Dangerous Driving in the Area

STAFF REPORTS

Eastvale - Speeding has been on ongoing issue in our area which has resulted in several fatal traffic collisions. Drivers, passengers, and pedestrians have been harmed or killed due to traffic collisions in the surrounding area. The Riverside County Sheriff's Department reported four fatal traffic collisions in October alone, all in Jurupa Valley and Eastvale.

October is National Pedes-

al Teen Driver Safety Week is October 20-26, so the Sheriff's Department has shared several news releases regarding vehicle and pedestrian safety.

"According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, 7,522 pedestrians were killed in traffic crashes across the United States in 2022," stated a Riverside County Sheriff's Department news release. "In California alone, 1,158 pedestrians were struck and killed on California

trian Safety Month and Nation- roads in 2022, accounting for 26 percent of all traffic-related fatalities in the state. The high number of pedestrians injured and killed on our roads highlights the urgent need for increased awareness and safety measures for people walking."

> "Every step we take towards greater pedestrian safety is a step towards saving lives," Sergeant Andrew Sullivan said. "We want to remind everyone that safety begins with you, whether you're behind the wheel or on foot. Small

actions, like slowing down, putting away distractions and yielding at crosswalks, can make a life-saving difference."

This month, deputies assigned to the Jurupa Valley Sheriff's Station will be focused on the most dangerous driving behaviors which put the safety of pedestrians at risk. These violations include speeding, making illegal turns, failing to yield and running stops signs and signals.

Incident: Fatal Traffic Col-

Date: October 11, 2024 Location: Jurupa Valley Details: On Friday, October 11, 2024, at 10:26 p.m., deputies responded to Van Buren Boulevard south of Jurupa Road, Jurupa Valley, regarding a report of a two-vehicle, major-injury traffic collision. Deputies arrived and located the driver and sole occupant of one of the involved vehicles deceased. The driver and passenger of the other involved vehicle were transported to an area hospital in stable condition with non-life-threatening injuries.

The Jurupa Valley Sheriff's

Station Traffic Team responded to the scene and assumed the investigation. The cause of the collision is still under investigation, and it appears that alcohol and/or drugs were a factor in the collision. The identity of the driver will not be released at this time, pending notification to the next of kin.

The collision investigation required the temporary closure of Van Buren Boulevard between Jurupa Road and 56th Street to process the scene and collect evidence.

Anyone who witnessed the traffic collision or has any information about this incident is encouraged to call Deputy Chavez of the Jurupa Valley Sheriff's Station at (951) 955-2600 or the Riverside County Sheriff's Office Dispatch at (951) 776–1099.

On Thursday, October 10, 2024, the Riverside Sheriff's Central Homicide Unit had responded to the 6300 block of Baldwin Avenue. The Central Homicide Unit assumed the investigation after determining the incident was a murder. The victim has been identified as Joshua David Clark, a 46-year-old transient from the city of Jurupa Valley.

This investigation is continuing and anyone with additional information is encouraged to contact Investigator D. Brown with the Central Homicide Unit at (951) 955-1777 or Investigator J. Cervantes with the Jurupa Valley Station at (951) 955-2600.

On Thursday, October 10, 2024, at 6:27 a.m., deputies from the Jurupa Valley Sheriff's Station responded to the 6300 block of Baldwin Avenue after receiving a report of an

assault with a deadly weapon. Deputies arrived in the area and located a male adult on the ground suffering from significant injuries. Medical first responders arrived and treated the victim; however, the victim succumbed to his injuries at the scene.

The Riverside Sheriff's Central Homicide Unit responded and assumed the investigation. The victim's identity is being withheld pending notification of the next of kin. October 2, 2024, about 7:00 p.m., deputies assigned to the Jurupa Valley Sheriff's Station responded to the area of Limonite Avenue and Harrison Avenue, Eastvale, regarding a major-injury traffic collision involving two vehicles. When deputies arrived, they located the passenger of one of the vehicles with significant injuries. Deputies rendered medical aid to the passenger until paramedics arrived. The passenger ultimately succumbed to their injuries at the scene.

The Jurupa Valley Sheriff's Station Traffic Collision Reconstruction Team responded and assumed the investigation. The cause of the collision is still under investigation, and it appears that alcohol and/or drugs were not a factor in the collision. The identity of the passenger will not be released at this time, pending next of kin notification.

The collision investigation required the temporary closure of Limonite Avenue between Sumner Avenue and Cedar Creek Road, along with Harrison Avenue between Golden Bit and Great falls, to process the scene and collect evidence.






The goal of Josiah Venture is to equip young leaders in Central and Eastern Europe to share the good news about Jesus. JV uses a variety of ways to accomplish this goal with camps and events which are attractive to young people. They offer English camps in the summer and hold special gatherings during the school year to attract and teach teens and young adults how the Bible relates to their life today.

Ten years ago, a man named Terry English got the idea to invite teens and their parents to participate in a music program called Fusion. Music seemed to connect not only with teens but with their parents too.

Europeans love music. They love to attend concerts, and they love to participate in large choirs. Europe is known for its famous concert halls and musical heritage. Parents loved to hear their teens perform in concerts in their local communities. And the parents were interested in singing too.

Terry gathered a small group of adults to prepare a concert of gospel music for the Christmas season. Many of them had little or no church background. But they loved the energy of gospel music and were glad to have an opportunity to perform for their friends. The event was a

big success, and they decided to do it again the following year.

Over the next decade the number of participants and attendees grew significantly. This year there were close to 200 people in the choir and band and over 2,000 people filled the largest concert hall in their city to hear the performances. This musical event has become so significant that it is now featured on the Czech national television and is listed as a recommended cultural event by both their city and region.

During rehearsals the director often explained the meaning of words in the Christmas songs. Many participants know very little about the Bible and

the lessons woven into the music. Fusion has provided an excellent way to help adults in these former communist countries understand what Christmas is about.

Dave Patty is the president of Josiah Venture. He wrote, "Music speaks to the mind, but it reaches the soul". Let me encourage you to listen more closely to the Christmas carols you hear on the radio and sing at church. Invite a friend to a Christmas concert at your church or in your community. Let the music speak to your soul. You will be glad you did.



Dangerous driving in the area

In addition to National Pedestrian Safety Month, National Teen Driver Safety Week is October 20-26.

"Car crashes are a leading cause of death for teens (15-18 years old) in the United States," stated a Sheriff's Department news release. "According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, there were 2,514 people killed in crashes involving a teen driver in 2022. In California, young drivers were involved in nearly 12% of all fatal crashes in 2022 despite accounting for only 5% of all licensed drivers in the U.S."

The Riverside County Sheriff's Office encourages parents and caregivers to talk with their teens about the dangers of risky driving behaviors like speeding, texting while driving, or not wearing a seatbelt, the importance of following the rules of the road, and the serious dangers of driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs.

"Parents and caregivers play a huge part in keeping teens safe on the road," Community Service Officer Sean Pearson said. "Having these meaningful conversations, setting rules, and being a role model for safe driving can help teens make better choices when they're driving."

Here are safe driving and walking tips for both you and your teen:

Drivers:

- Pay attention to the speed limits in the area and do not speed
 - Wear a seatbelt at all times
- Slow down at intersections. Be prepared to stop for pedestrians at marked and unmarked crosswalks.
- Avoid blocking crosswalks while waiting to make a righthand turn.
- Never drive impaired, under the influence of alcohol, drugs, or prescription drugs
- Stay off your phone while driving and avoid any distractions
- Look both ways before driving through an intersection

Pedestrians:

- Be predictable. Use signalized crosswalks where drivers may anticipate foot traffic.
- Watch for approaching vehicles and practice due care crossing the street. At 30 mph, a driver needs at least 90 feet to stop.
- Make it easier for drivers to see you at night – consider wearing bright colors, reflective material, or use a flashlight when practical.
- Be careful crossing streets or entering crosswalks at night or on busier streets with higher speed limits.

Here are a few tips for parents provided by the Riverside County Sheriff's Office, Jurupa Valley Station:

Provisional Driver's Li-

cense: Learn about California's provisional licensing law, which places restrictions on passengers and driving at night during the first year they have a license.

- Lead by example: Have driving sessions with your teen. Tell, but also show, your teen how to drive safely.
- Set ground rules: Be firm on rules such as no phone

use, eliminating distractions by friends, always following the speed limit, and always buckling up. Create a parent-teen driving contract to outline specific driving guidelines.

 Sober driving: Emphasize the importance of never driving impaired or riding with someone who has been driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs.
