Eastvale/Norco - In the last month, there was one fire that took place in the City of Eastvale. Riverside County Sheriff's Department also issued a statement about National Teen Driver Safety Week. Read more below.

INCIDENT: Residential Fire INCIDENT DATE: October 10, 2021

DETAILS: On the morning of October 10, CAL FIRE/Riverside County Fire Department responded to a residential structure fire off Kaisha Street in the City of Eastvale. They were able to contain the fire to the garage with no extension into the residence. The City mentioned that Eastvale homes are built with a fire rated door and walls between the garage and home, which could have contributed to the minimal damage to the home.

Local reports state a neighbor alerted the homeowners of

the fire that early morning and they were able to exit the home safely.

INCIDENT: National Teen Driver Safety Week

INCIDENT DATE: October 17-23, 2021

INCIDENT LOCATION: Jurupa Valley, Eastvale, and Norco

DETAILS: As part of National Teen Driver Safety Week Oct. 17-23, the Riverside County Sheriff's Department wants to remind parents and guardians the importance of talking to their teen(s) about driving responsibly and safety.

Driving remains the most dangerous activity for teens. Per mile driven, teen drivers are nearly four times as likely to be involved in a crash as drivers in all other age groups. According to the Insurance Institute for Highway Safety (IIHS), speeding was a factor in 43% of all teen driver and passenger fa-

Eastvale Library Giving Campaign

City of Eastvale Launches Eastvale Library Giving Campaign with Randall and Janell Lewis \$2.5 Million Dollar Donation

The City of Eastvale has officially launched the Eastvale Library Giving Campaign! It has been a goal and priority of the City to build our own library for our 70,000 residents. At the January 2021 Strategic Planning meeting, the City Council noted an Eastvale Library as a top priority in our commUNITY, which reaffirmed the 2018 Strategic Plan priority for a public library in our City. Each year, the City Council has set aside reserves for the design and construction of a library. Earlier this fall we also released an RFQ for an owner representative and bridging architect to help design the library with commUNITY input.



To further move this effort along, the City is now launching a giving campaign, which was started by a commitment pledge from Randall and Janell Lewis to donate \$2,500,000 to the City of Eastvale for the support of a public library to be built by the City. The entire City Council ceremoniously accepted this donation at the 2021 State of the City event on October 7th as a special announcement and officially at the October 13th City Council meeting. The Lewis Family also donated the first book to our City Library, which was the Giving Tree by Shel Silverstein.









Additional details on how to donate to this campaign will be released in the near future. In the meantime, those interested in joining our giving campaign can email info@eastvaleca.gov for more information.



giance. The National Anthem was sang beautifully by Eleanor Roosevelt High School senior, Layla Lopez. Following these patriotic tributes, was a recap video of the 9/11 Never Forget monument that was unveiled at the 20th Anniversary of 9/11. In addition, pictures were shown of the community honoring fallen hero, Lance Corporal, Kareem Nikoui.

Also honored were Ike Bootsma, Mayor and City Councilmember, and Richard "Ric" Welch, City Councilmember who past away this year. In addition, a recap video showed how much the community enjoyed the monthly Food Truck Festivals that started this year.

The hosts thanked the many that came to the event and those that sponsored it, including the Presenting Partnership, Gold Partnership, Silver Partnership, Bronze Partnership, and Community Level. The hosts also thanked VantagePoint Church for hosting the event.

Mayor Jocelyn Yow and the City Council announced the Commuity Honoree Award, along with awards based on the City's values of grit, kindness, and being solution driven. Congratulations to Thomas Rife given an Award for Grit, Amber Norwood given an Award for Kindness, Navjot Kaur given an Award for being Solutions Driven, and James Chiang given the CommUNITY Honoree Award.

Mayor Yow celebrated accomplishments and shared goals for the future during the Mayor's Address. She first thanked the Eastvale Chamber of Commerce, City Council, Planning Commission, Public Safety Commission, City Manager, and City of Eastvale team for their hard work in the City. The Mayor also thanked the residents and businesses, saying they are the "heartbeat of the City".

"We champion experiences that engage, excite, and elevate the community, with an emphasis on the word 'unity' and 'community'," said Mayor Yow. She said we are united with kindness, grit, and being solutions driven.

Mayor Yow shared that the City is right in the middle of the Eastvale 2040 plan, which is the general plan amendment. This plan will help shape the future of the City for decades to come. Mayor Yow mentioned that in the past year, the City has made significant strides in economic development, including establishments at Hammer Place, the Merge and The Station to name

Mayor Yow said that with a healthy budget, the City was able to allocate \$14.5 million for the Eastvale City Hall and Library. The City has also committed to allocating \$8 million for the City's own Police substation. In addition, at last month's CAL City's Conference, the City built a "strong collation with other cities to oppose a resolution meant to reallocate sales tax revenue from online retailers," according to Mayor Yow. This means "millions of dollars will come to our City."

Public Safety continues to be a top priority for the City and Eastvale was recently named In April 2021, the Eastvale City

Council budgeted for two deputies to combat the illegal grow houses in the City and to provide additional services to residents.

Mayor Yow said the City received several awards from multiple regional and statewide organizations in this past year. Despite being in a pandemic, the City was also identified as the 2nd least financially at risk city in the entire state. She also talked about how the City is diverse, and how the residents have done so much in the community in the last year.

She challenged the audience the 29th Safest City in the state. to continue to give back to the community and she told the youth they are the future of the City. She ended with having the audience stand and said: "you are what makes Eastvale Elevate so let's continue to work together to elevate Eastvale every day."

A video was played that talked about the City, sharing new businesses and a look at the first hotel coming to Eastvale. The City Council shared in the video the great things happening in Eastvale, including new events, our great Police Department, new establishments, a future downtown, and more. Towards the end of the event, the host Hari Dhiman thanked the Eastvale Chamber of Commerce for hosting the event and presented a check to Vantage-Point Church for \$1,500 towards their Living Proof Project. cleaner and better.



Is He Listening?

"Lord, how long do I have to call out for help?" Habakkuk 1:2

Life, you know, has a way of throwing curveballs at us. We find ourselves in a difficult time not only as a nation, but quite possibly even difficulty personally. 2020 was hard for many of us and it seems that 2021 appears to have its share of uncertainty and hardship. I think many people today have been asking God "How long?" or "Where are you?" It seems like evil is getting the upper hand and God is si-

lent. Habakkuk was troubled by the moral and spiritual decline of the world around him, much like we are today. Habakkuk asked the question "why?" Then God says, "you wouldn't believe me if I told you" (Habakkuk 1:5). God eventually tells Habakkuk that a wicked nation would bring punishment to Judah because of Judah's unfaithfulness. In the midst of mystery, Habakkuk turns to faith. He goes on to say, "the righteous shall live by faith" (2:4). He knew the key to living in the now was by faith because he knew that God's ways could

be mysterious. We don't always understand why. That's when God calls us to look outside of ourselves and look to Him. Corrie Ten Boom once said, "never be afraid to trust an unknown future to a known God." Scripture says that God promises hope in Him (Jer. 29:11). God eventually reveals to Habakkuk that evil will be squashed, and He would show mercy and revive His work among His people (3:2). God is still working, and He is still in control. We may not understand what God is doing at times, but we can be sure that He is working His plan. Habakkuk says, there may not be food, there may not be cattle, but I will still be glad (3:18). He looked back at God's track record of faithfulness, and He rejoiced (3:5-15). God won't always call on us to understand Him, but He has called us to trust Him. He is listening. I am just a mom. I am just a mom raising my two autistic boys! STOP right there. No one is just a mom! I have heard this over and over and over out of my mouth and many others.

Provisional Driver's License: Learn about California's provisional licensing law, which places restrictions on passengers and driving at night during the first year they have a license.

Lead by example: Have driving sessions with your teen. Tell, but also show your teen how to drive safely.

Set ground rules: Be firm

on rules such as no phone use, being distracted by friends, always following the speed limit, and always buckling up.

Sober driving: Emphasize the importance of never driving under the influence or riding with someone who has been drinking.


