of San Bernardino), Francine

Fuerte (54 years, Transient), and Kellie Hailey (35 years, from the city of Corona) occupying two rooms rented illegally using the victim's identity.

Deputies initiated an enforcement stop of the suspect vehicle, occupied by Morfin and Hailey, after they were seen leaving the hotel. Upon contacting Morfin, deputies learned he was on parole. Hailey, the passenger, also had an active felony arrest warrant. A search of the vehicle revealed a large quantity of counterfeit credit cards, identification cards containing stolen personal information of numerous victims, and equipment used to manufacture credit cards and identification cards. Fuerte was located within the hotel room in

possession of a large quantity of methamphetamine.

All three suspects were arrested and booked into the Robert Presley Detention Center for Possession of Methamphetamine for sales, Commercial Burglary, Organized Retail Theft, various Felony warrants and parole holds.

In total, deputy's recovered, 2.476 lbs./1123.2 grams of methamphetamine, \$6,041 in US currency, equipment used to create counterfeit credit cards and identification cards, stolen checks, stolen mail and items containing stolen identities of others.


