Clint Lorimore was selected by the City Council as the new Mayor of Eastvale and Todd Rigby was selected as the new Mayor Pro Tem. Both Mayor Lorimore and Mayor Pro Tem Rigby will serve one-year terms in their respec-

tive positions, according to the City. The Mayor and Mayor Pro Tem positions are rotated annually in December amongst the five elected Councilmembers.

Outgoing Mayor Jocelyn Yow was also recognized at the meeting for her dedication to the City. She will continue to serve on the City Council as a Councilmember.

On December 7, former Mayor Yow provided the following

message to the community: "Serving as the Mayor for the City of Eastvale this past year has been an honor and a privilege. As I reflect on my time as Mayor, one quote resonates with me. Margaret J. 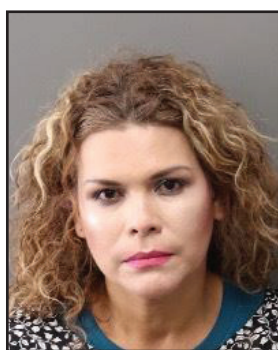
INCIDENT: Homicide

INCIDENT DATE: December 22, 2021

WHERE: 1500 block of Temescal Avenue, Norco

DETAILS: On Wednesday, December 22, 2021, at 7:38 PM, deputies from the Norco and Jurupa Valley Stations responded to a call of an assault with a deadly weapon in the 1500 block of Temescal Avenue in the city of Norco. Upon arrival, they found a deceased male adult with obvious trauma. Deputies secured the area and began an investigation.

Investigators from the Jurupa Valley Sheriff's Station and the Central Homicide Unit

responded and assumed the investigation. The deceased's identity is not being released at this time, pending notification to the next of kin. A suspect has not been identified at this time.

This is an active investigation, and no additional details are currently available. The Riverside County Sheriff's Department encourages anyone with information or video re-

INCIDENT: Driving Under the Influence (DUI) / Driver's License Checkpoint

INCIDENT DATE: December 17, 2021

WHERE: 12000 block of Limonite Avenue, Eastvale

DETAILS: The Riverside County Sheriff's Department/Jurupa Valley Station conducted a Driving Under the Influence (DUI) / Driver's License checkpoint on Friday, December 17, 2021. The checkpoint was in the 12000 Block of Limonite Avenue between the hours of 8:00 p.m. and 2:00 a.m. During the checkpoint operation a total of 983 vehicles were screened resulting in the following:

- 7 Field Sobriety Tests
- 3 DUI arrest
- 17 citations for unlicensed drivers
- 2 citations for suspended license
- 5 vehicles towed

Checkpoint locations are chosen based on a history of DUI crashes and arrests. The primary purpose of checkpoints is not to make arrests, but to promote public safety by deterring drivers from driving impaired.

During the checkpoint, deputies will look for signs that drivers are under the influence of alcohol and/or drugs. The safety of our community is and always will be our mission. Driving under the influence is dangerous and puts a further strain on critical resources.

The Riverside County Sheriff's Department reminds the public that impaired driving is not just from alcohol. Some prescription medications or over-the-counter drugs may interfere with driving.

Always follow directions for use and read warning labels about "driving" or "operating heavy machinery," which includes driving a vehicle. While medicinal and recreational marijuana are legal, driving under the influence of marijuana is illegal.

If you plan on drinking or taking medications that may impact your ability to drive safely, plan on staying at home.

Drivers charged with DUI face an average of \$13,500 in fines and penalties, as well as a suspended license.

Funding for this checkpoint is provided by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety, through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, reminding everyone to "Report Drunk Driver - Call 9-1-1".

INCIDENT: Pimping, Pandering, Maintaining a Brothel and Solicitation of Prostitution Arrest

INCIDENT DATE: December 16, 2021

WHERE: Limonite Ave and Collins St, Jurupa Valley

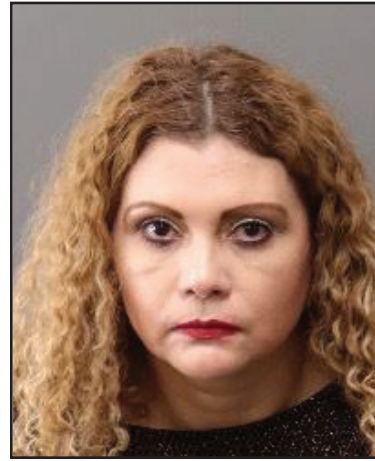
DETAILS: Members of the Jurupa Valley Station's Special Enforcement Team (SET) representing the city of Jurupa Valley have been conducting several sex trafficking investigations in the city of Jurupa Valley. On Wednesday, December 16, 2021, at 12:30 PM, the Jurupa Valley Stations Special Enforcement Team, with the assistance of the Riverside County Anti-Human Trafficking Task Force (RCAHT), served a search warrant at the 8000 block of Limonite Ave, Jurupa Valley, regarding a sex trafficking investigation.

During the search warrant service, Mitza Anariba, 49 of La Puente, was arrested for maintaining a brothel and solicitation of prostitution, and Martha Cedillo, 45 of Ontario, was arrested for solicitation prostitution and maintaining a brothel. Anariba and Cedillo were transported to the Robert Presley Detention Center. During this investigation, no victims of sex trafficking were identified.

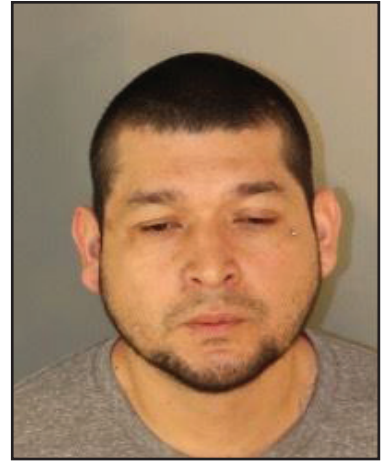
To lure "Johns" or potential

clients who are willing to pay to engage in sex acts. A "John" sting operation was established to deter prostitution and human trafficking acts at the location. This was done to cut the demand for commercial sex in the City of Jurupa Valley and the surrounding area. Several people were contacted, and David Carreon, 36 of Ontario, was arrested for solicitation of prostitution.

Prostitution is not a "victimless" crime. Those victimized by commercial sexual exploitation frequently have long histories of emotional, physical, and/or sexual abuse or trauma in their backgrounds. The National Center for Missing and Exploited Children estimates 1 in 6 endangered runaways reported are likely victims of sex trafficking. Sex trafficking victims are often subjected not only to severe forms of emotional, physical, and sexual abuse at the hands of their trafficker. Still, they are also frequently physically and sexually assaulted by those that solicit them for prostitution.

The Rock House

We have driven between Los Angeles and Phoenix many times. My wife and I grew up in the Phoenix area but we moved to California over thirty years ago. Since she still has three sisters who live in Arizona we drive back and forth on Interstate 10 several times a year.

Along the way we have noticed an old building that is made with rocks. The roof is gone and the windows are gone but the rock shell is still standing. This old house is on a barren stretch of the highway in the Arizona desert. I assume the house was built with rocks

because there are no trees in sight. Cabins in the mountains were built with logs and lumber. Houses in the desert were built with mud bricks or rocks.

I wonder who built the house. I wonder why they selected that location. Was it just a house or maybe a stopping place for travelers? Was it part of the pony express or a stage coach line? There are no train tracks nearby just a stretch of Interstate 10 in the Arizona desert.

Jesus concluded his Sermon on the Mount with a story about a man who built a house. It was not built with rocks but a house that was built on a rock (Matthew 7:24-27). Jesus said that

people who heard his words and put them into action were like a wise man who built his house on a solid rock. When the wind blew and the floods came the house stood firm. Jesus went on to say that the man who heard his words and did not put them into action was like a foolish man who built his house on sand. When the wind blew and the floods came his house was washed away.

Maybe we could paraphrase Jesus' words and say that someone who hears or reads his words today and puts them into action is like a house in the desert built with rocks. When the dust storms blow and the

rain storms come the house built with rocks stands firm.

Let me encourage you to find a Bible and read some of the words and teachings of Jesus in the book of Matthew. There are lessons about compassion, kindness and contentment. There are teachings about faith, generosity and forgiveness. Then put His words into action in your daily life. Don't just read them – live them! You will be like a house built with rocks that still stands in the barren Arizona desert today!

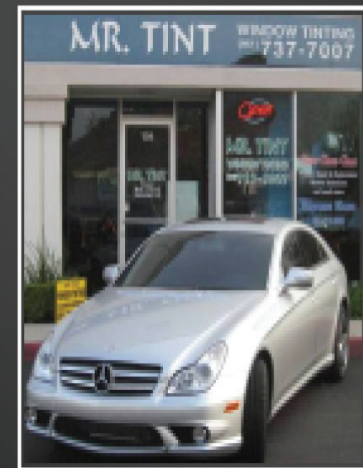
