## Homes In Eastvale

### STAFF REPORTS

**Eastvale** – Construction is now taking place to build new Eastvale homes and future construction will occur for the new Downtown Eastvale. Construction has started at the "158.6-acre plot formerly known as the Leal Property located on the northwest corner of Limonite and Hamner Avenue," said a City news release. "The current construction is taking place on a section of the property that is private-

ly-owned and operated by The New Home Company (TNHC), a private home builder." "TNHC is building up to 2,500 homes in accordance with the City's Housing Element, approved and certified in 2022 to satisfy the state-mandated Regional Housing Needs Allocation," said the City. "Phase one of this private project will bring 438 market-rate, for-sale homes to Eastvale and

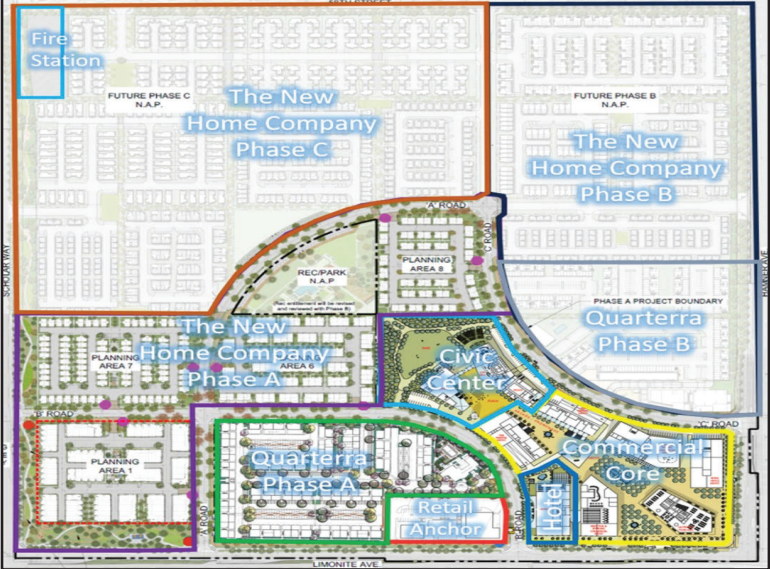

**Jurupa Valley** - In the last month, there were several incidents in the neighboring city of Jurupa Valley. This information is courtesy of the Riverside County Sheriff's Department. Incident: Deputy-Involved Shooting Date: June 8 Location: Jurupa Valley Details: On Saturday, June 8, 2024, at 11:12 a.m., deputies from the Jurupa Valley Sheriff's Station were dispatched to 53rd Street and Cedar Street, Jurupa Valley, to check the welfare of a male subject who appeared to be bleeding and disoriented. Upon arrival, deputies contacted the male and began to provide medical aid. While the deputy was tending to the male's medical needs, he produced a knife and began to stab himself. The male charged toward the deputy

with the knife, and a deputy-involved shooting occurred. The suspect was struck by gunfire, and deputies rendered medical aid until paramedics arrived. The suspect was transported to a local hospital in critical condition. The investigation is ongoing, and no additional details will be released at this time. No additional injuries were reported as a result of this incident. The suspect's identity will not be released at this time. The deputy involved will be placed on paid administrative leave according to department policy. The name of the involved deputy will not be released. Investigators from the Riverside County District Attorney's Office assigned to the Riverside Sheriff's Force Investigations Detail will lead this investigation. This is an active and ongoing investigation. Anyone with information

Incident: Fatal Hit & Run Traffic Collision  
Date: May 30  
Location: Jurupa Valley  
Details: On Thursday, May 30, 2024, about 3:40 a.m.,

deputies assigned to the Jurupa Valley Sheriff's Station responded to the area of Limonite Avenue and Pacific Avenue, Jurupa Valley, regarding a major-injury traffic collision involving a motorcycle and a vehicle. When deputies arrived they located the motorcycle rider lying in the roadway with significant injuries. Deputies rendered medical aid to the motorcycle rider until the arrival of CAL Fire. The motorcycle rider was subsequently transported to a local hospital where

he ultimately succumbed to the injuries sustained during the collision.

The Jurupa Valley Sheriff's Station Traffic Collision Reconstruction Team responded to the scene and assumed the investigation. The cause of the collision is still under investigation and it is unknown if alcohol and/or drugs were a factor in the collision. The identity of the motorcycle rider will not be released at this time, pending notification to the next of kin.

Evidence and witnesses at the scene indicated another vehicle was involved in the collision and the vehicle fled the scene. The ensuing investigation led to the identification of the other vehicle and it was later located at a residence in Jurupa Valley. The driver of the vehicle at the time of the collision was identified and the vehicle was impounded. The investigation into the collision continues and no further information will be released at this time.

The collision investigation required the temporary closure of Limonite Avenue, between Pacific Avenue and Riverview Drive in order to process the scene and collect evidence.

is expected to be completed in 2025.” The City has a news release on their website that gives more information about this Housing Element.

Many residents have expressed how unhappy they are about homes being built in Eastvale. Many are concerned about traffic, parking, crowdedness, and especially the lack of schools since it’s believed our current schools are already crowded. The City responded to concerns on their Facebook page stating that the “Corona-Norco Unified School District (CNUSD) has the responsibility of building and maintaining schools within the district. Requests for building or expanding schools should be directed to the district.” Residents are encouraged to contact CNUSD for information on additional schools in Eastvale.

The news release also announced that the City is currently “acquiring land from the TNHc to serve as the site of our new civic center.” This project will include a new city hall, police station, library and innovation center, civic park, and plaza. This city project is expected to be completed in 2027/2028.

“The third project within the Leal Property is anticipated to bring a “lifestyle” center that will be the centerpiece of Downtown Eastvale,” stated the news release. “The City is working to attract a well-qualified commercial developer to construct restaurants, shops, office space, and a hotel in a high-quality walkable environment.” This project is expected to begin construction along with the new civic center.

# Bicycle and Pedestrian Safety Operation

## Staff Reports

**Norco** – The Jurupa Valley Station at the Riverside County Sheriff's Office, conducted a traffic safety operation on May 30th. Deputies focused on the most dangerous driver behaviors that put the safety of people biking or walking at risk, according to the Riverside County Sheriff's Department. "These violations include speeding, making illegal turns, failing to yield or provide right of way to bicyclists or pedestrians, or failing to stop for signs and signals." They issued a news release with the information below.

"We all have places to be and not everyone gets there by car," Deputy Timothy Corlew said. "Bicyclists and pedestrians have the same rights to the road but face even more risk without the protections vehicles have. We should all be looking out for one another."

The Riverside County Sheriff's Office, Jurupa Valley Station offers steps drivers and pedestrians can take to greatly reduce the risk of getting injured or in a crash:

**Pedestrians**

- Be predictable. Use crosswalks, when available.

- Take notice of approaching vehicles and practice due care.
- Do not walk or run into the path of a vehicle. At 30 mph, a driver needs at least 90 feet to stop.
- Be visible. Make it easy for drivers to see you – wear light colors, reflective material and carry a flashlight, particularly at dawn, dusk or at night.
- Be extra careful crossing streets or entering crosswalks at night when it is harder to see, or when crossing busier streets with more lanes and higher speed limits.

**Drivers**

- Do not speed, and slow down

- at intersections. Be prepared to stop for pedestrians at marked and unmarked crosswalks, and between intersections where pedestrians may cross.
- Avoid blocking crosswalks while waiting to make a right-hand turn.
- Never drive impaired.

**Bicyclists**

- Obey traffic laws, use hand signals, use lights at night (front white light and rear red reflector), and wear a helmet.
- Bicyclists must travel in the same direction of traffic and have the same requirements as any slow-moving vehicle.

- Avoid the door zone: do not ride too closely to parked cars.
- If there's a bike lane, use it, unless making a left turn, passing, or approaching a place where a right turn is allowed.
- Yield to pedestrians. Bicyclists must yield the right-of-way to pedestrians within marked crosswalks or within unmarked crosswalks at intersections, and between intersections where pedestrians may cross.

Funding for this program is provided by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety, through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration.

# The Strength of Comfort

*“But the Comforter, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in My name, He will teach you all things...” John 14:26*

“Comforter” describes the Holy Spirit of God, which means in the original New Testament language “to come to the side of another.” There is something cool about the word “comfort.” We get the word comfort from two Latin words meaning “con” (in

company with) and “fortis” (to strengthen).

I remember when we had just signed my son Noah up for his first organized baseball team. Along with that came my responsibility to provide as much encouragement for Noah in his development as a player and person. I recall that when we were practicing batting, he got a little discouraged and just sat down. I went and sat alongside him and gave him a few words of encouragement.

He then sprang to his feet, and to both of our joy, he hit the ball squarely all the way to the outfield grass. He ran about the baseball diamond with his fists thrust in the air. You would think he hit a game winner. It was so fun to watch. Now, it would have done him no good for me to take the bat out of his hand and hit the ball for him.

We usually think of “comfort” as soothing someone, consoling someone; and to some extent, this is true. But

true comfort strengthens us to face life bravely and keep on going. It does not rob us of responsibility or make it easy for us to give up. God comes along side of us not to remove the difficulty or hardship, but to strengthen us along the way (Isaiah 41:10, Philippians 4:13).

Suddenly she felt a tug on her fishing line. She caught a fish! But she was so excited

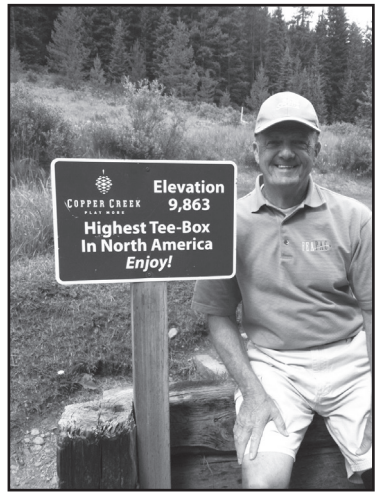

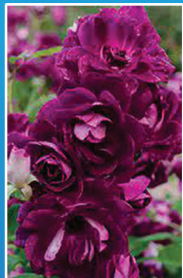
