Councilmember Bootsma Passes Away






I believe that there will be a day of judgment. And on that day we will be forced to look into our own souls and really see who determined our path. So to that young man on the park bench, I hope you are happy with your


If you expect a coworker to help you with a project or presentation, you may be frustrated when you discover that they didn't get their part of the project done on time.
