The City of Eastvale provided the below statement regarding the Housing Element:

The Housing Element is

Eastvale's "housing plan" and a required chapter in the General Plan. By State law, the City is required to plan for the housing needs of everyone in the community by updating the Housing Element every 8 years. An important piece of the Housing Element is the Regional Housing Needs Allocation, referred to as the "RHNA", which establishes a "fair share" allocation

for all cities and counties in the the State to meet their housing demand over the next 8 years. In March 2021, the State approved Eastvale's final RHNA, requiring the City to plan for 3,028 housing units over the next 8 years.

The City created a robust outreach program to give the community ample opportunities to provide input on the process.



referring to due to the "confidential nature of sales tax information and revenue".

However, the City is excited for this announcement because additional sales tax revenue will "help fund key priority goals and initiatives outlined by the City Council in their 2021 Strategic Plan, such as Public Safety, Infrastructure, and funding our future downtown City Hall, Library, and Police Station!" stated the City. These new additions will be located at the Leal site at the corner of Limonite Ave. and Hamner Ave. The Leal site bound by Hamner, Limonite, Scholar and 58th is in escrow with a purchase and sale for a master developer, according

to the City. The City Council approved the Master Plan in December 2017.

The City specified that the Police Station will belong to the City and will not be a Sheriff's sub-station. They also stated that the City Council just authorized a five-year contract with the Riverside County Sheriff's Department and added "two new Community Orientated"

Special Enforcement Team Deputies dedicated to the City to enhance quality of life and public safety," according to a City Facebook post.

Many residents expressed concern that the community sales tax would be increased. However, the City reassured the community that their sales taxes are not going up in Eastvale. "We pride ourselves on having

the lowest sales tax in the region!" stated the City. Instead, revenue will go up from this particular company that they are keeping confidential for now.

The City Council meeting will take place on July 28 at the Eastavle City Hall. If you are unable to attend the City Council meeting, you can watch it via live-stream by going to www. eastvaleca.gov.

further investigation and the notification to the next of kin. At this time, it remains uncertain if alcohol and/or drugs were a factor in the collision. Due to the collision investigation and the need for extensive cleanup, a temporary closure of Hamner Avenue, between 5th Street and 6th Street, was required.

In January 2021, the City kicked off the program with an Introduction to the Housing Element holding several outreach events including a workshop with the Planning Commission and eventually City Council to begin the work of identifying how to accommodate the RHNA.

Since receiving the Regional Housing Needs Allocation of 3,028 housing units in late

March 2021, the City team and consultants have been evaluating vacant and potential parcels. 90% of the City is already built which includes 15,654 single family homes, 772 multiple family homes along with schools, parks, churches, commercial retail, warehouse, logistics and industrial land uses. Now that we have completed the evaluation of the vacant parcels, we are continuing our community engagement that will include a series of upcoming workshops

with the Planning Commission and City Council, several "popup" events, and the rolling out of a simulation tool that will allow members of the public to be a "resident planner" and balance housing needs allocation and residential density across the City!
